2, 4 and 6 months

- → Meningococcal C Conjugate (meningitis) (at 2 months only)

6 - 23 months

→ Influenza (during flu season only)

I2 months

- → Measles Mumps Rubella
- → Varicella (chicken pox)*
- → Meningococcal C Conjugate (meningitis)

18 months

- → Diphtheria Pertussis (whooping cough) Tetanus Polio
- Haemophilus Influenza Type B
- → Measles Mumps Rubella
- → Pneumococcal Conjugate

Kindergarten

- → Diphtheria Pertussis (whooping cough) Tetanus Polio
 → Varicella (chicken pox)*

NOTE:

- \rightarrow Each ' \rightarrow ' represents one injection and lists what is in each vaccine.
- $\mbox{\sc x}$ Varicella is given only if the child has not had the disease or if they have not already received the vaccination.
- This vaccine is given only if the child has not previously had the vaccine.
