It covers programs offered by the Government of Canada, provincial and territorial governments, major Canadian municipalities, and major electric and gas utilities and companies.

How the Directory Is Organized

The Directory has three main sections:

1 National Programs – Energy efficiency and alternative energy (EAE) programs delivered by the Government of Canada and federal Crown corporations. Some of the organizations offering these programs are Natural Resources Canada, Finance Canada, the Canada Customs and Revenue Agency and the Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation.

2 Provincial and Territorial Programs – EAE programs delivered by either provincial/territorial governments or electric and gas utilities and companies with provincial/territorial reach.

3 Municipal Programs – EAE programs delivered by municipal governments or municipal electric and gas utilities and companies.

Information about each EAE program listed in the Directory includes a brief description of the program's objectives and type; sectors and sub-sectors that the program targets; the program's delivery tools; the name, address and Web site of the organization responsible for the program; and contact information.

How to Access the Directory

The Directory is available only on-line and can be accessed through the Web site at http://oee.nrcan.gc.ca/neud/dpa/policy_e/programs.cfm. (The printed version of the Directory, last published in 1998, has been discontinued.) To find information on a particular EAE program, follow these simple steps:

Step 1

At the **"Programs Directory"** page, select a jurisdiction (Canada, provincial and territorial, or municipal); **and/or**

Step 2

Select a **sector** and **sub-sector** (agriculture, commercial/institutional, industrial, residential or transportation); **and/or**

b) Select the **type of program** (awareness/information, training/technical assistance, standards (voluntary or regulated), financial incentive or tax measure, research and development, energy management and monitoring, capital funds to reduce operating costs, retrofit, growth management, or other).

Step 3

Click on the **"Search"** button at the bottom of the page.

Step 4

A new page that lists all the programs that fall under the selected options will open. **Click on the name(s) of program(s) of interest.**
