

Jamie's home is 8.6 kilometres (more than five miles) from her school.

Not only that, but she has to climb the infamous McKinley Hill, a winding incline so steep that most cyclists dismount and push their bikes up.

Even when Jamie gets to Glenmore

Road, she has to walk downhill to the Glenmore Landfill, then up another hill before the road finally straightens and flattens.


"I'm excited because it will be fun," she said Tuesday as she and her father walked a short distance along Glenmore Road.
