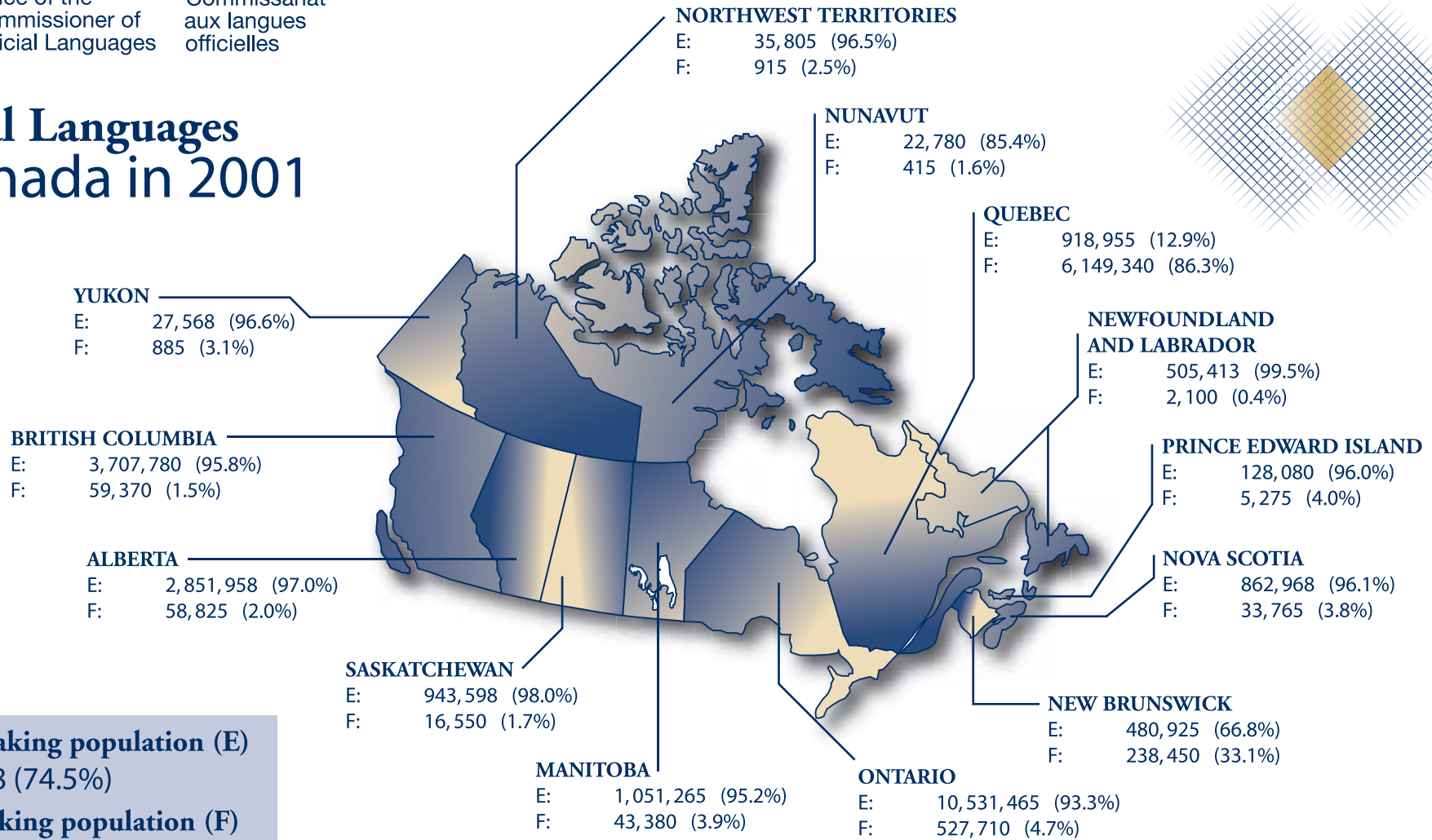
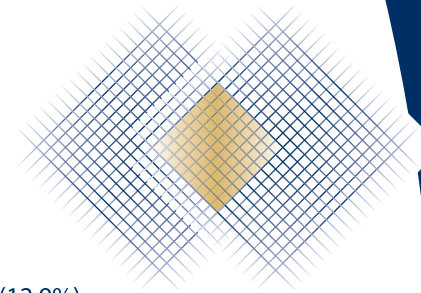

NB:

The English-speaking (E) and French-speaking (F) populations were calculated according to the first official language spoken as defined by the Official Languages Regulations. (2001 Census data – 20% sample)

The data (for the first official language spoken) include multiple responses that have been divided equally among English and French.

The figures for English-speaking (E) and French-speaking (F) inhabitants per province may not add up to 100% since the data omit people who have no knowledge of either official language.
