A Message from the President IT'S BEEN A BUSY YEAR!!

Our industry is back and we are busy. This year's mineral exploration and development expenditures are expected to be over \$50M. This is up significantly from 2004. There are a number of advanced exploration programs with a couple of company's preparing for potential mine production. The YCM is really looking forward to having an operating mine back in Yukon.

Some of the advanced projects that are nearing production include:

Sherwood Copper Corporations' Minto Deposit, where the company is re-confirming the resource estimates for this high-grade copper gold project and carrying out further expansion drilling. The project feasibility study will be updated over this winter.

Yukon Zinc Corporations' Wolverine deposit, where the company is moving along with it's advanced exploration and resource confirmation. Underground development has advanced over 225 m and has reached the massive sulphide horizon. The company expects to make a production decision in 2006.

Other notable mineral exploration and development projects including Cash Minerals' Division Mountain Coal project, Tintina Mines Red Mountain Molybdenum project and Tagish Lake Gold's Mt Skukum and Skukum Creek projects. Exploration work is continuing on these advancing projects. Future prospects look very encouraging for Yukon.

This summer has been a busy one for other reasons other than exploration. The YESAA regulations and Board Rules are currently being gazetted and after many delays YESAA project screenings should come into effect later this year. I would encourage all are members to review these rules and regulations and address any concerns to the YESAA office.

The Yukon Government is looking at making changes to the Mining Land Use Regulations by proposing operating conditions that are in line with the YESAA regulations. Thereby streamlining the screening and permitting processes. The goal is to ensure we are working in an

environmentally responsible manner and to get workers working as soon as possible.

Lastly, the Chamber commissioned Datapath Systems Inc to conduct and On-Line Poll dealing with the Quartz Mining Act. The survey was designed to gauge the level of interest from people in the mining industry towards making changes to the Act. The survey was distributed to 290 members and others in the mining industry and the poll ran throughout the summer. A response rate of 24% was achieved. A copy of the Final Report produced by Datapath is included in this newsletter.

Highlights from the report include 57% support for making changes to the Quartz Mining Act (26% against changes), 90% support for allowing witness posts, 87% support allowing 1 post with 4 tags at the junction of 4 claims, 80% support receiving tags before staking, 75% support converting the Act to metric, 74% support allowing posts within existing claims. There was support for allowing larger groupings of claims, however the size of groupings was mixed, 40% support unlimited grouping, 24% support up to 100 claims per group, 14% for 250 claims per group and only 9% would like to stay with the existing 16 claims per group.

Now for the result we have all been waiting for – Do our members want to go to MAP STAKING? Well it appears they do not. The survey allowed for a first and second choice on staking procedure. The choices were Map Staking, existing 2-post system, 2-posts but larger claim size, perimeter staking, 1-post staking, or no opinion. The results added up to greater than 100% due to the two choices and **the winner is 1-post staking with 81% support**. This was followed by 2-posts with a larger claim size (21%), Map Selection (20%), perimeter staking (19%), No opinion (19%). The current 2-post system received only 13% support.

The Chamber directors and members will be discussing these results this fall and look to formulate a decision on how to proceed with these results. I would encourage our members to participate in membership meetings and be involved in the decision making process.

I wish you all good luck with your projects. See you at the Geoscience Forum.

Sherwood Optimistic About Minto

Whitehorse Star, September 23, 2005

MINTO LANDING—Sherwood Copper Corp. is resuscitating the Minto copper and gold property near Mindo Landing, with a goal of bringing it into production by next summer. While the project was successfully steered through the permitting stage by Minto Exploration in the mid-1990's, it fell dormant in 1998 when copper prices tumbled and one of projects's international mining partners found itself with it s back against the wall. Except for a minor drill program in 2001, the property has been silent.

Sherwood president Stephen Quinn is confident—bordering on certain—that the revitalization of the Minto project is a given. Permits for the mine were extended this week for another 10 years. "I think we can get this thing into production in this cycle," said Quinn. "The only thing Sherwood needs to do is bring the feasibility study up to new standards."

Ouinn said that if Sherwood gives the green light to the Minto project, construction could begin next spring and the mine could be in production by next summer, given the state of readiness the project is in.

Copper Ridge Explorations Inc. Drilling Confirms Continuity Of Tungsten Mineralization At Kalzas

Vancouver, BC, September 28, 2005 - Copper Ridge Explorations Inc. ("Copper Ridge" or the "Company") is pleased to report on final drill results from its Kalzas high grade tungsten deposit in central Yukon. The program included 397.4 meters of thin-wall BQ core in 5 holes.

The program was cut short by freezing weather conditions and waterline problems. However, the program successfully demonstrated that the high grade tungsten mineralization sampled at surface does show continuity to depth and along strike. Holes 1, 2 and 3 were drilled along a section under the South Upper Levels trench. Hole 4 was drilled 75 m to the west and hole 5 was drilled a further 150 m to the west, under the North Upper Levels trench.

The Company is now considering a major drill test of the Kalzas deposit, utilizing larger diameter drill core in order to minimize the nugget effect caused by the coarse-grained nature of some of the wolframite (tungsten) mineralization. In the short term, the Company is also re-analyzing core samples to test for the influence of nugget effect in the assay process.

North American Tungsten Corp. Ltd. Announces Cantung Mine Restart

June 8, 2005

North American Tungsten is pleased to announce that the Company has reached a production decision to restart its whollyowned Cantung mine, located on the border of the Yukon and NWT. The process of restarting mining operations will commence immediately, with production expected in August of this year.

The Company's decision was reached based upon off-take commitments which, in the aggregate, account for approximately 70% of its forecast annual production of 400,000 metric tonne units ("mtu's") of tungsten concentrate. While the Company continues to negotiate on the remaining 30% of its annual production, it may elect to hold back all or a portion thereof to affect sales in the spot market.



2005 Robert E. Leckie Award For Outstanding Quartz And Placer Mining Reclamation Practices

This award is a tribute to Robert E. Leckie, an innovator who promoted planned reclamation, research, and co-operation that benefited both government and industry.

The award is given to quartz exploration companies and placer operators for exceptional reclamation and site restoration efforts.

This includes:

- · reclaiming land for which there was no obligation to rehabilitate;
- adding features to the land that notably enhanced the area and local community; or
- returning mined land to a condition that is not only structurally sound but aesthetically pleasing.

Nominations must be submitted in writing and should include:

- · reasons why the operator/company should be considered for the award;
- · location of the claim block and name and address of the operator; and
- at least one colour picture (preferably print or slide) of the reclamation activity.

The nominations will be evaluated by a committee which includes the Yukon government, Klondike Placer Miners' Association and the Yukon Chamber of Mines. Awards will be presented at the Yukon Geoscience Forum, November 21.

Deadline for nominations is Friday, October 14, 2005.

The following changes took place in the Yukon government's Department of Energy, Mines and Resources, effective Sept 1st:

The former Minerals Development and Minerals Management Branches have been amalgamated under a new Mineral Resources Branch. The Director of this new branch is Robert Holmes. The development function and regulatory function are being retained as separate units within the Mineral Resources Branch, given their distinct responsibilities in addressing government priorities. Kevin Brewer is Manager of the Mineral Planning and Development Unit and Joanne Oberg is Manager of the Mining Lands Unit.

As well, the Yukon Geological Survey is now officially a stand alone branch within the Oil and Gas and Mineral Resources team of EMR. It reflects the mandate of the Survey to undertake work related to oil and gas potential as well as minerals. Grant Abbott is the acting director until staffing for the position is concluded.

You will notice little if any changes in your day-to-day dealings with our staff. The primary purpose is to better integrate functions, reduce duplication of these units and thereby help us serve you better.
