 The most striking evidence of climate change – the human face and the fragile ecosystem. As a northern nation, Canada is sponsoring **Arctic Day** to show impacts, adaptation and to celebrate traditional northern cultures threatened by the rapid changes in the northern climate.

Arctic Day – Perspectives from the Pole of Change includes information on what traditional knowledge shows us about climate change, northern rivers and hydrology, as well as the security of health and food.

Throughout the day, there are live performances and samples of traditional Arctic food as well as presentations of northern culture.
