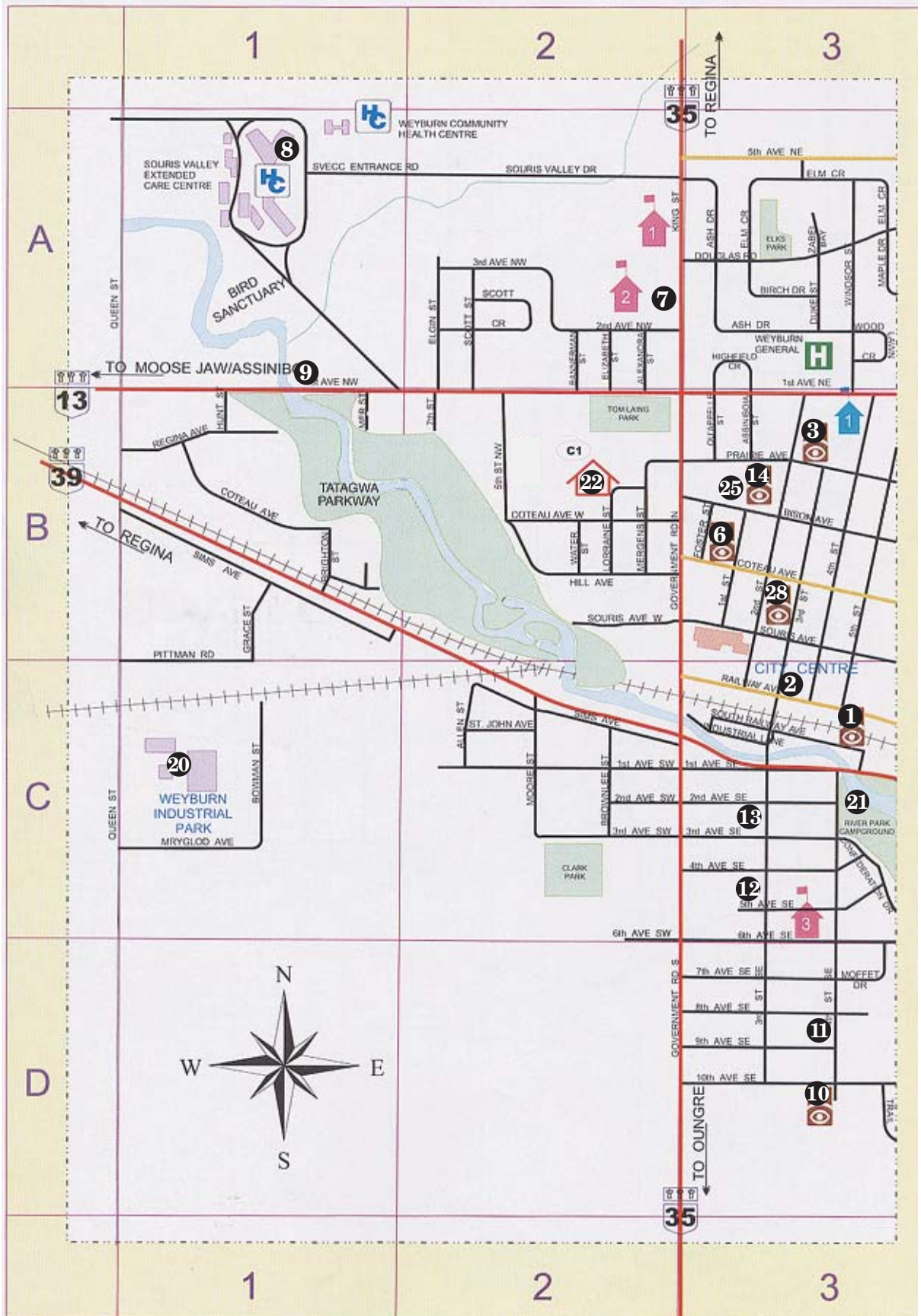

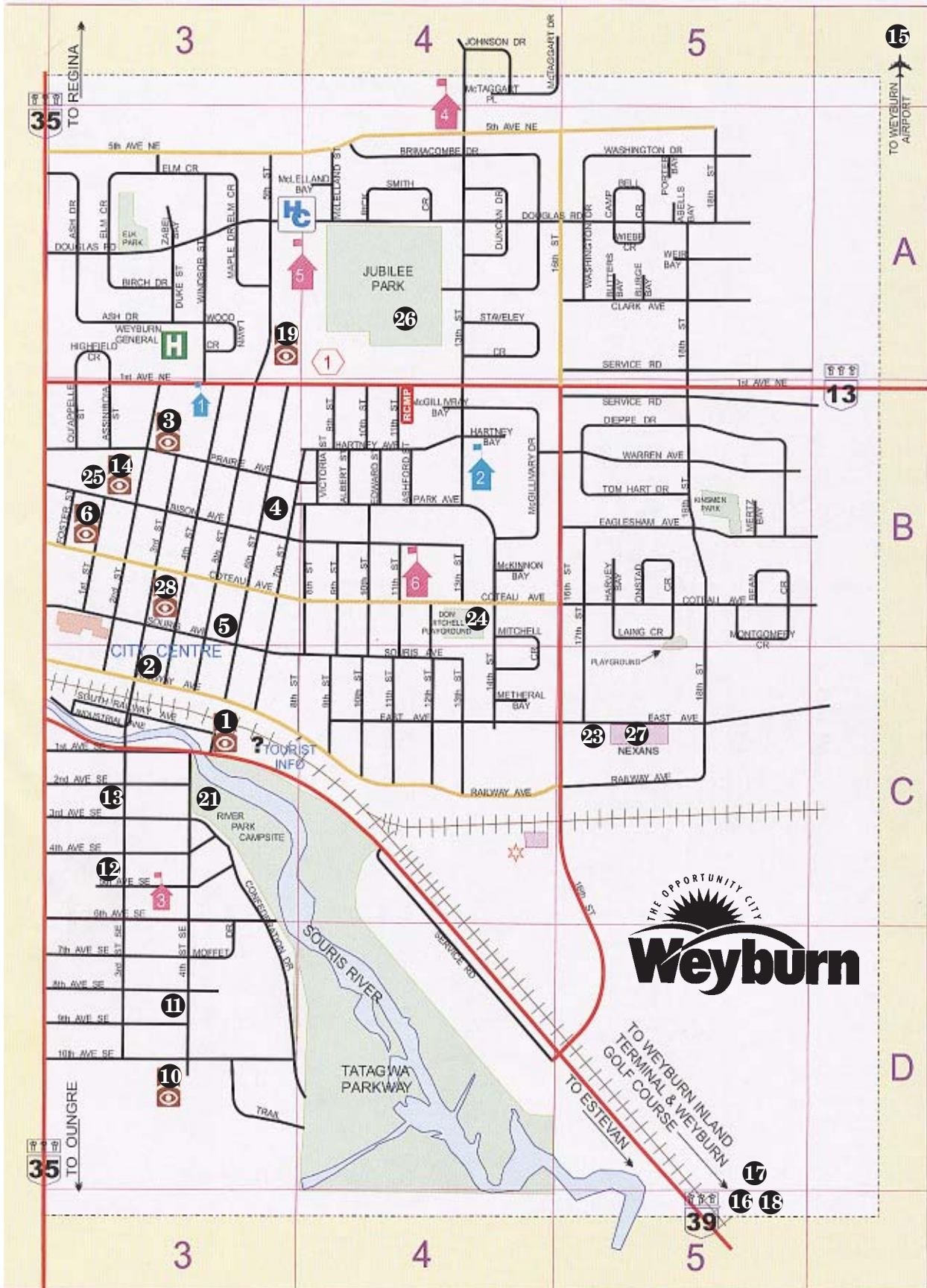

Prairie Profile

"Land of Living Skies"

Weyburn is located on the Souris River at the junction of highways 13, 35 and 39 in S.E. Saskatchewan, 75 km north of the American border at Fortuna, N.D. and 115 km south of Saskatchewan's capital, Regina.

Weyburn has been synonymous with "opportunity" since its inception as a prairie village in 1899 by five immigrant businessmen. Today, Weyburn is Canada's largest inland grain handling point, the heartland of the Prairies. Oil is our other major industry with more than 600 producing wells. Both industries are supported by a substantial service sector including retail shopping; ethanol, wire, cable and pipe production; building materials; professional services and food processing. Weyburn has excellent links to other major centres (ground and air) and modern activities including parks, sports facilities, libraries, art galleries, museums and camping facilities. Weyburn has a strong reputation for solid economic growth and friendly people, offering a strong community foundation for new residential, commercial and industrial expansion. *Visit Weyburn, "the Opportunity City"*.

The Weyburn Story

Some people claim Weyburn was named after a railway man who supervised the laying of steel. There are others, however, who insist the city got its name from a Scot. There's the story that on a hot summer's afternoon, an exploring Scot, on coming across the Souris River, exclaimed "Wee Burn," and hence, the community became Wee Burn, later changed to Weyburn.

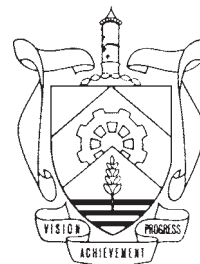
Coat of Arms

The blue shield of Weyburn's Coat of Arms represents the beautiful blue sky of the prairies and the portion of the Souris River through Weyburn. Our green fields are depicted by the green chevron, and recognition is given to the oil industry with the insertion of the black bars.

The backbone of the community is recognized by the gold wheat head. Transportation, industrial development and the railway to which Weyburn owes its beginning are symbolized by the gold cogged wheel. Our unique water tower is given a place of honour as it depicts the early structures in our community.

Our pioneering forefathers – whether they were breaking sod, drilling for oil, or constructing road and rail – forged ahead with a vision, applying their natural instincts to overcome the many challenges confronting them beneath the open, blue skies of the prairies. The achievements of our pioneers are reflected in the success our community enjoys today.

We enter into a new era – world advancement in communication, transportation, and production technology forces us to compete in a global society. As our Coat of Arms depicts, we must now be the pioneers of today, with the vision and the commitment to achieve progress and prosperity for the future.



Sports & Recreation

Weyburn and surrounding area has a wide variety of recreational activities and facilities. Whether you are young, or just young at heart, Weyburn has something for you to do. The following list is by no means comprehensive, but we encourage you to try some of these activities during your stay in the Weyburn area.

Weyburn Red Wings Junior A Hockey Team - The Weyburn Red Wings

compete in the Saskatchewan Junior Hockey League and are one of the most successful Teams in League history. Each year the Red Wings challenge for the League Championship in front of thousands of fans at the Weyburn Sports Arena and Colosseum. The Red Wings won the Anavet Cup in 1997 and 1998, the Centennial Cup in 1984, and the Provincial Championship in 1993-1994.

The Colosseum is home to a strong minor hockey association. The Colosseum operates at full capacity with figure skating, hockey and public skating. In the off-season the facility is used for roller skating, dances, music shows, and circus and annual fair and trade shows. A second ice facility, Tom Zandee Sports Arena, was added to support the needs of the ever-expanding program, and this building is also utilized for year-round community projects.

Minor ball occupies the city ball diamonds and the youth participate in the annual spring clean-up campaign for the cleanest city competition. Fast ball, slow pitch, ladies' ball, minor ball and baseball are all played on city diamonds. Clark Park, under the lights, Coulter Field and Jubilee Park diamonds are where you find the ball players and fans in the summer. Tom Laing Park was officially opened in 1988 when Weyburn hosted the Canadian Junior Baseball Championship. This baseball park meets all national standards.

Weyburn has two tennis court locations, one at the Comprehensive School and one adjacent to the Leisure Centre.

The Weyburn Leisure Centre is a year round public facility that features an indoor pool, waterslide, hot tub, sauna, and teaching pool. It is open from September until May when the outdoor pool is closed. The outdoor pool also has a paddling pool and is open from June until August. Adjoining the Leisure Centre is the Turner Curling Museum as well as a Fitness Centre.

The Weyburn Golf Club is a beautiful and challenging 18 hole golf course which features numerous sand traps, water hazards, and tree lined fairways. It also features a full service Pro-shop complete with cart and club rentals and a driving range. It also has a fully licensed restaurant and is home to several tournaments throughout the year.

Each year Weyburn plays host to many events including the Weyburn Fair which takes place in July. The Weyburn Wheat Festival, which highlights the city roots in the agriculture industry, is a 3 day event that takes place during August. The Weyburn Farm, Home and Leisure Show features exhibitors from all over the province showcasing a variety of products. The Saskatchewan Oil and Gas Show takes place every other year in Weyburn and features the latest technology in the Oil and Gas Industry and also features the Saskatchewan Oil Patch Awards. These are just a few of the events that take place at the Weyburn Exhibition Grounds all year long. The exhibition grounds are also home to the Weyburn Colosseum, Tom Zandee Sports Arena, as well as the Weyburn Curling Rink.

Cross country skiing, moto-cross racing, soccer, bowling, touch football, boxing club, karate club, swimming, gymkhana and equestrian events can all be participated in at Weyburn. There is also an active horticultural society for gardeners.

Parks

Jubilee Park includes 47 acres of irrigated ball diamonds, jogging and biking trails, walking paths, a children's playground and a unique centre focus which features rocks and greenery, as well as a picnic and barbecue area.

Tatagwa Parkway follows the Souris River as it meanders through the city of Weyburn. The parkway consists of 73 hectares of land dedicated to the preservation of the native flora and fauna. There are 8.5 kms of trails to walk, jog or bike on and enjoy the natural environment. The bird watching is excellent, and the many benches offer a unique chance to sit and enjoy the native surroundings.

Nickle Lake Park, located southeast of Weyburn on #39 highway was built in co-operation with surrounding rural municipalities. It has since become a Regional Park with swimming, miniature golf, camping, water skiing, power and sail boating and fishing provisions. Ice fishing has become a popular winter activity.

River Park, Weyburn's city campground and picnic area along the banks of the Souris River, continues to be a popular and relaxing spot for both visitors and area residents alike. The park, which is adjacent to Highway 39, can accommodate campers, RVs or tents and provides easy access to the city's downtown core, which is only a few blocks away. Services available for travellers include 28 fully serviced sites as well as a number of unserviced sites, handicap accessible washrooms and showers, firewood, picnic spots and a fully equipped playground for the kids. Campers staying at River Park can find out one reason why Weyburn is called the Hospitality Capital of Sask. when they visit the Chamber of Commerce hospitality booth, which will be open from the end of May to the end of August and is staffed by local businesses and service groups. Free coffee, snacks and plenty of conversation and information are available to visitors from 7:00 - 9:00 every evening.

Hunting & Fishing

The city of Weyburn is centrally located in an area well suited to fulfill the wishes of all types of outdoor enthusiasts. The Souris River Valley and surrounding acres of farmland are home to numerous Whitetail deer as well as an ever increasing population of Mule deer. The Big Muddy Valley, west of Weyburn, also provides many square miles of Mule deer and Antelope habitat.

Migratory birds use the Weyburn area as a staging ground on their migratory flight to the south each fall. "Pitting-in" on a frosty fall morning is a favorite pastime of Weyburn waterfowlers. Farmland surrounding Weyburn also provides a home for Sharp Tailed Grouse and Hungarian Partridge. A short drive south of Weyburn upland game fans will encounter the challenge of the king of game birds – the Pheasant!

Nickle Lake Regional Park is "must" stop for all avid anglers. Nickle Lake has a reputation for resident Northern Pike and Yellow Perch as well as an abundant supply of Walleye. Excellent camping facilities, boat launch facilities, as well as close proximity to Weyburn top off this great fishing spot.

Active branches of the Saskatchewan Natural History Society, the Saskatchewan Wildlife Federation and Ducks Unlimited in Weyburn attest to the fact that many species of wildlife call Weyburn area home.

Bird Watching

The Souris Valley Regional Care Centre is the best place for an early morning bird walk. The Centre is located in the northwest just north of Highway 13. The area is good at any time of year, but is especially productive in the spring and fall for raptors and songbirds.

Another excellent birding spot is Nickle Lake, a reservoir located just south of the city on the Souris River. As it is one of the few waterbodies in the region, Nickle Lake is a good place for waterbirds. For example, the Common Loon and Piping Plover have nested here, while all three species of scoter have been observed during the fall migration.

An exploration of the grasslands areas surrounding the lake should yield Ferruginous Hawk, Baird's Sparrow and Chestnut-collared Longspur. Although increasingly rare in the province, the pastures in the surrounding area remain good spots to see Burrowing Owls.

A Guide to the flora and fauna of the Tatagwa-Souris Valley by Ray Belanger includes birding hotspots, a checklist and contacts for the area. It is available from the Weyburn City Hall.

Oil Industry

When the petroleum industry is mentioned, people automatically think of Alberta, specifically Calgary. But Saskatchewan is the second largest oil producer in the country, accounting for about 20 per cent of Canadian production, and Weyburn is right in the heart of it all.

There are about 320 oil and gas companies doing business in Saskatchewan, providing employment directly or indirectly to about 19,000

people a year (2000 statistic).

Weyburn offers a variety of services, not only for the oil field, but also offers entertainment and recreation facilities. The city boasts several hotels capable of hosting large numbers of guests and conferences and the restaurants in Weyburn range from the regular fast food fare to Asian delights and good old fashion country cooking. For an evening out on the town Weyburn offers a theater playing newly released films, pubs, night clubs and during hockey season many of the town residents can be found watching the Junior "A" Weyburn Red Wings at the Colosseum.

Weyburn also offers several oil field service companies capable of handling simple or complex tasks quickly and efficiently. There are also oil field consultants and oil disposal sites not far from town.

The strongest draw for petroleum companies to set up operations in Weyburn is a town that understands the business of petroleum and a work force that is accustomed to working in the industry.

"We have a pretty stable and knowledgeable service industry, so whether it's construction or maintenance or service rigs, there are a lot of companies that have been around for a lot of years," said Darcy Cretin, production supervisor for the EnCana facility near Weyburn.

Several major petroleum companies already do business in and around the Weyburn area including EnCana Corporation, Precision Drilling and Anadarko Canada Energy.

Cretin said the stability, skill and knowledge of the Weyburn work force is one of the best things about operating in Weyburn. He also said that working with the rural municipalities is not difficult and municipalities work hard to help the oil industry prosper.

"It's not like you're trying to develop a new area where the industry is new to the people so we have the luxury of a lot of really knowledgeable people out there who understand a lot of our business," said Cretin.

One of the greatest selling points of the town is the low cost of living, especially when compared to major urban centres like Calgary.

"When you put it all in perspective, it is a really good community to live in and raise your kids," said Cretin.

One Weyburn oilfield project is putting Saskatchewan on the map by reducing greenhouse gas emissions and boosting the economy. For years, oil companies have tried to keep older fields productive through waterflooding - a process that uses water pressure to squeeze oil out of the rocks and up to the wellhead. Weyburn uses carbon dioxide instead. CO2 is one of the more common greenhouse gasses believed to contribute to global warming.

The Petroleum Technology Research Centre (PTRC), established at Regina in 2000, manages the Weyburn project. A key crude oil producer around Weyburn, EnCana Corporation, has offered its resources to the international team of scientists conducting the research. Evidence suggests that this technology may add 25 years to the life of the field. That's like finding another 120 million barrels of oil without exploration. Another benefit is that the CO2 stays underground where it cannot harm the environment. Engineers with

EnCana have calculated that storing that much CO2 underground would be the same as taking 3.2 million cars off the road for one year.

Agriculture

The massive 50-foot sculptures of wheat stalks along the Souris River in Weyburn stand as a testament to the city's reputation as a major agricultural centre in Saskatchewan, as well as Canada.

Once heralded as the inland grain-handling centre of the country, Weyburn has three large terminals.

Between those three terminals, Weyburn's reputation as a major hub of the grain-handling industry is well-deserved: in the 1999-2000 crop year, a total of 579,900 tonnes of grain, including wheat, durum, oats, barley, rye, flax and canola were delivered into Weyburn.

One of those terminals, the Weyburn Inland Terminal, also serves as a monument to the history of farming in Canada by being the country's first farmer-owned inland grain terminal, a story chronicled in the book "Just a Bunch of Farmers."

Beyond just shipping wheat, Weyburn farmers also grow it. The majority of agriculture in this area is in hard wheat, used for making bread, and durum, used for making pasta.

But local farmers also practice diversity, and so a wide variety of crops can be found in the Weyburn area: barley for feed and malting; oats for both milling and feed; some flax and canola; mustard, which is used in the condiment trade; lentils, peas and chickpeas; and a few acreages of sunflowers and canary seed, which are put to use for oil, confection and bird seed.

Weyburn boasts an agricultural business that is unique to the prairies: Paradise Foods International, which deals in spices and sauces made from herbs grown locally.

Besides crops, however, the Weyburn area is also host to a small but strong livestock industry. Mostly, Weyburn is home to beef cattle, with both purebred and commercial herds represented here.

One of the largest dairies in Saskatchewan is also located just outside of Weyburn. But there is more than just cattle here, as producers around the city raise bison, sheep and goats.

Livestock also take a starring role each year, as Weyburn hosts one of the largest 4-H calf shows in the province.

Closing Comment

Weyburn, the 7th largest city in Saskatchewan and the 171st in Canada, is a tightly knit community bearing the title of Hospitality Capital of the province. You can expect home-town hospitality wherever you visit in Weyburn.

It is a prosperous centre with its eye on the future; a place with purpose, a city with a heart.
