Third Quarter, 2005

POPULATION ESTIMATES

The Alberta population growth continues to be the highest among the provinces. As of October 1, 2005, Alberta's population is estimated to be 3,281,296. This represents a yearly increase of approximately 65,400 persons (or 2% growth) since October 1, 2004. British Columbia and Ontario had the next largest growth rates among the provinces at 1.32 and 1.09% respectively.

The following table provides the October 1 population estimates and growth rates for Canada and Alberta since 2001.

MIGRATION

During the third quarter of 2005 (July 1 to September 30), Alberta had the largest interprovincial migration gain in the country. According to Statistics Canada, the Province of Alberta received 7,200 more interprovincial in-migrants in the third quarter as compared to the second. The substantial increase in the number of in-migrants from other provinces and territories was the main reason that Alberta had the high interprovincial migration gain of 13,100 people in the third quarter (Please see note at the end of Table 3 on the next page.)

As shown in Table 3: Origin and Destination of Interprovincial Migrants, the primary source of Alberta's interprovincial in-migrants for the third quarter was British Columbia, followed by Ontario and Saskatchewan. These three provinces were also the three main destinations of out-migrants from Alberta.

NATURAL INCREASE

Alberta gained 6,100 people in natural increase (births minus deaths) in the third quarter. The province had 10,900 births versus 4,800 deaths between July 1 and September 30, 2005.
