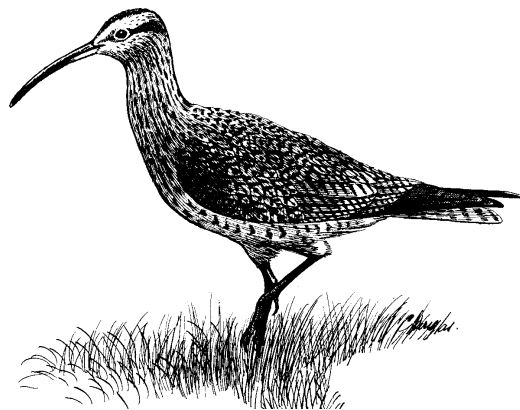


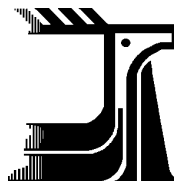

COSEWIC MANDATE

The Committee on the Status of Endangered Wildlife in Canada (COSEWIC) determines the national status of wild species, subspecies, varieties, and nationally significant populations that are considered to be at risk in Canada. Designations are made on all native species for the following taxonomic groups: Mammals, Birds, Amphibians, Reptiles, Fish, Molluscs, Lepidopterans, Vascular Plants, Lichens, and Mosses. A record of status re-examinations is also maintained.

COSEWIC MEMBERSHIP

COSEWIC is comprised of representatives from each provincial and territorial government wildlife agency, four federal agencies (Canadian Wildlife Service, Parks Canada Agency, Department of Fisheries and Oceans, and Federal Biosystematic Partnership), three national non-government organizations (Canadian Nature Federation, Canadian Wildlife Federation, and World Wildlife Fund Canada) and the chairs of the species and traditional aboriginal knowledge specialist groups. The Committee meets annually to consider status reports on candidate species.

COSEWIC LISTS

The first COSEWIC “Endangered Species List” was issued in 1978. In 1990, it was decided that all species considered by COSEWIC should be listed even if the species were “not at risk” or “data deficient”. Therefore, this document is divided into three separate lists under the title “Canadian Species at Risk”:

- List 1: Species designated in 5 “Risk” categories with geographical occurrence and date examined. (This is COSEWIC’s “official” list of Species at Risk.)
- List 2: Species examined and designated in the Not at Risk category, with geographical occurrence and date examined.
- List 3: Species examined and designated in the Data Deficient category because of insufficient scientific information, with geographical occurrence and date examined.

A record of status re-examinations and re-assessments resulting in status changes can be found at the back of the document.

DEFINITION OF TERMS AND RISK CATEGORIES

Species	Any indigenous species, subspecies, variety, or geographically defined population of wild fauna and flora.
Extinct (X)	A species that no longer exists.
Extirpated (XT)	A species no longer existing in the wild in Canada, but occurring elsewhere.
Endangered (E)	A species facing imminent extirpation or extinction.
Threatened (T)	A species likely to become endangered if limiting factors are not reversed.
Special Concern (SC)*	A species of special concern because of characteristics that make it particularly sensitive to human activities or natural events.
Not At Risk (NAR)**	A species that has been evaluated and found to be not at risk.
Data Deficient (DD)***	A species for which there is insufficient scientific information to support status designation.

* Formerly described as “Vulnerable” from 1990 to 1999, or “Rare” prior to 1990.

** Formerly described as “Not In Any Category”, or “No Designation Required”.

*** Formerly described as “Indeterminate” from 1994 to 1999 or “ISIBD” (insufficient scientific information on which to base a designation) prior to 1994.

TAILED FROG: assessed as two populations in 2000 and designated: South Mountain population - endangered; and Pacific Coast population - special concern.

TRUMPETER SWAN: designated special concern in 1978 and delisted in 1996.

TUBEROUS INDIAN-PLANTAIN: designated special concern in 1988 and reconfirmed in 1999.

TUNDRA PEREGRINE FALCON: designated threatened in 1978 and downlisted to special concern in 1992.

TYRRELL'S WILLOW: designated threatened in 1981 and delisted in 1999.

VANCOUVER ISLAND MARMOT: designated endangered in 1978 and reconfirmed in 1997.

VIRGINIA GOAT'S RUE: designated threatened in 1996; re-assessed and uplisted to endangered in 2000.

WATER-PENNYWORT: designated endangered in 1985 and downlisted to threatened in 1999.

WESTERN BLUE-FLAG: designated threatened in 1990 and reconfirmed in 2000.

WESTERN PRAIRIE FRINGED ORCHID: designated endangered in 1993 and reconfirmed in 2000.

WESTERN SILVER-LEAVED ASTER: designated special concern in 1988; re-examined and uplisted to threatened in 2000.

RECORD OF STATUS RE-EXAMINATIONS (continued)

WOLVERINE: considered as one population in 1982 and designated special concern. Re-examined as two populations in 1989: Eastern (Quebec and Labrador) population - endangered; and Western population - special concern.

WOOD BISON: designated endangered in 1978; downlisted to threatened in 1988; re-assessed and reconfirmed in 2000.

WOODLAND CARIBOU: considered as five populations in 1984 and re-examined as six populations in 2000. Designated: Queen Charlotte Islands population - extinct; Atlantic-Gaspésie population - endangered; Boreal population - threatened; Southern Mountain population - threatened; Northern Mountain population - not at risk; and Newfoundland population - not at risk.

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The Committee on the Status of Endangered Wildlife in Canada (COSEWIC) was created in 1977 as a result of a recommendation at the Federal-Provincial Wildlife Conference held in 1976. It arose from the need for a single, official, scientifically sound, national listing of wildlife species at risk. In 1978, COSEWIC designated its first species and produced its first list of Canadian species at risk. Species designated at annual meetings are added to the list.
