• Message from the CEO •



When I assumed the role of President and CEO of the National Aboriginal Achievement Foundation, the 2004-2005 fiscal year had only a few months left to run. My task was to manage the transition inherent in the arrival of a new CEO and to bring about a sense of renewal of the Foundation. Unlike most annual reports, then, my report contemplates the future rather than the past.

From the beginning, I saw “achievement” as the operational word in the Foundation’s mandate. Behind all our struggles over the centuries and in recent decades as Aboriginal peoples, we have sought to protect our rights, defend our interests, and build a better world for our great-grandchildren and their great-grandchildren so they too could achieve their full potential.

“Achievement” has to do with successfully releasing potential. While the Foundation recognizes achievement and celebrates it, we also lament that so many talented people are unable to realize their own dreams and to contribute to the future of their own nations and to Canada because they have been sidelined, and been denied resources. Space has to be created for them in Canada, and I spent my first months, to the end of the fiscal year, in positioning the Foundation to bring together the governmental, private sector, and First Nations, Métis, and Inuit resources so our peoples can realize their potential.

I have recognized from the outset that money is only a part of the challenge. If all First Nations, Métis, and Inuit children are to achieve, there have to be changes in the homes they live in, the schools they go to, the way they are educated, the opportunities they have, acceptance for our diversity. I know that in the years ahead, meeting these challenges will be assisted tremendously by channelling the vast good will that exists for the success of the Foundation toward this broader change.

The ability of any Chief Executive Officer to accomplish an organization’s objectives and mission lies in the support of its Board of Directors. I was pleased to find a Board with a strong belief in the Foundation’s work and a willingness to support

change and movement in achieving our goals. I appreciate having the confidence of the Board in taking the Foundation through its next stage of growth.

Much of my professional life has been directed at improving accountability in governance, and I acknowledge my own accountability to the Board, to the Foundation’s constituency, and of course, to the First Nations, Métis, and Inuit youth who so desperately want to realize their potential. For the 2005-2006 fiscal year, I will be building a great team and a broad community of interests dedicated to a common cause.

National Aboriginal Achievement Foundation

The National Aboriginal Achievement Foundation (NAAF) is a nationally-registered non-profit organization devoted to excellence and to providing the tools necessary for First Nations, Métis, and Inuit youth to achieve brighter futures. NAAF encourages and empowers Aboriginal young people by providing important career planning information, by connecting youth with industry and by providing financial support for post-secondary studies in all disciplines. NAAF also celebrates success with the National Aboriginal Achievement Awards, showing all of Canada the accomplishments of Aboriginal peoples and demonstrating to youth that anything is possible for them to achieve.

Programs and Departments:

The Foundation is the largest supporter of First Nations, Métis, and Inuit education outside of the federal government of Canada. Thanks to our many corporate and government partners, the Foundation's **Education Program** disburses approximately \$2 million a year to First Nations, Métis and Inuit students across Canada. Foundation scholarships cover all disciplines in four funding categories (Fine Arts and Professional Development; Cultural Projects; Health Careers; and Post Secondary Education). The National Aboriginal Achievement Awards (NAAA) is Canada's largest and most influential annual showcase of Aboriginal achievement. Each year, the Achievement Awards celebrate the accomplishments of 14 recipients who are honoured in a dazzling gala that features Aboriginal entertainers. The awards show is later broadcast nationally. The Achievement Awards instills pride in the Aboriginal community, dispel stereotypes and provide role models for First Nations, Métis, and Inuit youth.

Taking Pulse joins with industry to present career options in specific growth sectors through a series of short documentaries and supporting curriculum materials with the aim of recruiting First Nations, Métis, and Inuit youth and assisting them to obtain rewarding and productive careers. The first Taking Pulse program to be developed is **Industry in the Classroom**, an interactive and informative classroom session that connects Aboriginal youth with information about career opportunities in growth industries. The pilot program, which explored careers in the Railway industry, was launched across Canada in the spring of 2004. This year we are moving forward with an Industry in the Classroom module on Health, following by modules on Energy, Justice and Transportation in 2005.

Blueprint for the Future (BFF) is a series of one-day career fairs that give Aboriginal high school students valuable resources and information on career opportunities, while promoting education as being significant to labour market participation. At BFF, Aboriginal high school students learn about a range of job options in a venue where they can meet and speak with some of Canada's top corporate and Aboriginal business leaders.

Corporate Development department

Corporate Development is the fundraising arm of the National Aboriginal Achievement Foundation. They seek out sponsorships in both the public and corporate sector, and maintain relationships with existing sponsors by keeping them informed of the Foundation's activities and events. In turn, they make sure that NAAF is itself represented at events held by sponsors, creating mutually beneficial relationships between the Foundation and its many supporters.

Communications department

The Communications department assists the Foundation to communicate with the public, donors, and First Nations, Métis, and Inuit peoples by creating and issuing press releases, advertising, and producing visual, audio, electronic, and print materials. Communications acts as the liaison between the Foundation and all sponsors, performers, Aboriginal organizations, and government groups attending the Awards.

Finance

The Finance & Operations department provides all financial and operational support to the Foundation by administering payables, receivables, tax receipts, payroll, internal and external reporting, and other financial analysis and support as required. All general information technology support including all hardware and supply purchases are administered through the Finance & Operations department. The Finance & Operations department also operates as the liaison between all financial, operational, external and internal stakeholders.

Endowments and Trust Funds:

In February of 2005, the government pledged a \$10 million grant. This contribution joins the established Trusts the Foundation is proud to manage, such as the Aboriginal Veterans Scholarship Trust, which honours the often overlooked contributions made by Aboriginal veterans in defense of Canada. Other Trust Funds which the Foundation administers include; the Diana Fowler LeBlanc Aboriginal Social Work Scholarship Fund, the Desser Music Scholarship Fund, Great-West Business and Health Education Scholarship Trust Fund, Royal Bank Award in Memory of Beth Hamilton Bell Trust Fund, Ontario Aboriginal Partnerships Recognition Scholarship Fund, TransCanada PipeLines Scholarship Trust Fund, Government of Canada Trust Fund and the Education Trust Fund. NAAF continues to build its combined educational trust so that scholarships will be available in perpetuity.



2005 National Aboriginal Achievement Awards

The National Aboriginal Achievement Awards (NAAA) held their 12th annual celebration of excellence on March 31, 2005. Broadcast nationally on CBC and APTN, the awards are watched by new audiences and are intended to further the goals of the National Aboriginal Achievement Foundation by showcasing the accomplishments of First Nations, Métis, and Inuit men and women to all of Canada and by providing youth with strong role models.

This year's awards were held in Saskatoon at the city's Centennial Arena, and were infused with the culture of the First Nations people of Saskatchewan. The magnificent set design conceived by the show's producer Roman Bittman was based on the Thunderbird, a protector of the peoples of the Great Plains who watches over Turtle Island. Bittman consulted with Elders and other spiritual leaders to help reflect the powerful and ancient traditions of Saskatchewan's Indigenous people, and in the end it paid off with a remarkable visual triumph. He intends to incorporate local indigenous tradition into all the awards shows in the future, making the Achievement Awards an occasion not just a celebration of First Nations, Métis, and Inuit but of the host region as well.

In addition to celebrating the accomplishments of Aboriginal people, the Achievement Awards also feature performances by some of the finest Native entertainers in Canada. This year saw performances by co-host Andrea Menard, with a stark and powerful rendition of her song "Half Breed Blues," Kinnie Starr, whose unique blending of hip-hop with other genres reflects her own mixed Métis heritage, and rock groups Eagle & Hawk and Burnt Project-1, both of whom inject their modern rock music with sonic elements of indigenous culture. Two dance groups also performed; the Great Plains Dance Troop put on an excellent show of traditional dancing, while Santee Smith's group wowed the audience with their modern and acrobatic dance. Seeing such diverse performers express their culture and heritage in different ways reminds us of both the fluidity and strength of indigenous traditions that have allowed them to thrive and continue to evolve for thousands of years.





There are 14 awards presented each year, including one for Lifetime Achievement and one for a promising young person between the ages of 15 and 24. This year's recipient of the Lifetime Achievement award presented by the Foundation's Roberta Jamieson was Bertha Allen from the Northwest Territories, an activist for Aboriginal and northern women's rights for over thirty years. The Youth recipient, who receives a \$10,000 scholarship in addition to the award, was Fauna Kingdon, a young Métis woman from Nunavut who has many accomplishments as a volunteer and Dean's List student would be more befitting of someone twice her age.

The other 12 winners come from diverse fields and represent First Nations, Métis, and Inuit people from across the land. Academics and educators such as Dr. Eber Hampton, president of First Nations University in Regina, and Dr. Emma LaRocque, author and Native Studies professor, were honoured together with renowned Mohawk sculptor and carver Joe Jacobs, four-time Olympian cross-country skier turned motivational speaker Sharon Firth, and visual artist and curator Dr.

Gerald McMaster. Douglas Golosky, entrepreneur and First Nations job provider was also awarded, as was Inuit social worker Lolly Annahatak, Mi'kmaq spiritual leader John Joe Sark, and environmentalist Andy Carpenter Sr. First Nations health-care provider and educator Dr. Thomas Dignan was recognized for his selfless work and dedication, as was broadcaster and producer Brenda Chambers, and, finally, the Yukon's Judy Gingell, who can list the founding of the Yukon Indian Brotherhood as but one of her many impressive accomplishments, was honoured for her community development work.

All of the awards recipients serve as an inspiration to indigenous youth across the country, and show them that it is possible to achieve their dreams while maintaining a strong tie to their culture and communities. Now more than ever, these role models are needed to motivate young people and present the incredible and ongoing achievements of First Nations, Métis, and Inuit people to the world.



About the Awards

The establishment of the National Aboriginal Achievement Awards exemplifies the efforts of the National Aboriginal Achievement Foundation to encourage and celebrate excellence in the First Nations, Métis, and Inuit communities. NAAF established the awards in 1993, in conjunction with the United Nation's International Decade of the World's Indigenous peoples. The awards recognize the career achievements and contributions to their field or community by Aboriginal professionals in diverse occupations. Now entering their twelfth year, these awards have become a Canadian institution.

The NAAA were established to build self-esteem and pride for the Aboriginal community and to provide outstanding role models for First Nations, Métis, and Inuit youth. The awards broadcast the success of individuals who have the discipline, drive and determination to set high standards and accomplish their goals.

Supported by public and private sectors, this Aboriginal initiative represents the highest honour the community can bestow upon its own achievers. Individuals of First Nations, Inuit, and Métis ancestry who have reached a significant level of achievement in their respective occupations are eligible for nomination.

A national jury comprised of accomplished Aboriginal people selects 12 career achievement award winners, one youth and one lifetime achievement award recipient.

Eligibility Criteria

Any person may nominate individuals:

- Of First Nations, Inuit or Métis heritage;
- Who demonstrate outstanding career achievement;
- Of any age (youth achiever nominees must be 15-24 years of age);
- Permanent Canadian Resident or Canadian born.

Please note nominations of deceased persons will not be accepted. Jurors are not eligible for nomination, nor may they submit nominations or support letters.

Only completed applications with two support letters and a résumé or biographical equivalent will be accepted. All eligible nominations stand for three years.





Blueprint for the Future A Solid Investment in the Future

Blueprint for the Future (BFF), is a series of national career fairs designed to attract First Nation, Metis and Inuit high school students to the wide array of potential careers available in all employment sectors.

ONE-DAY EVENT:

Two career fairs are offered annually in different Canadian cities for students in Grades 9-12. Each career fair can accommodate up to 1,800 students. The day is comprised of three parts:

- I. **Role Models, Key Note and Motivational Speakers** - there are keynote speakers at the opening ceremony, lunch, and closing program. Motivational speakers tell students how they realized their own dreams, and are excellent role models for the youth in attendance.
- II. **Career Workshops** - career workshops ranging from business/finance to science and technology are facilitated throughout the day. There are approximately 100 workshops led by knowledgeable individuals in their respective fields. These speakers include dynamic individuals from diverse sectors of the economy; Aboriginal physicians speak to students about medicine as a career, applying for medical schools, the areas of specialization that exist, and where the medical trends will be when students graduate.
- III. **Trade Show** - there is a booth/trade show area featuring educational institutions, government agencies and departments, corporations and a multitude of other professions who each provide information and one-on-one guidance about careers in their areas of specialization. Students also meet senior executives from the financial world, engineers from the mining industry, trades people, psychiatrists and social workers, and leaders in new technology, all of whom show them the most up to date industry trends.

PROVEN TRACK RECORD:

More than 25,000 First Nations, Métis, and Inuit students from across the country have attended BFF career fairs over the event's nine year history. Students from Vancouver to Halifax have had the opportunity to meet experts in their fields, learn about individual career options, the education and training required, and the employment trends in these areas. These highly motivating and inspirational career fairs are geared to provide students with the incentives necessary to set their individual career paths. This important link is a first step toward their entry into the Canadian workforce.

BFF PAST AND PRESENT:

In 2004 – 2005 the Foundation held Blueprint for the Future in Saskatoon and Ottawa. The Saskatoon career fair saw a 25% increase in student attendance from the last fair held in that city in 2001. Each career fair hosted roughly 45 career seminars, with an average of 40 students attending per session. In addition, there were 78 exhibit booths in Saskatoon and 90 in Ottawa, where students met with representatives of various employers and found out more about their fields of interest.

As Aboriginal youth are the fastest growing segment of the Canadian population, it is imperative that we continue to introduce First Nation, Métis, and Inuit high school students to the world of career opportunities in Canada.

Taking Pulse Connecting Youth and Careers

Born from consultations with the 2001 lead corporate sponsor TransCanada Pipelines, Taking Pulse grew into broad-based consultations that connected educators, provincial and federal officials, private sector representatives, and Aboriginal people. The principle objective of this innovative and collective effort has been to determine how best to increase Aboriginal workforce participation in Canada while simultaneously addressing the 70% high school dropout rate of First Nations, Métis, and Inuit students.

PHASES OF PROGRESS:

- I. "Finding Solutions" – identified the issues and barriers being faced by First Nations, Métis, and Inuit youth in education and recommended new solutions.
- II. "Affecting Change" - conducted research and analysis and created two models for implementation consideration; Industry in the Classroom and Rivers to Success (formerly the Back to School-Aboriginal Youth Corps)
- III. "Pilot Evaluation and Implementation" – development of concepts, creation of curriculum models, piloting of models and full implementation of Industry in the Classroom and Rivers to Success.

PHASE III – IMPLEMENTATION:

Taking Pulse successfully developed and delivered the "Railway in the Classroom" pilot program to 72 schools across Canada, including the 23 school pilot and evaluation. National Role Models stemming from our NAAA are utilized as industry champions and some recipients of Achievement awards act as Role Models, acting as champions for a particular sector, become facilitators delivering curriculum resources in high school classrooms. Industry experts are also engaged and are teamed with the industry champion to co-facilitate all sessions.

INDUSTRY IN THE CLASSROOM:

Each industry module is based on a 2 - hour curriculum model including a curriculum manual for educators, promotional materials, links to post secondary institutes, scholarship information and a hip-hop video that is television ready and stars all Aboriginal talent - musicians and cast. "Railway in the Classroom" is marked as the first official module in year one of implementation. As a result of Railway's successful evaluation the Foundation has moved forward with the development of three more industry modules and will be delivering modules to high schools with a high population of First Nations, Métis, and Inuit students in the 2005 – 2006 school year. The outreach for the Railway in the Classroom module extended to 1299 Aboriginal high school students.

MODULES:

- i) Railway in the Classroom – curriculum and video features promotional materials, factual information and career profiles on conductors, locomotive engineers, rail traffic controllers and

signal & communications technicians.

- ii) Health Careers in the Classroom – curriculum and video features promotional materials, factual information and career profiles on five key professions as identified by the health industry; physicians, nurses, physiotherapists, midwives and dietitians. The health module is complete in both English and French languages.

- iii) The Circle of Justice – curriculum and video features promotional materials, factual information and career profiles on five key professions including justice of the peace, probation/parole officer, paralegal, court officer and corrections officer. The module is complete in both English and French languages.

- iv) Transportation in the Classroom – curriculum (only) features promotional materials, factual information and career profiles focussing on flight services specialist, merchant marine, pilot, bus driver and truck driver. The module is complete in both English and French languages. The video production is slated for development in fall 2005.

DELIVERY:

There are three mechanisms identified for delivery of modules to extend outreach to First Nation, Metis and Inuit youth in all regions of Canada, including remote and isolated communities; E-Learning, Television Broadcast and Classroom delivery. NAAF has signed a Memorandum of Understanding with Sunchild E-Learning First Nations community in January 2005 in Calgary, Alberta.

RIVERS TO SUCCESS:

The National Aboriginal Achievement Foundation has incorporated all of the research and recommendations provided by Phase I and Phase II forums and created a conceptual model. The Foundation has changed the original reference name, Aboriginal Youth Corps – Back to School program to Rivers to Success in response to concerns noted in the Phase II forum regarding residential school stigmas. This unique and collaborative multi-option program is created to inspire, motivate and facilitate the return to school of Aboriginal at-risk youth who have left school within a three year period prior to entering the program. Our primary target group is Aboriginal youth aged 15-19 but we recognize the needs of students under the age of 15 and those over aged 19 to 25. The key focus of Rivers to Success is full collaboration with existing services at the local, regional and national levels, reflective of the views and input of First Nations, Métis, Inuit, provincial and federal governments.

FUTURE DEVELOPMENT:

Two more industry modules are scheduled for development this year from the fields of mining, energy, broadcasting and/or banking/finance. Delivery of the four existing modules will be taking place this fall to 200 schools across Canada. Rivers to Success is projected for piloting in 2006. The region of choice is yet to be determined.

Education Program

Building Brighter Futures

The National Aboriginal Achievement Foundation has grown and evolved into the largest non-governmental funding body for First Nations, Métis, and Inuit post secondary students across Canada. Financial assistance is provided to over 600 students annually across a diverse range of disciplines. In the 2004-2005 fiscal year, \$1,907,237 was awarded to 672 Aboriginal recipients.

CATEGORIES:

Having disbursed over \$18 million since its inception, the Education Program of NAAF offers financial assistance through three major categories:

- 1. Fine Arts Awards** – performing arts, visual arts, media arts studies and cultural projects relating to Aboriginal arts, cultures and languages, particularly those aimed at youth.
- 2. Aboriginal Health Careers Scholarships & Awards** – health sciences, such as medicine, nursing, dentistry, biology, physiotherapy, pharmacy, laboratory research and any other health field in which a study of hard sciences is a prerequisite.
- 3. Post-Secondary Education Awards** – business, science, law, engineering, technical studies, computer science, education, social work, and the social sciences.

CRITERIA BASED ON NEED:

There are no set scholarship amounts. Each applicant is assessed independently and awarded bursary and scholarship funds based on established criteria including:

- Academic performance,
- Financial need,
- Connection to the Aboriginal community,
- Commitment to the field of study, and talent (in Fine Arts).

EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS:

- The Foundation will support education at any Canadian institution that offers relevant programming in the student's chosen area of study.
- Study outside of Canada is eligible for jury consideration when the student is enrolled in graduate studies towards Master's or Doctoral degrees.

JURY PROCESS:

At specified times throughout the year, applications in the three major categories are assessed by different national juries comprised of Aboriginal professionals in relevant disciplines. The application process includes the following steps.

- Applications are received by a specified date and reviewed by staff.
- Jury books are prepared and forwarded to Jury members.
- Jury members assess each application according to the established criteria.
- Jury members meet to determine scholarship/bursary recipients and the amount of the awards.
- Scholarship and bursary recipients are matched with funding sponsors.
- All applicants are notified of the results by mail.

Note 1 addresses the significant accounting policies including 1(b) and 1 (c) regarding revenue recognition and investments.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

National Aboriginal Achievement Foundation (the "Foundation") was incorporated without share capital under the Canada Corporations Act on March 13, 1985 and is a registered charity under the Income Tax Act.

The objectives of the Foundation are:

- (a) to seek out and develop talented Aboriginal people who would otherwise not have the opportunities to cultivate their talents and skills by directing their course of study and by affording them the necessary training and materials for this study;
- (b) to encourage young Aboriginal persons to discover their talents by creating awareness of incentives in the visual and performing arts, business and sciences;
- (c) to develop artistic, business and scientific talents through an organized comprehensive process of study; and
- (d) to provide Aboriginal youth with opportunities to demonstrate, perform and exhibit their works.

The Foundation is to carry on its operations without financial gain to its members, and any profits to the Foundation are to be used in promoting its objectives.

During the year, the Foundation undertook the following special cultural initiatives:

- (a) The 12th annual National Aboriginal Achievement Awards to honour achievements in diverse occupations within the greater community. Fourteen recipients received awards presented in a gala ceremony held at the Saskatoon Centennial Auditorium and Convention Centre on March 31, 2005.
- (b) "Blueprint For The Future," a series of culturally based career fairs held for Aboriginal youth. The first took place at the Saskatoon Centennial Auditorium and Convention Centre on November 2, 2004 and the second took place at the Ottawa Convention Centre on February 9, 2005.

- (c) "Taking Pulse" is a program designed to address and assist with the underemployment of Aboriginal people in the Canadian workforce, as well as to assist with decreasing the projected 70% dropout rates of Aboriginal high school students. Within the "Industry in the Classroom" initiative, consultations, research and two modules have been completed, which include curriculum, promotional materials and videos prepared for television broadcast.

1. Significant accounting policies:

(a) Fund accounting:

The Foundation follows the restricted fund method of accounting for contributions.

The Operating Fund reports unrestricted resources of the Foundation.

The Special Purpose Funds include the Educational Fund, Awards Fund (consisting of the Arts Program, the Business and Science Program and the Health Scholarships Program), National Aboriginal Achievement Awards Fund and Special Projects

Fund. All amounts reported are subject to restrictions that are internally imposed.

The Aboriginal Veterans Scholarship Trust Fund is an externally restricted fund established in November 1996. The Government of Canada ("Canada") granted \$1,150,000 to the Foundation to be held in a separate trust fund for the specific purpose of establishing the Aboriginal Veterans Scholarship Trust ("AVST") Fund. Aboriginal Veterans Scholarships are to be awarded from the AVST Fund in accordance with the Foundation's policies for scholarship trust funds, as determined by its Board of Directors from time to time.

In the event that the Foundation decides to no longer manage the AVST Fund or decides to terminate its total operations, the Foundation is to ensure protection of the AVST Fund by selecting another Aboriginal organization which is acceptable to Canada to manage the AVST Fund. In the event that no Aboriginal organization is found which is suitable for this purpose by the Foundation and Canada, the Foundation agrees to return the amount of the grant, together with any unspent revenue earned by the investment of the grant.

The Diana Fowler LeBlanc Aboriginal Social Work Scholarship Fund is an externally restricted fund established in 1998 through the efforts of Her Excellency, Mrs. Diana Fowler LeBlanc. The fund will enable Aboriginal students to pursue an undergraduate degree in social work at recognized universities and colleges across Canada.

The Desser Music Scholarship Fund is an externally restricted fund established in 2000. The fund will enable Aboriginal students to pursue an undergraduate degree preferably in musical studies at recognized universities and colleges across Canada.

The Great-West Business and Health Education Scholarship Trust Fund is an externally restricted fund established in 1998 to provide business scholarships.

The Royal Bank Award in Memory of Beth Hamilton Bell Trust Fund is an externally restricted fund established in 1998 with an initial contribution of \$126,500. Following two years of growth, the interest income of the fund is to be used to award scholarships to students meeting certain criteria.

The Ontario Aboriginal Partnerships Recognition Scholarship Fund is an externally restricted fund established in 2000. The Ontario Native Affairs Secretariat granted \$100,000 to the Foundation to be kept in a separate trust fund. The interest income of the fund is to be used to award scholarships to Aboriginal students pursuing studies at Ontario post-secondary institutions in business, science and/or technology.

The TransCanada PipeLines Scholarship Trust Fund is an externally restricted fund established on April 1, 2001 to provide scholarships to Aboriginal students entering Engineering, Business/Commerce, Law, Sciences, Environmental Studies, Technology and Communications.

The Government of Canada Trust Fund was created to provide perpetual annual financial support to the Foundation's Education Program by supplementing scholarship disbursements. This fund has specific investment guidelines and was received and invested by the Foundation in December 2003. The first scholarships resulting from revenue generated by the endowment will be disbursed in fiscal 2005/2006.

(b) Revenue recognition:

Restricted contributions are recognized as revenue of the appropriate restricted fund.

Unrestricted contributions are recognized as revenue of the Operating Fund in the year received or receivable if the amount to be received can be reasonably estimated and collection is reasonably assured.

Contributions for endowment are recognized as revenue in the applicable restricted fund. Investment income earned on restricted resources is recognized as revenue of the applicable restricted fund.

Other investment income is recognized as revenue of the Operating Fund.

(c) Investments:

Investments are recorded at cost. If the market value of investments becomes lower than cost and this decline in value is considered to be other than temporary, the investments are written down to market value. Investment income from fixed income securities is accrued as earned. Investment income from equities and mutual funds is recognized when realized.

(d) Donated services and materials:

Donated services and materials are recorded as revenue at their fair market value and are immediately recognized as an expenditure.

(e) Use of estimates:

The preparation of financial statements requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenue and expenses during the year. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

The nature of the indemnity prevents the Foundation from reasonably estimating the maximum exposure. The Foundation has directors' liability insurance with respect to this indemnification.
