

The Ruisseau de la Brasserie (Brewery Creek) district, in this vision for the future, is noted for its pleasant pace, a place of water and green space set apart, a centre for arts and romance, for a candlelight dinner and a waterside walk. Theatre, galleries, an arts school, a rich student life, bookstores, antique shops and simple cafés are at the heart of this district. It attracts residents and visitors to its quiet rhythms. The Théâtre de l'Île, the Écomusée, the old industrial remains and new imaginative water features are attractions valued by visitors. Public art and exterior exhibits embellish the green spaces. This area is well connected to Gatineau's downtown and central waterfront, and to the Chaudières Islands making it easily accessible to all visitors to the Capital. A green corridor along the creek allows a pleasant pathway connection to Jacques-Cartier Park and Leamy Lake.
