Parliamentary democracy. Unicameral with a 60-seat Grand and General Council (Consiglio Grande e Generale). There is no Head of Government. All Ministers have equal status although the Minister of Foreign and Political Affairs is generally considered 'first amoung equals'. Governing coalition: Christian Democratic Party (PDCS) & Socialist Party (PSS).

Captains-regent elected by the Grand and General Council for a six-month term. Members of the Council are elected for a five-year term by direct popular vote; next election, by June 2006.




