Preamble

Whereas it appears by message from Her Excellency the Right Honourable Adrienne Clarkson, Governor General of Canada, and the Estimates accompanying that message, that the sums mentioned below are required to defray certain expenses of the public service of Canada, not otherwise provided for, for the financial year ending March 31, 2006, and for other purposes connected with the public service of Canada;

May it therefore please Your Majesty, that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, that:

1. This Act may be cited as the *Appropriation Act No. 1, 2005-2006.*
