Your employer or payer uses the personal tax credit amounts you claim on your TD1YT form to calculate how much territorial tax to deduct from each payment.

— Addition or reduction to tax deductions
If you wish to have more tax deducted , complete the section called "Additional tax to be deducted" on the federal TD1 form. You can ask to have less tax deducted if on your income tax return you are eligible for deductions or non-refundable tax credits that are not listed on this form. To make this request, complete Form T1213, <i>Request To Reduce Tax Deductions At Source</i> , to get a letter of authority from your tax services office. Give the letter of authority to your employer or payer. You do not need a letter of authority if your employer deducts RRSP contributions from your salary. Income from other employers or payers
If you have more than one employer or payer at the same time and you have already claimed personal tax credit amounts on another Form TD1YT for 2006, you can choose not to claim them again. By doing this, you may not have to pay as much tax when you file your income tax return.
