

InformationBulletin An update on the remediation of Lake Wabamun

SCAT assessment update

To assist with clean up coordination, the affected shoreline of Lake Wabamun has been divided into a total of 109 segments. To date, clean up on 98 of those segments has been completed.

79 of the 98 segments have been evaluated by SCAT Assessment Teams with 68 segments passing and 11 requiring additional attention.

Monitoring and manual remediation efforts along the shorelines will continue until freeze up to remove any remaining tarballs or to address any re-oiling as a result of wind and wave action. The SCAT teams will re-evaluate the shorelines again in the spring.

The SCAT Assessment Teams include representation from all agencies involved in the remediation including Alberta Environment, Environment Canada, Alberta Sustainable Resource Development and Nichols Environmental.

Water advisory remains in place

The Capital Health water advisory on well water usage at Whitewood Sands remains in place affecting about 8 water wells. CN is currently reconnecting the other residential wells using a process of sampling followed by shock chlorination, if required.

CN is working with the few affected residents to put in place arrangements for fresh water over the winter.

Significant progress at Paul First Nation

Approximately two thirds of the total shoreline cleanup at Paul First Nation has been completed.

Currently there are nearly 140 remediation workers specifically concentrating on the clean up along the reserve daily.
