- A one-day career fair that supports the development needs of Aboriginal youth (ages 13-18) to advance their education and career paths
- Now in its 9th year, BFF hosts two career fairs in different Canadian cities each year, and to date has assisted approximately 20,000 youth to further their career plans
- Each event attracts up to 1,500 youth from the host region to attend career seminars, presentations and exhibits led by Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal career professionals
- In addition to Blueprint for the Future, the National Aboriginal Achievement Foundation (NAAF), a registered charitable organization manages:
- An Education Program that disburses more than \$2 million a year to Aboriginal post-secondary students
- Taking Pulse, an employment initiative that encourages Aboriginal people to pursue careers in growth industries
- The National Aboriginal Achievement Awards, an annual celebration of outstanding career accomplishment

A Town Hall Forum where youth can ask leaders and youth achievers guestions
