All papers are published in a pre-conference set of proceedings. Papers may also be submitted for publication in a new research journal that will be launched by CTRF. Authors are requested to indicate if they are interested in also having their paper submitted to peer review for the journal.

CTRF will continue its tradition of awarding prizes for the best conference papers. For 2006, up to \$4,500 (Cdn) may be awarded in the following categories:

- Best overall paper \$1,500
- Runners-up (3 @ \$750) \$2,250
- Best paper that is directly relevant to the conference theme \$ 750

ABSTRACT FORMAT

Abstracts should be 150-200 words (1 page) in length, and information should be provided on name of author(s), title, organization, mailing address, phone and fax numbers, and e-mail address. Some abstracts may be placed on the CTRF website to promote the conference.

Abstracts must be submitted electronically (via internet or by mailed diskette) in a recognizable word processing format (Word or Wordperfect).
