# The Future: It's always harder than you think its going to be!

### **Measurement Canada's mission:**

◆ To ensure equity and accuracy where goods and services are bought and sold on the basis of measurement, in order to contribute to a fair and competitive marketplace for Canadians

### ...in all 39 sectors of trade such as:

- electricity
- fishing and fish products
- water utilities
- quarries and sand pits
- mining and metals
- fruit and vegetable industry
- taxicab industry
- retail gasoline sector

... to name but a few

# AND to live within our resources...

- **♦** By periodically assessing measurement in all trade sectors, intervening only where necessary to ensure accuracy and equity in the marketplace.
- **♦** Stakeholder's informed views are a key element in these decisions.

# Our level of intervention is ...

- the particular package of metrological control programs, policies and services that we provide in a sector or sub-sector
- minimal or non existent in many of these sectors now e.g., fishing industry, water utilities, taxicab industry
- more extensive in others e.g., electricity, retail gasoline, natural gas, retail food

# So what we are asking you during the ETSR consultation is ...

- ♦ What changes (if any) in our existing level of intervention are appropriate in your sector and why?
- **♦** How can we work together to make even better use of alternate service delivery for conducting meter and metering installation inspections? e.g., incentives
- **♦** What marketplace performance information, reporting and monitoring mechanisms are needed to maintain everyone's confidence?
- **♦** When should we conduct this formal review again?

# Our decision making criteria on proposed changes (non negotiables):

- Vulnerable parties must support all recommendations for change
- General agreement/support from all stakeholders
- All affected parties represented
- **♦** Aligned with MC Mission and Strategic Direction
- Implementable and sustainable by all parties
- Competitive domestically and internationally
- Roles and responsibilities clear
- Suits present and foreseeable future
- Flexibility to revisit if needed

- **♦** Invite your on-line input, submissions or questions starting December
- ◆ Tentative face to face consultations Toronto week of January 15, Vancouver week of January 22; other cities to follow subsequently
- Electricity Stakeholders Advisory Group to maintain communications throughout
