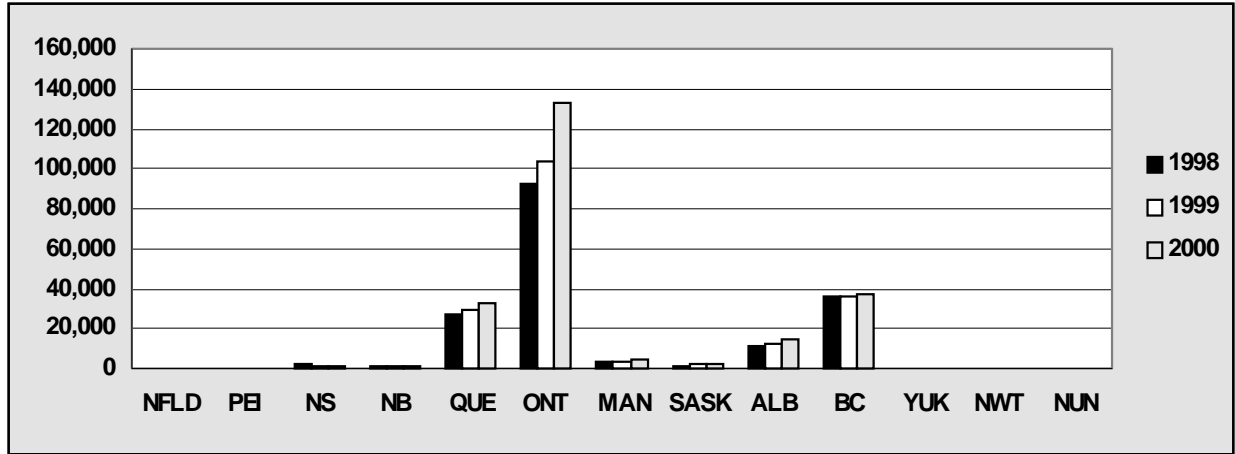

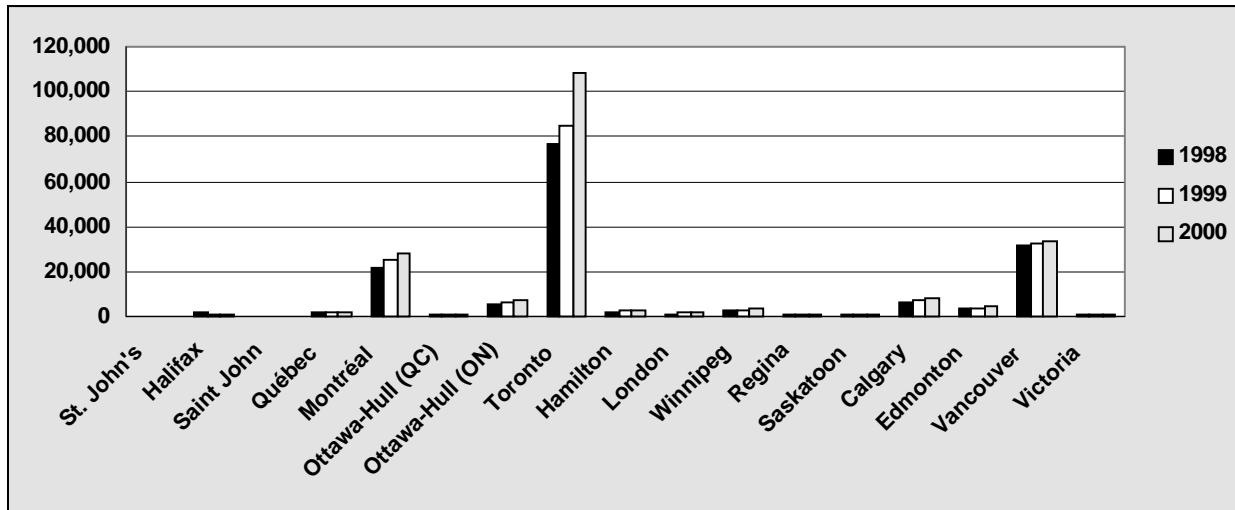

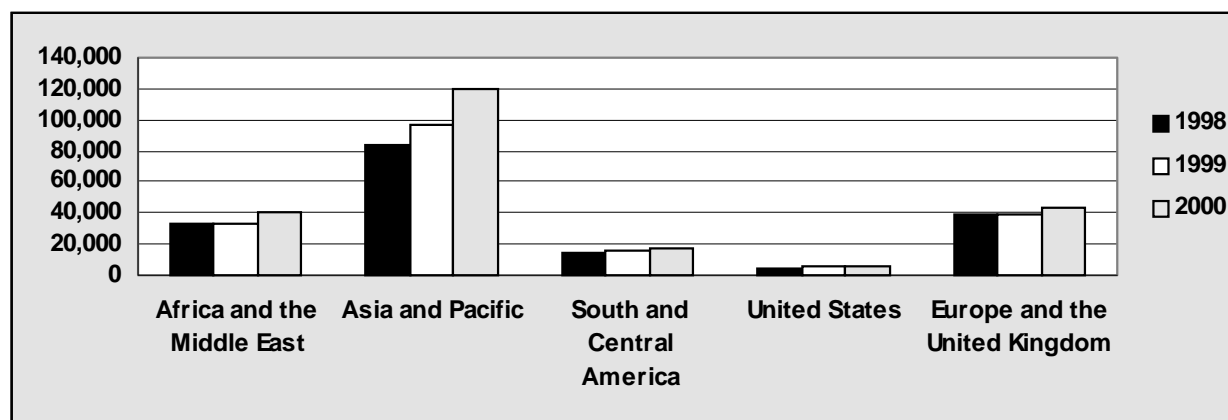

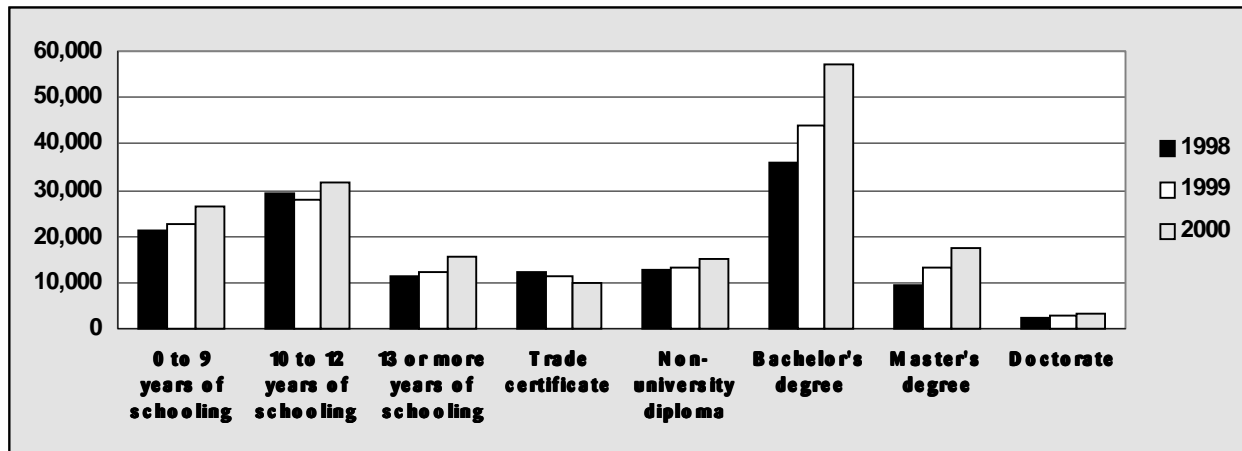

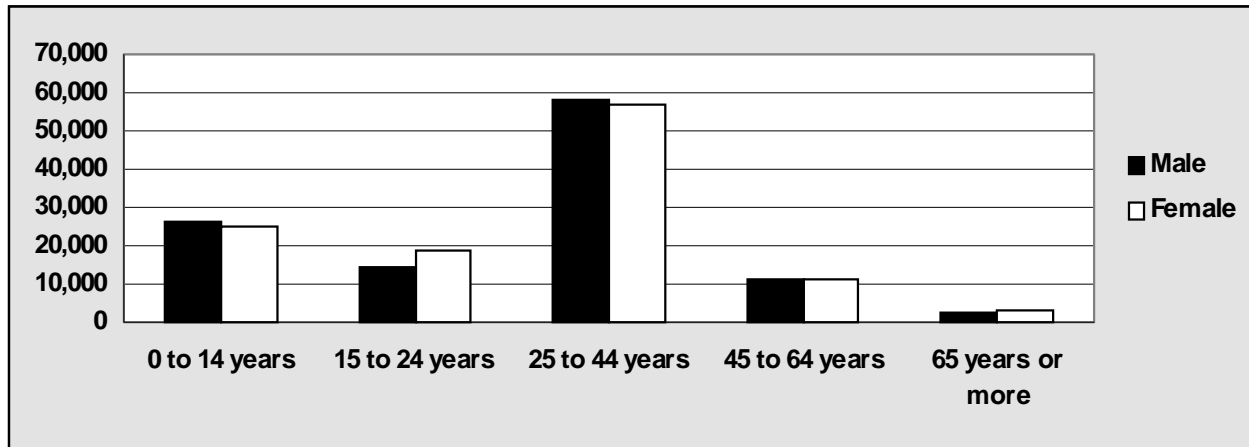

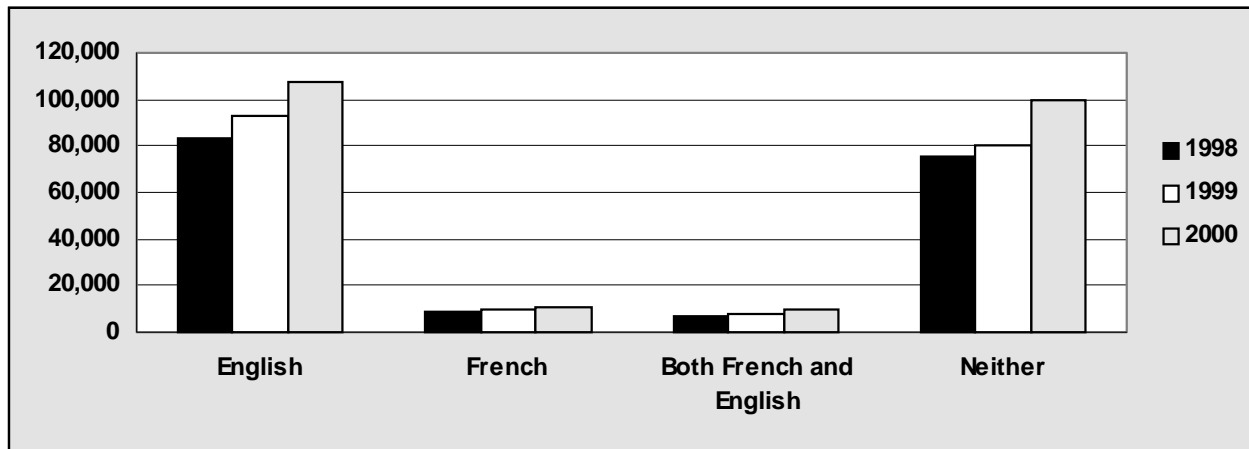

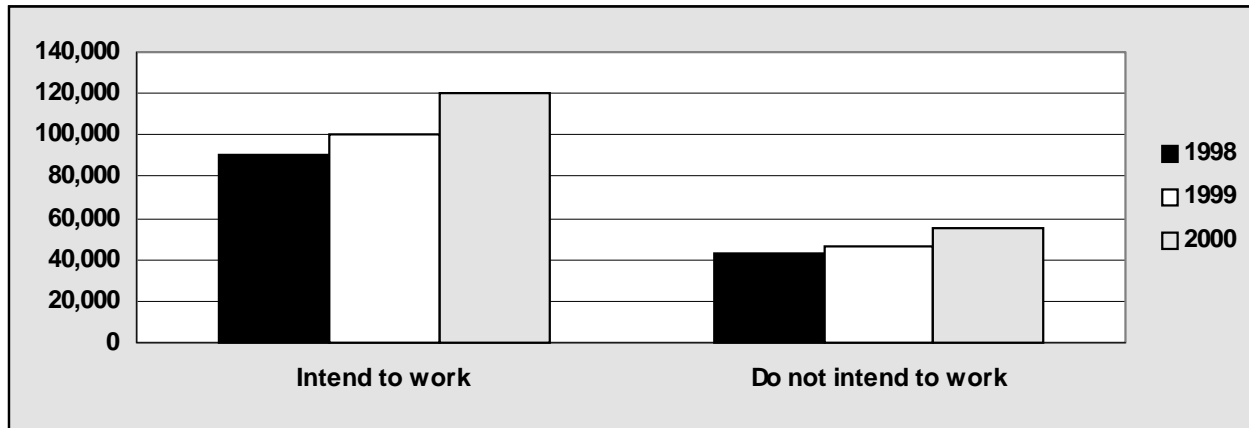

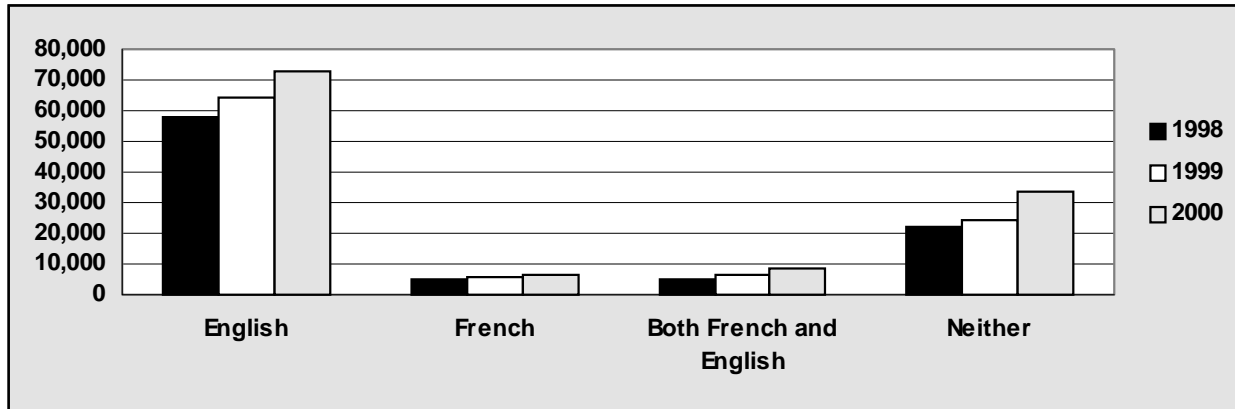

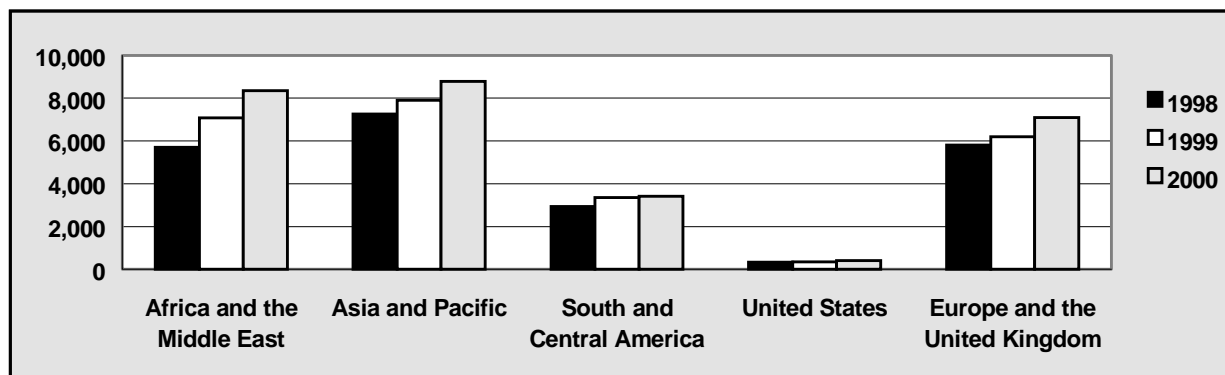

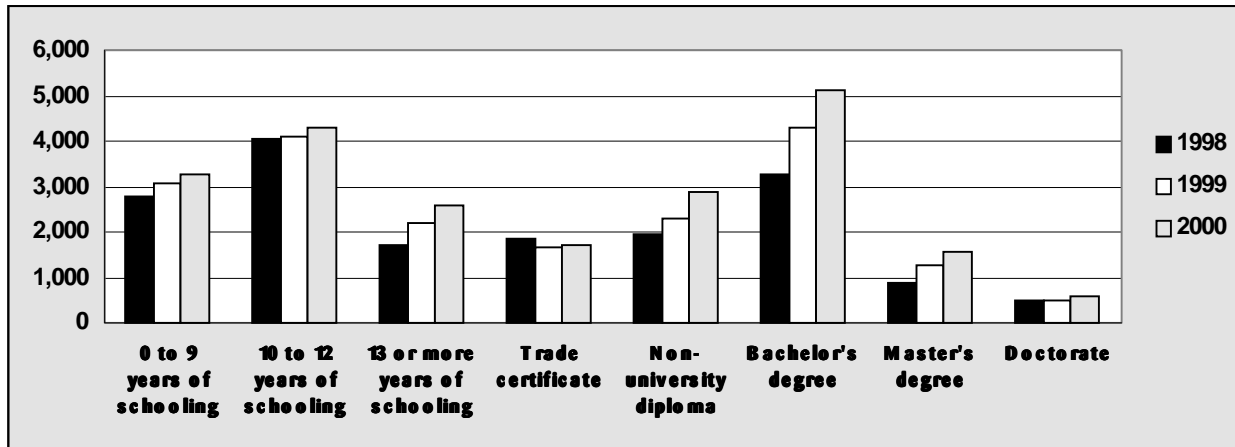

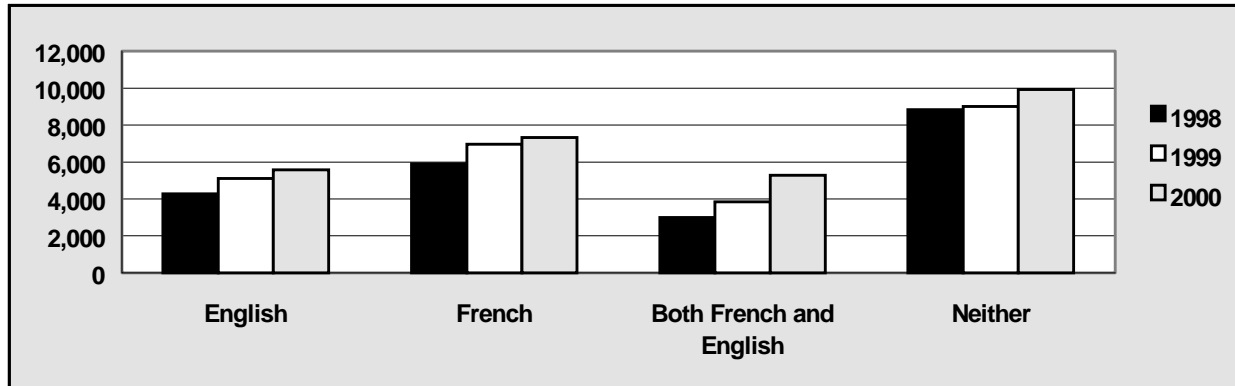

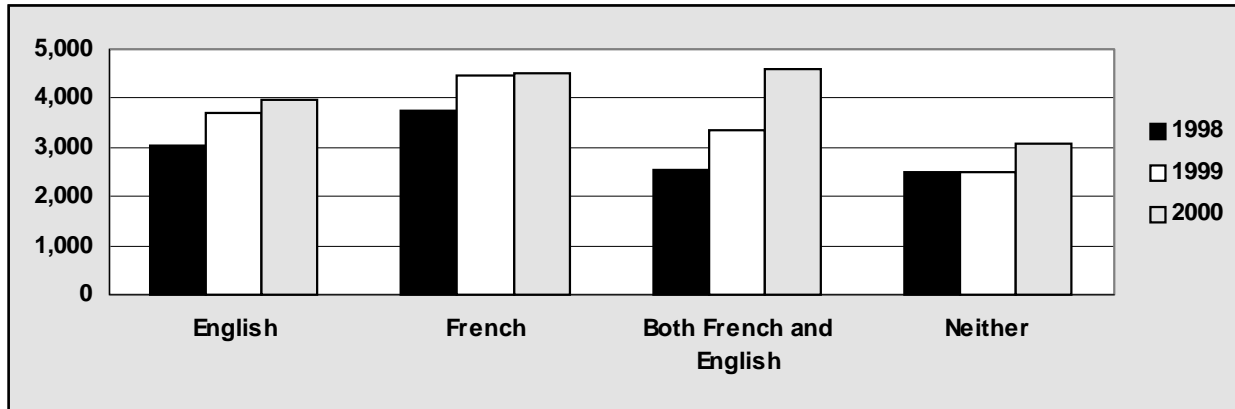

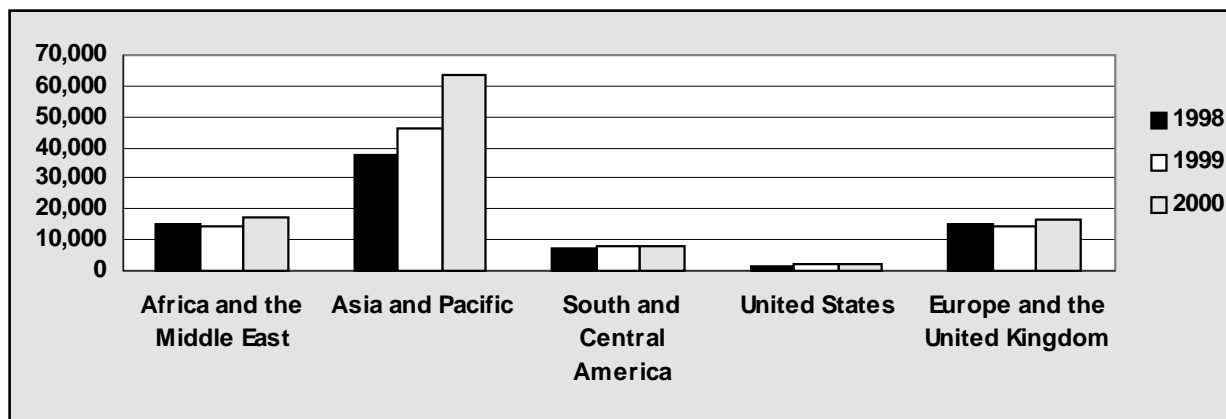

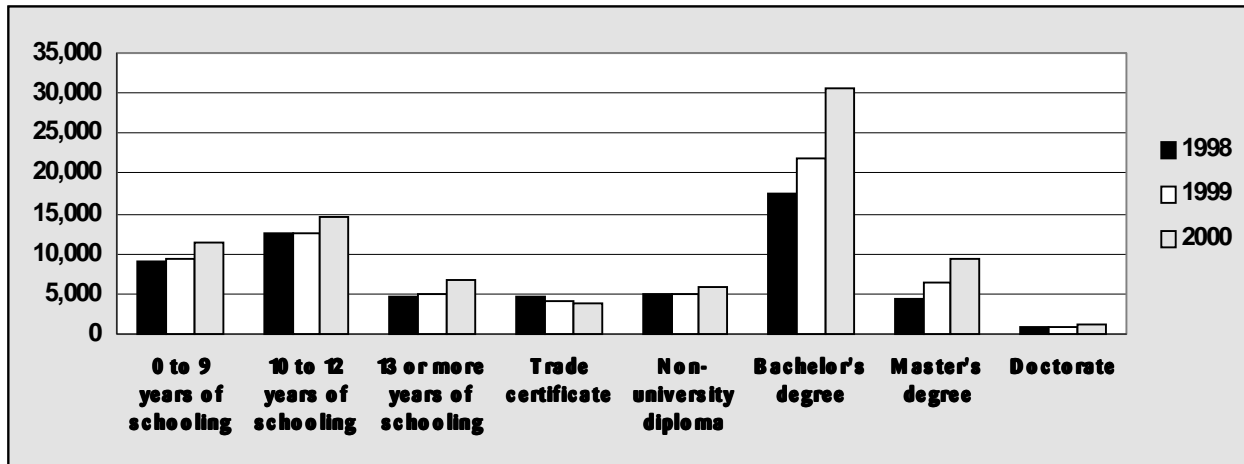

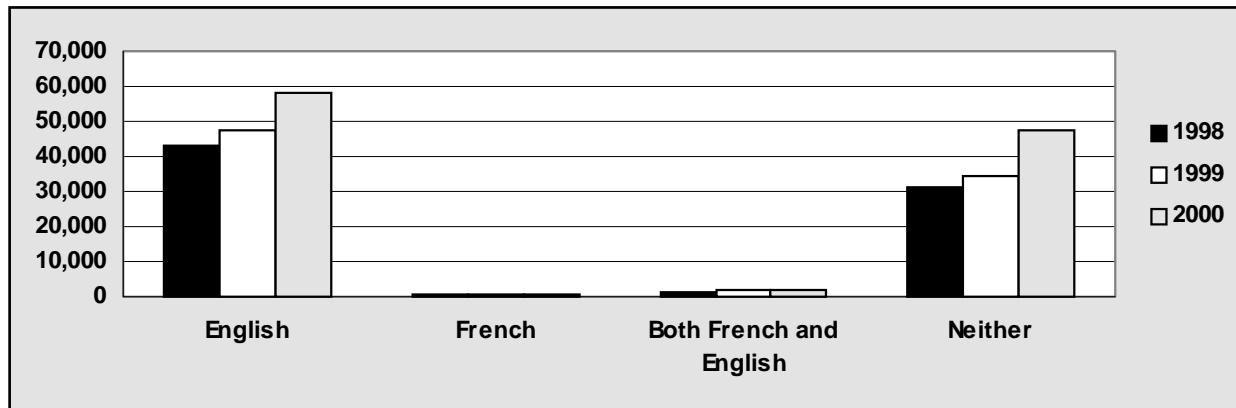

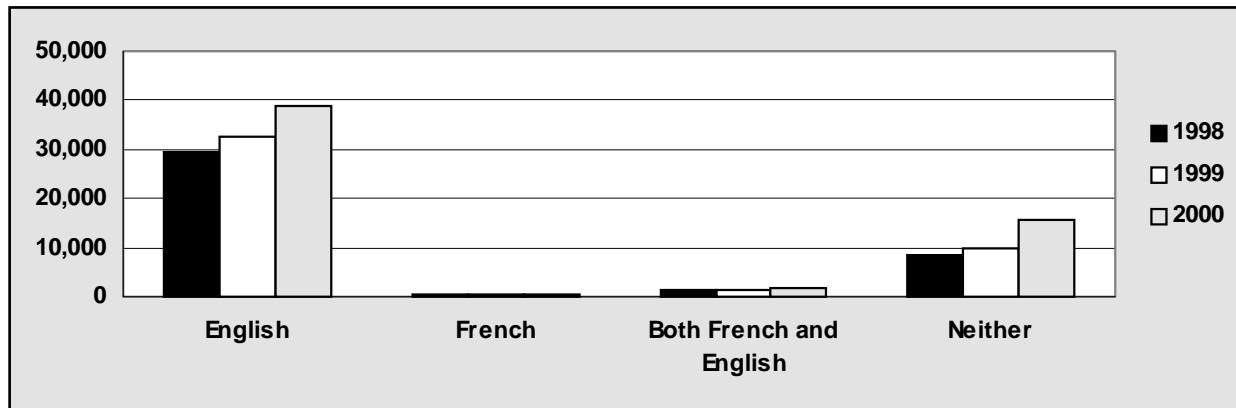

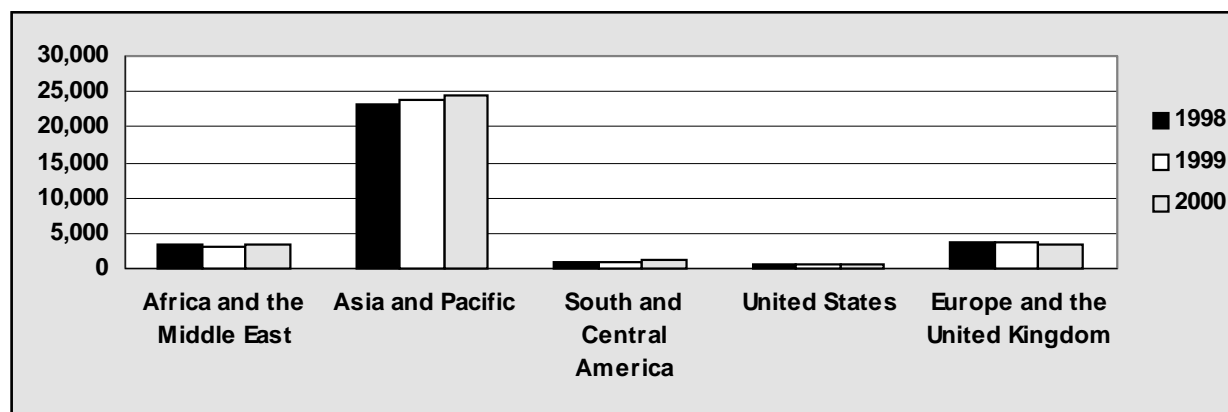

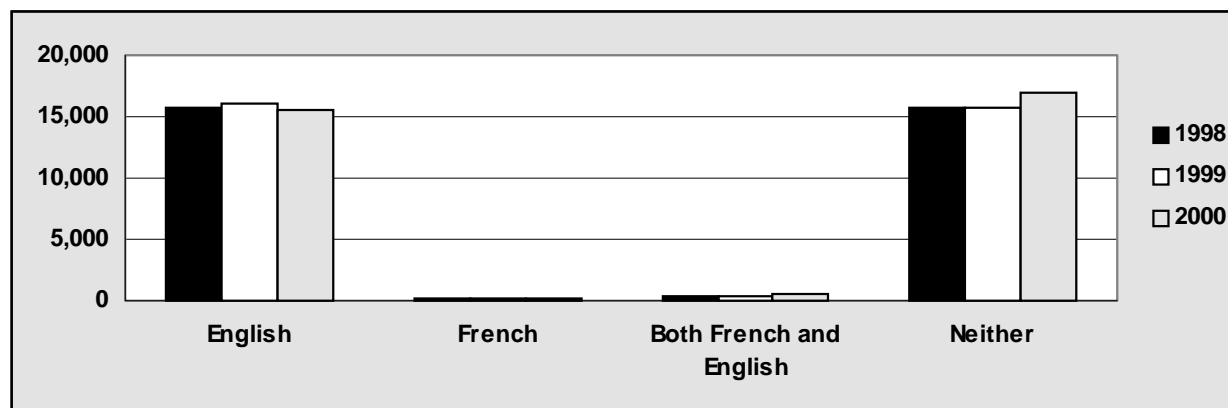

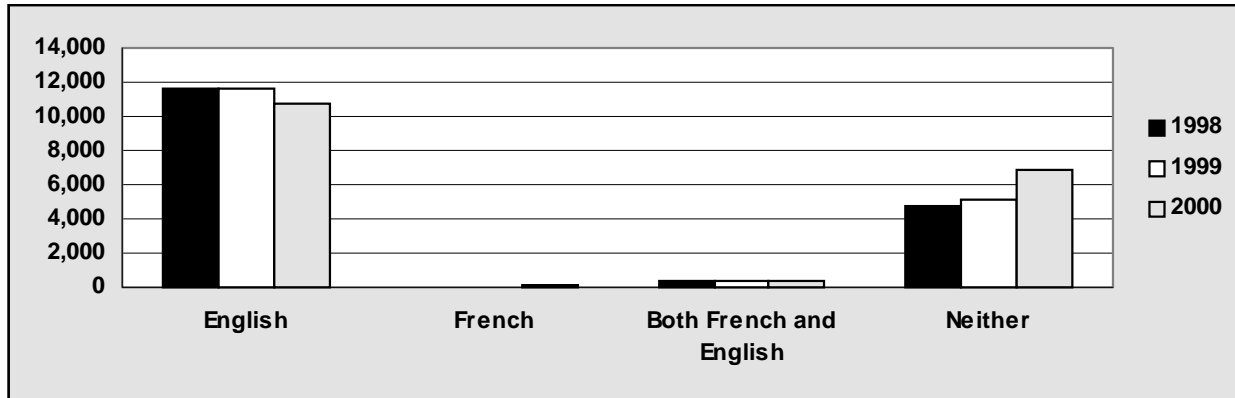

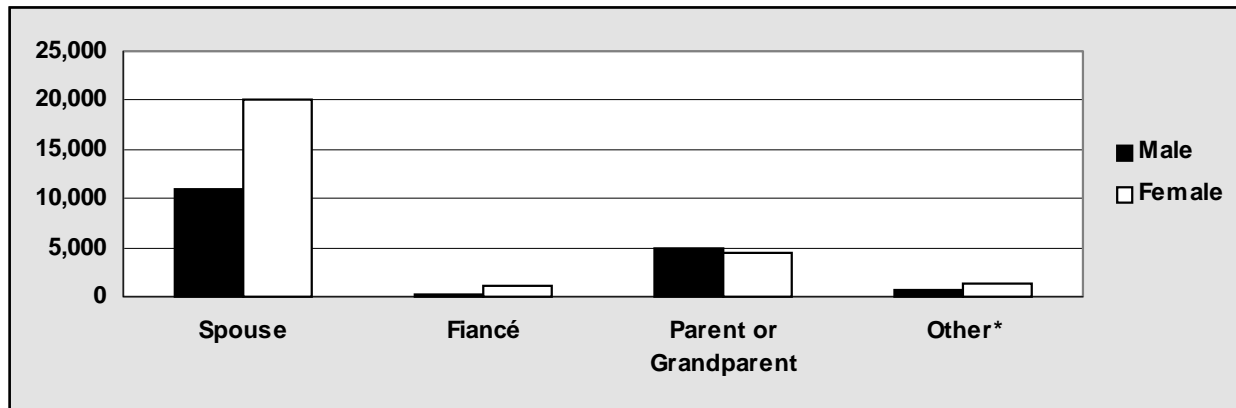

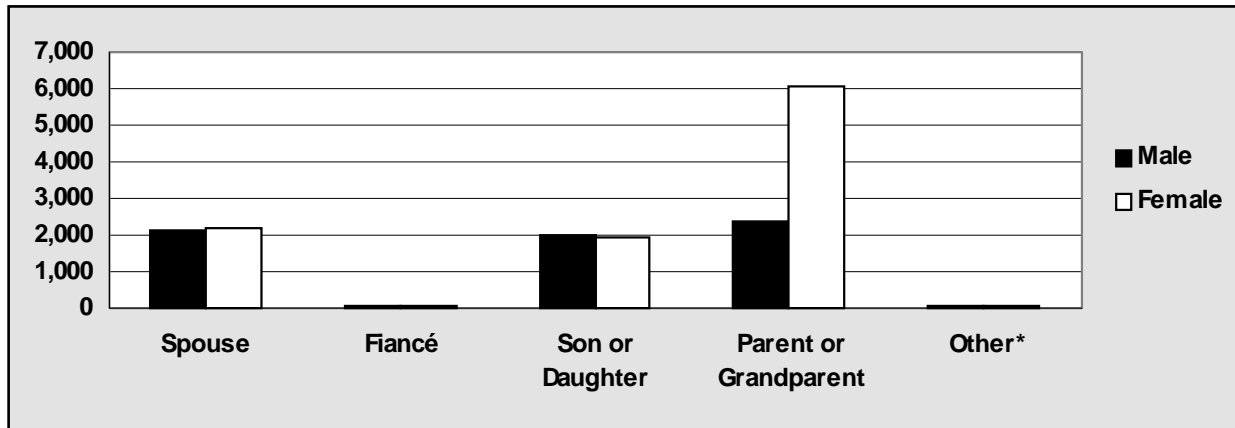

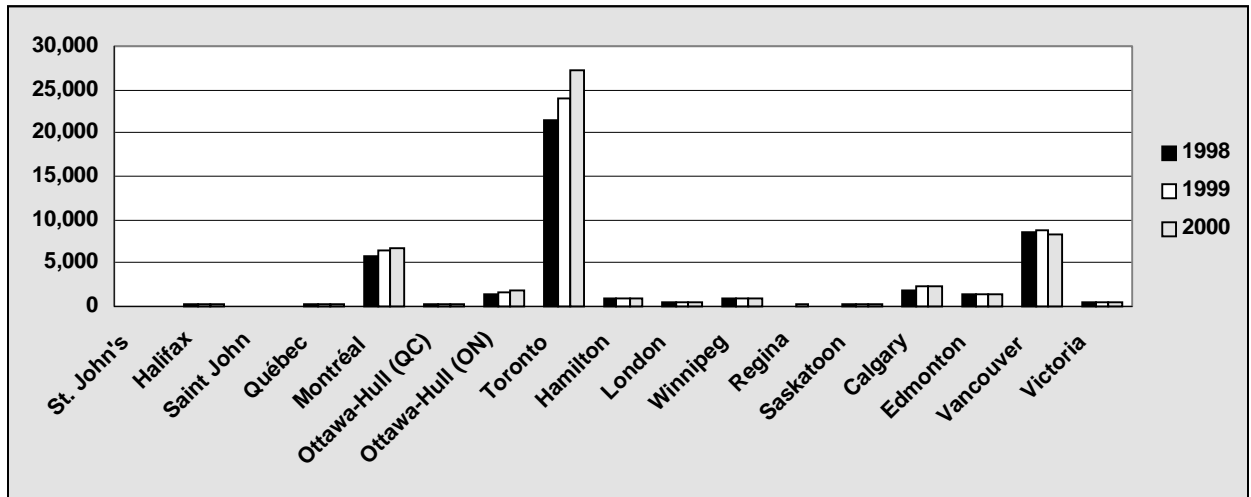

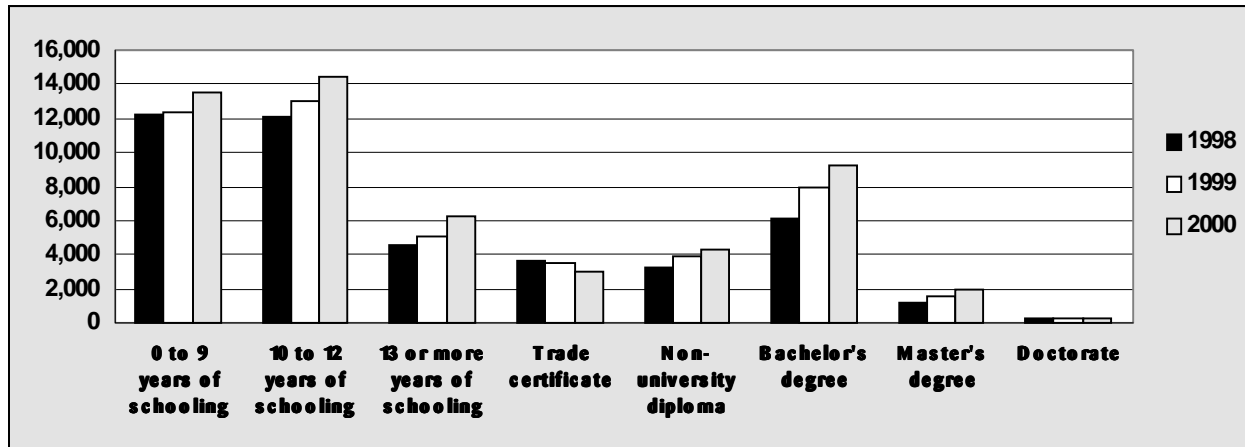

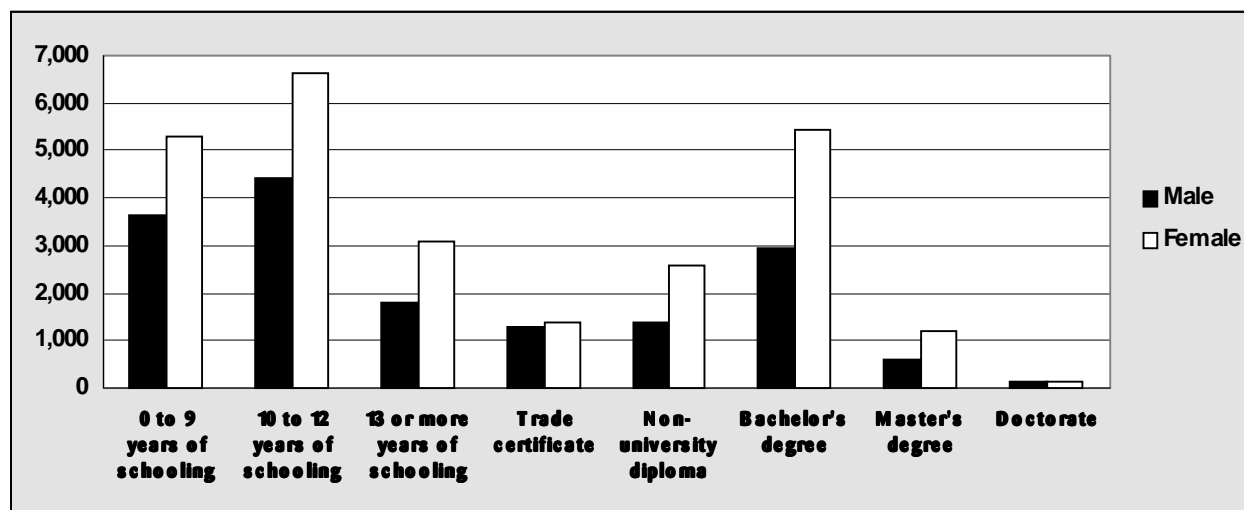

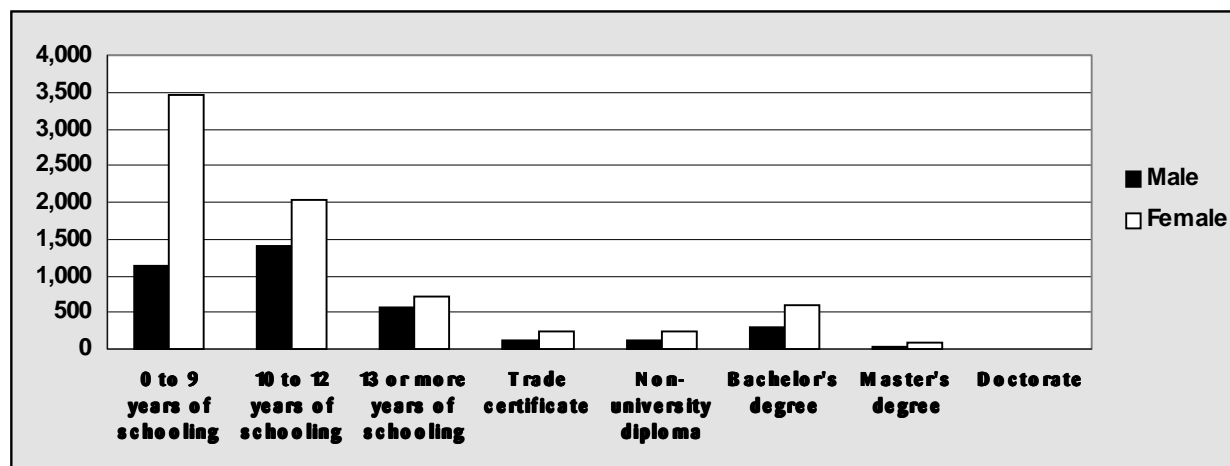

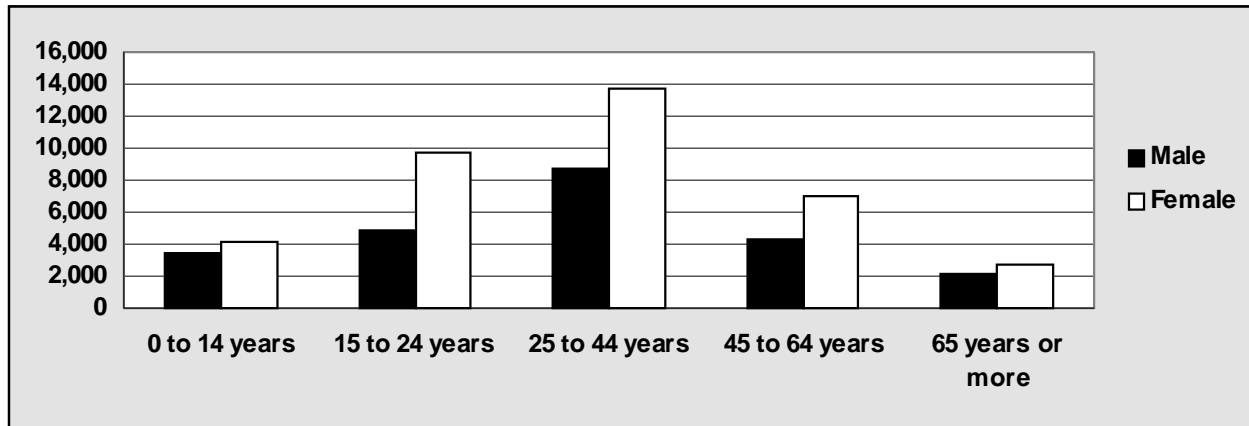

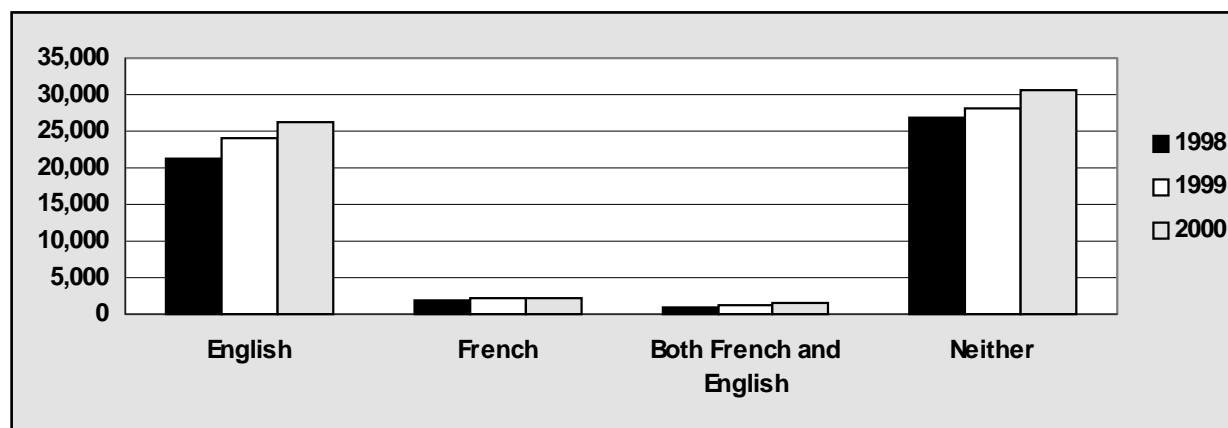

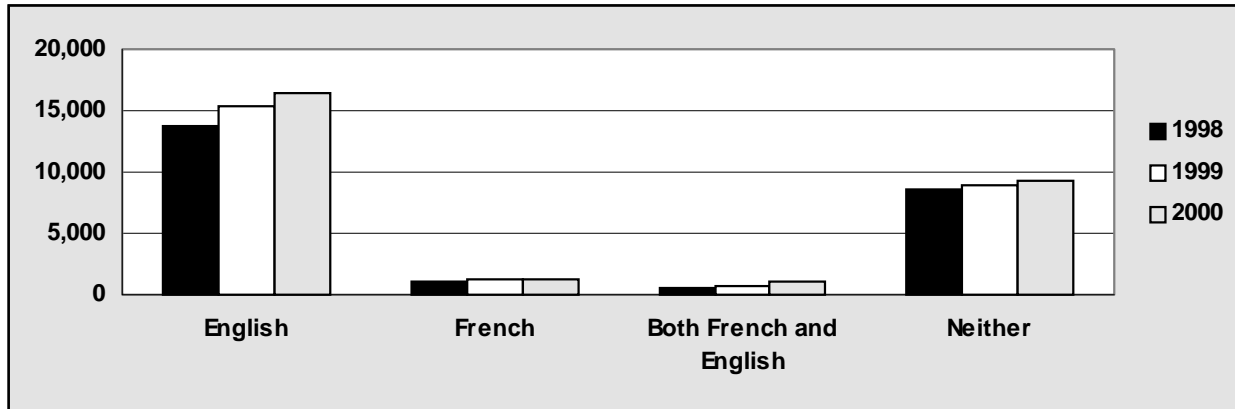

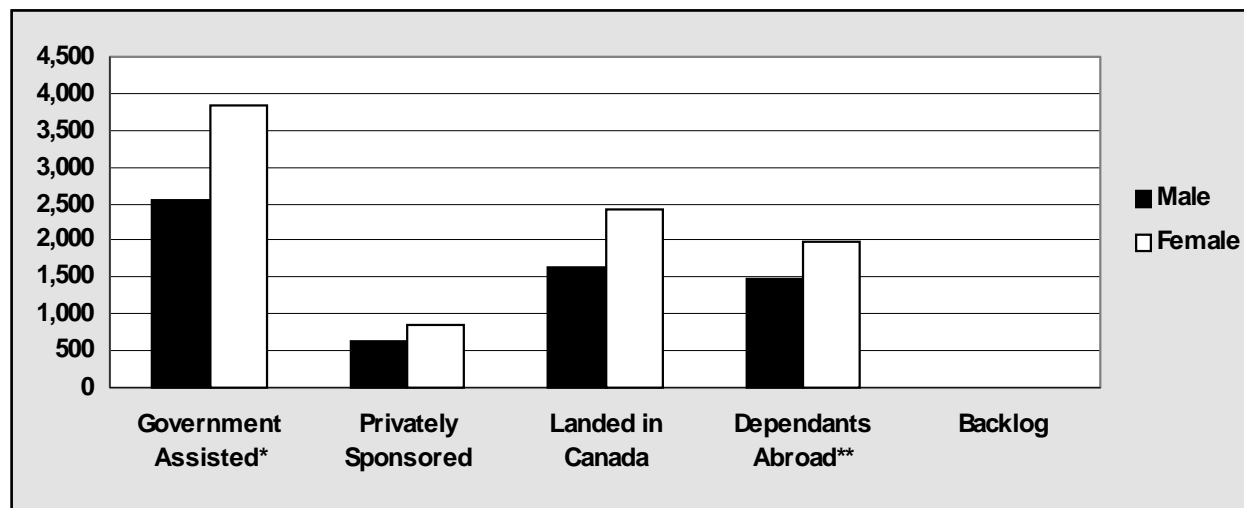

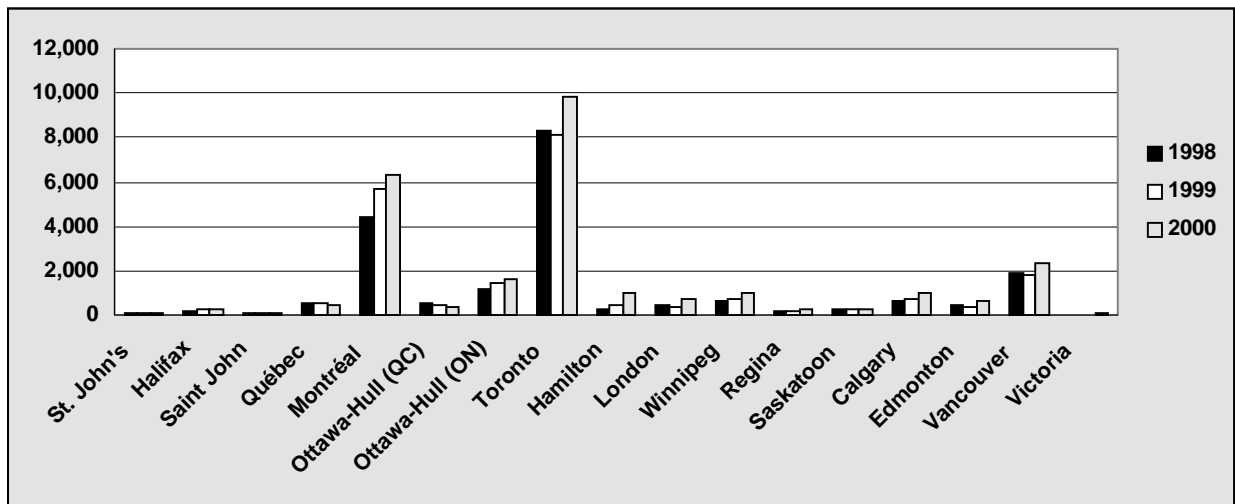

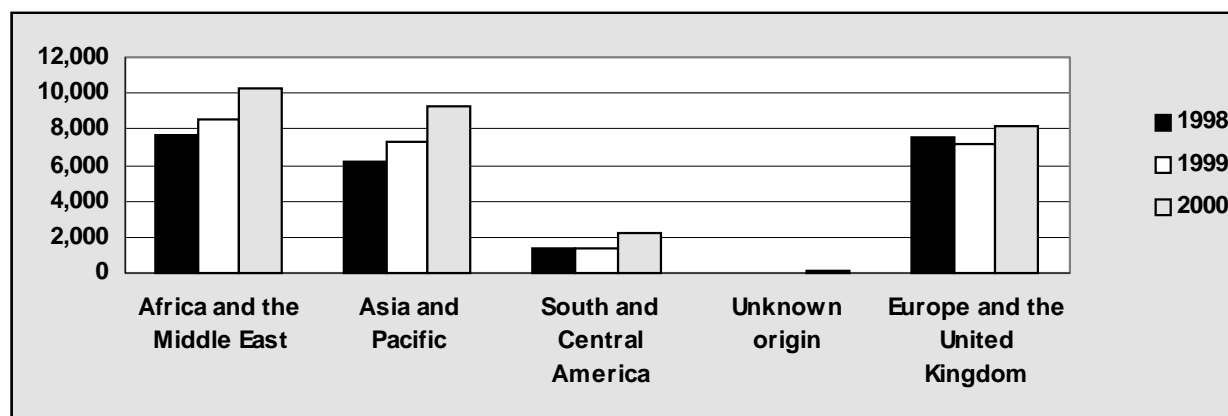

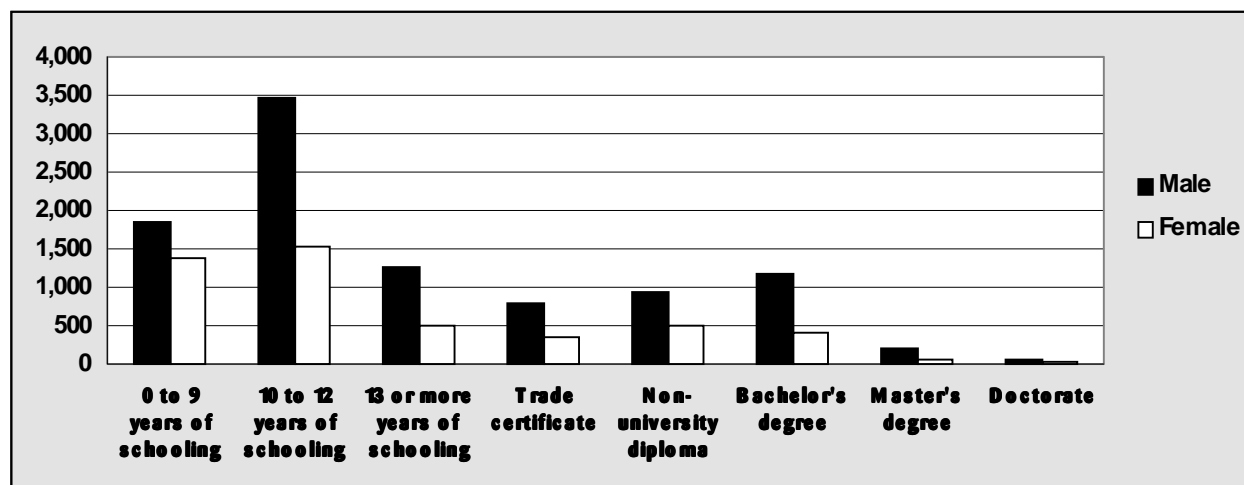

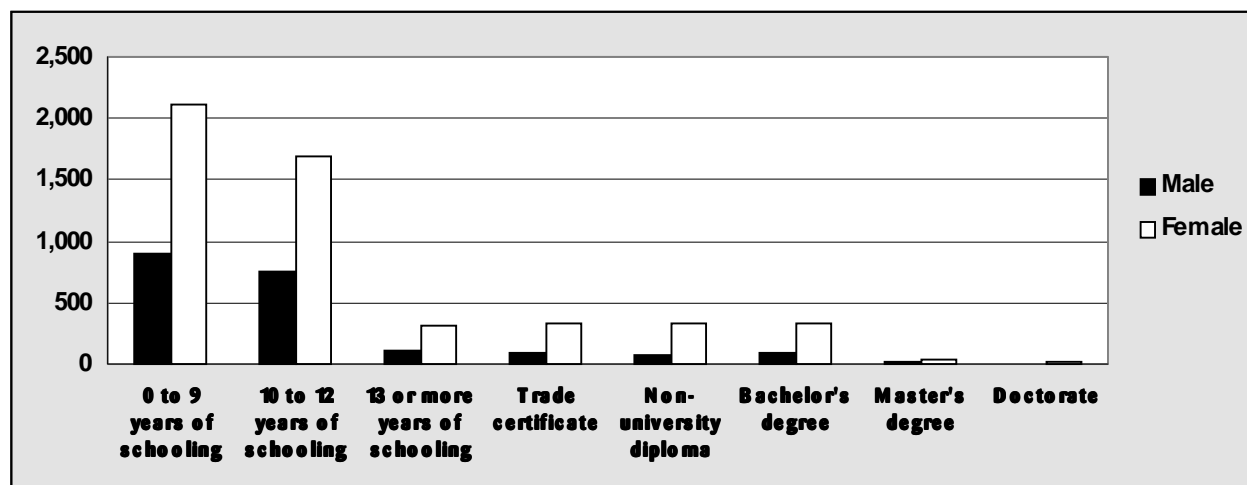

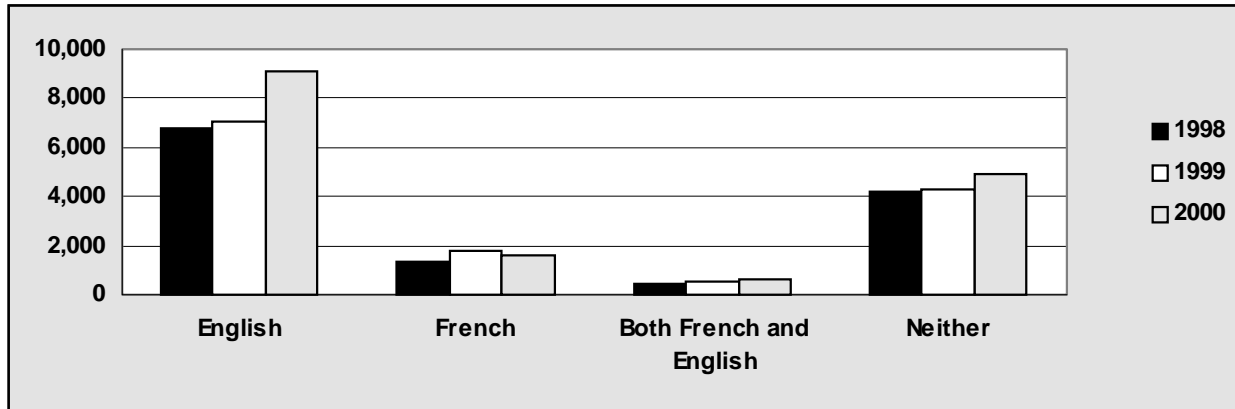

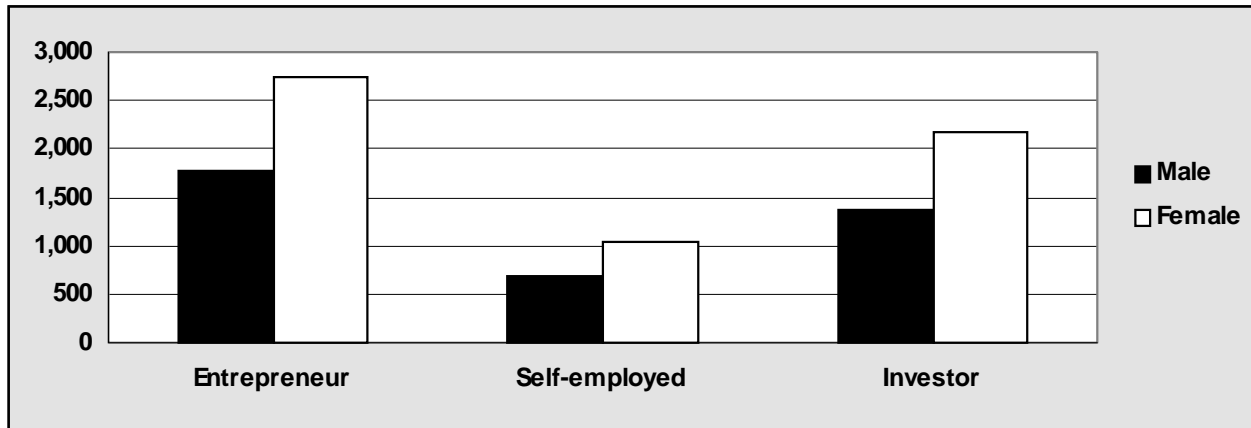

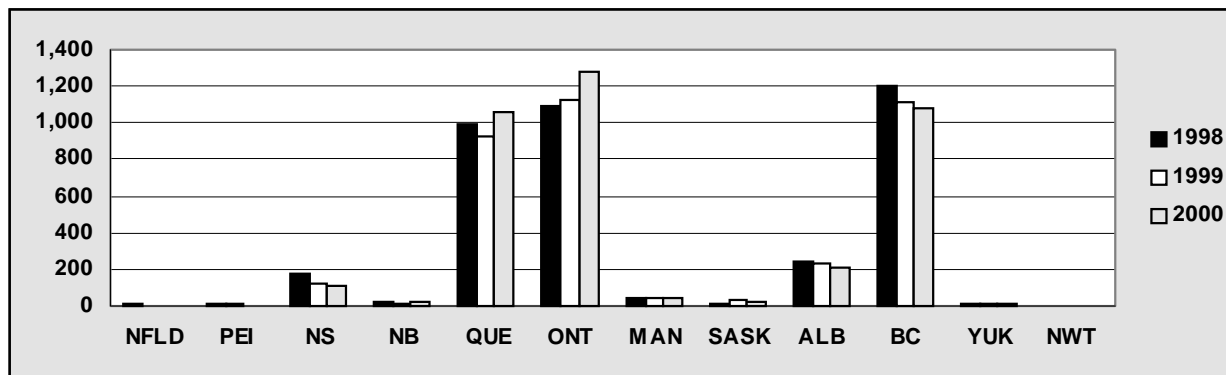

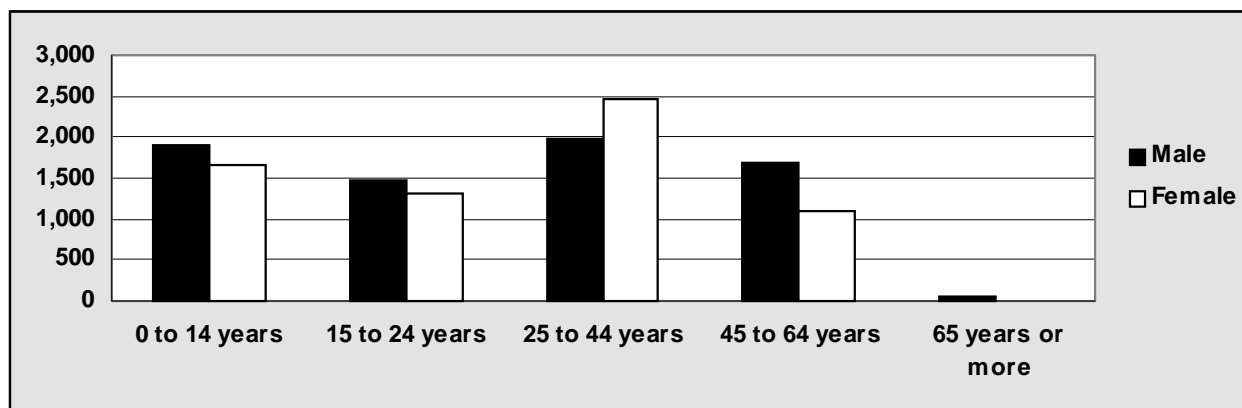

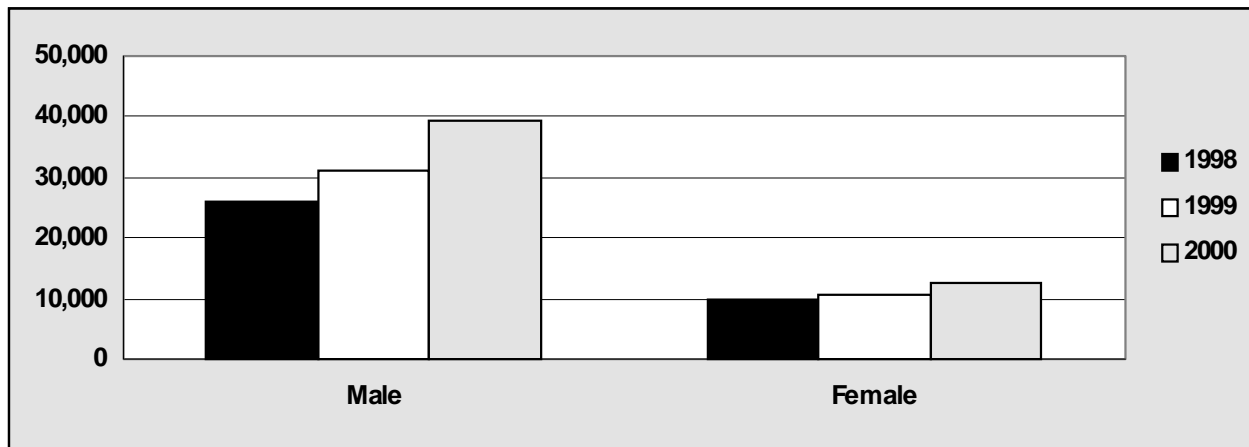

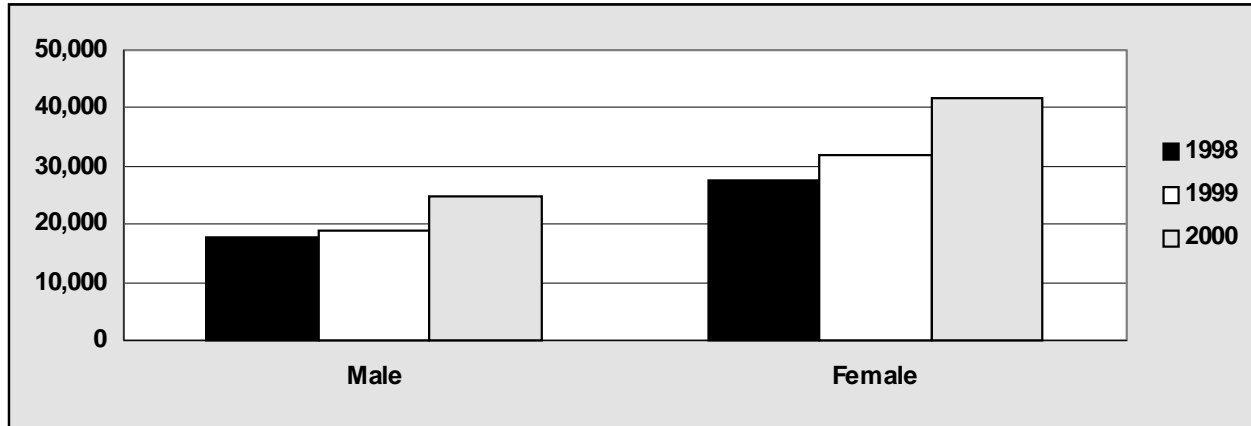

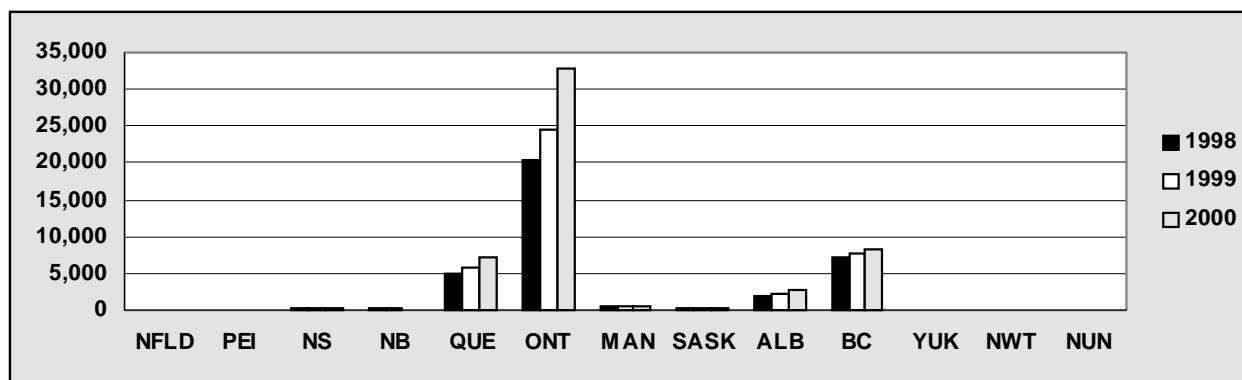

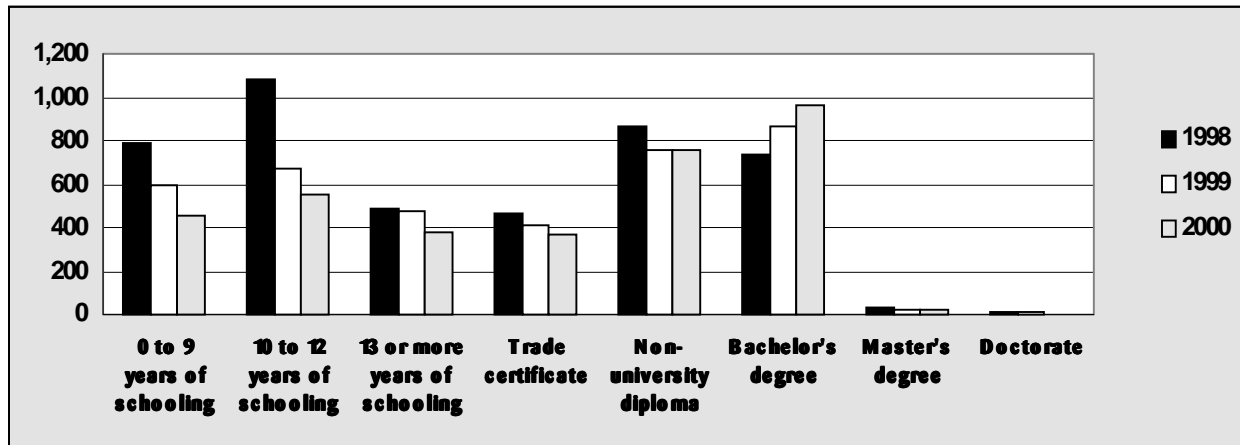

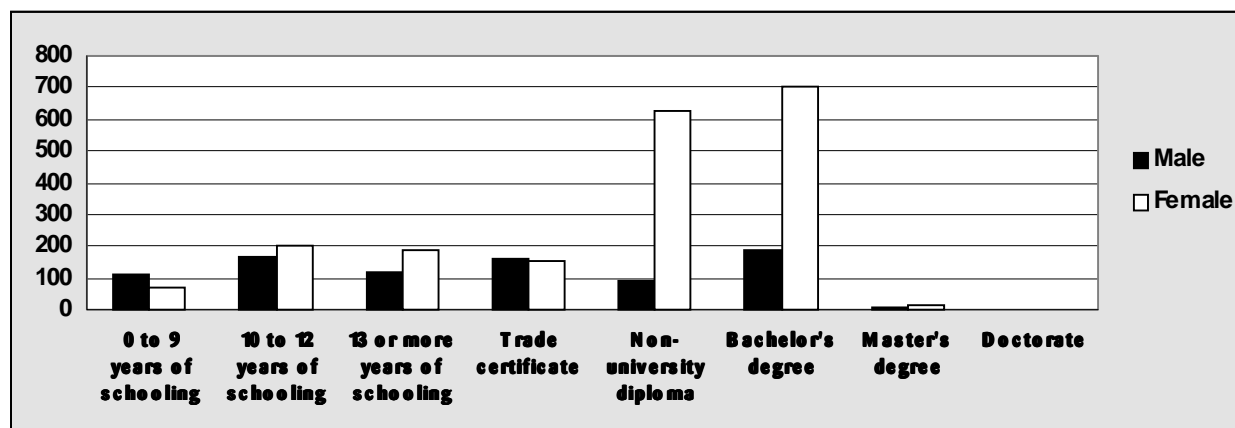

## OTHER CLASS (PRINCIPAL APPLICANTS) BY GENDER AND EDUCATION, 2000



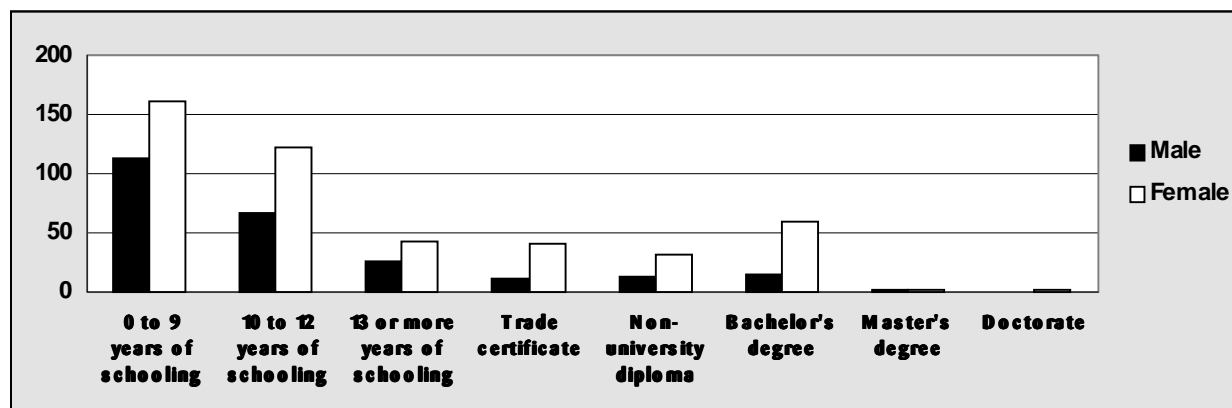

## OTHER CLASS (DEPENDANTS) BY GENDER AND EDUCATION, 2000

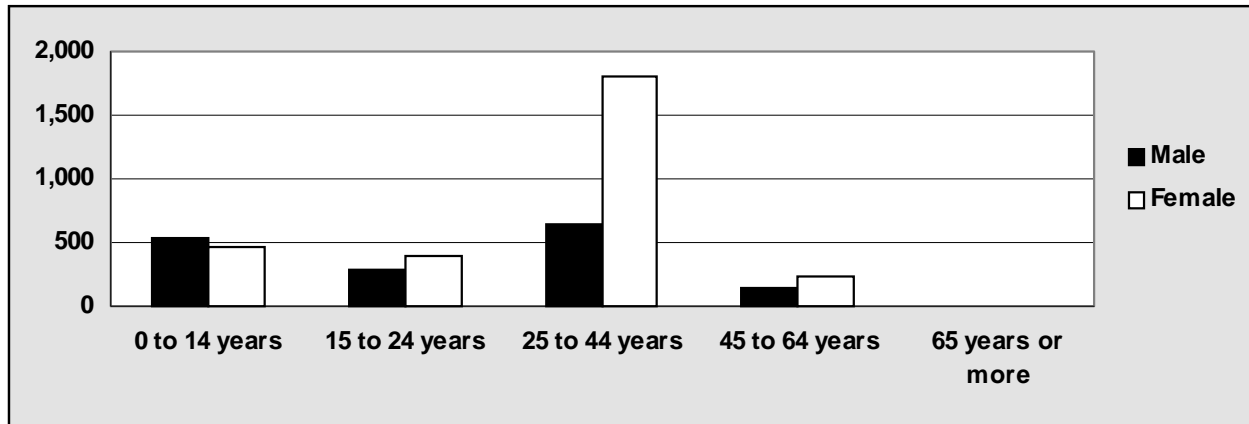

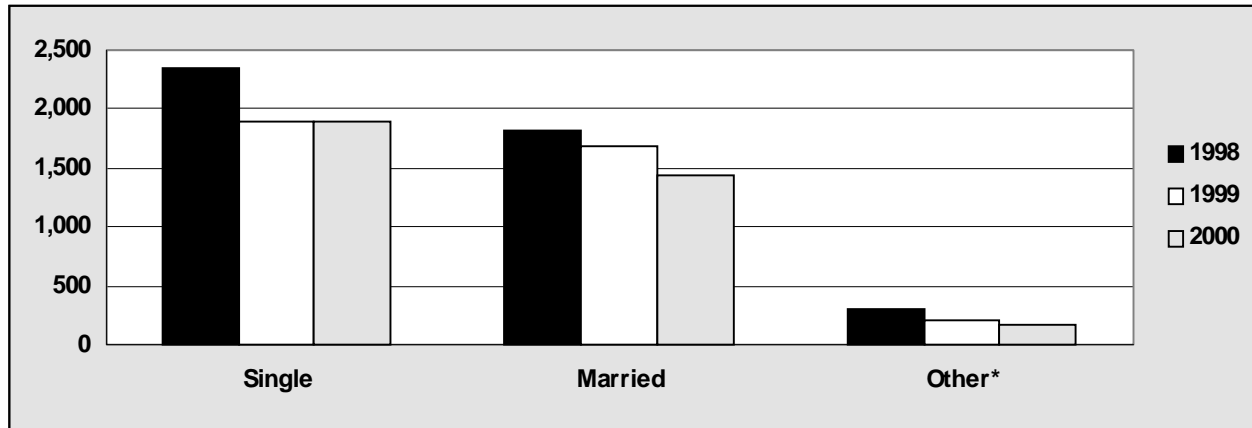

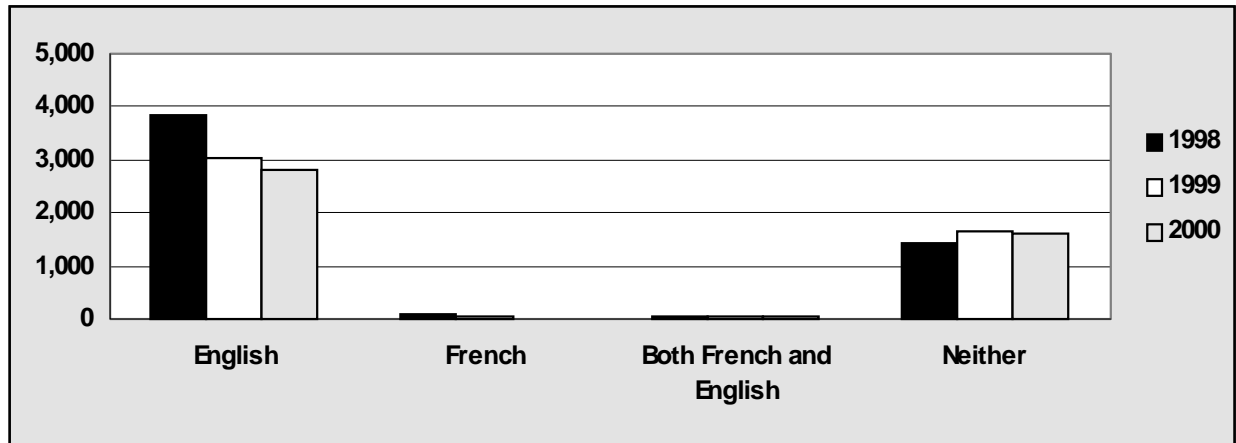

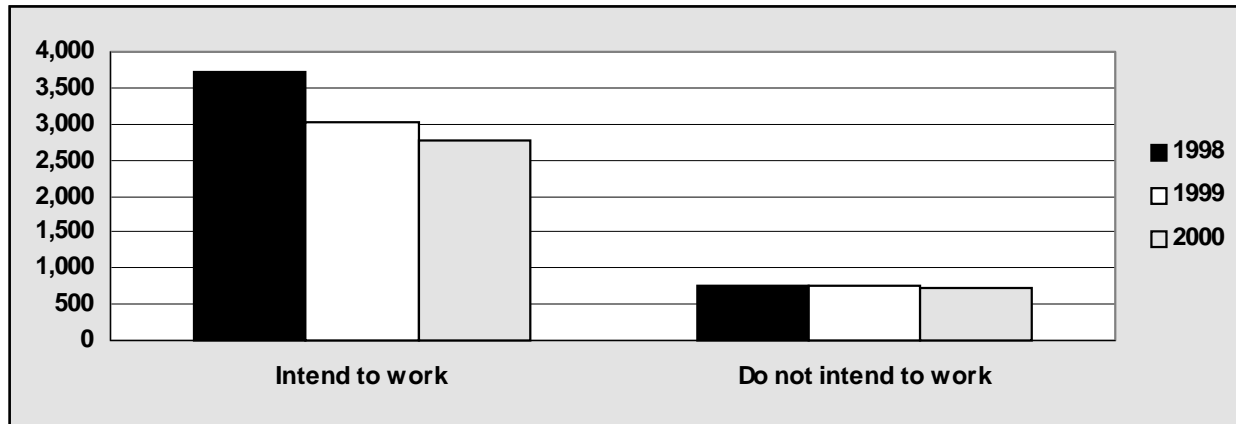

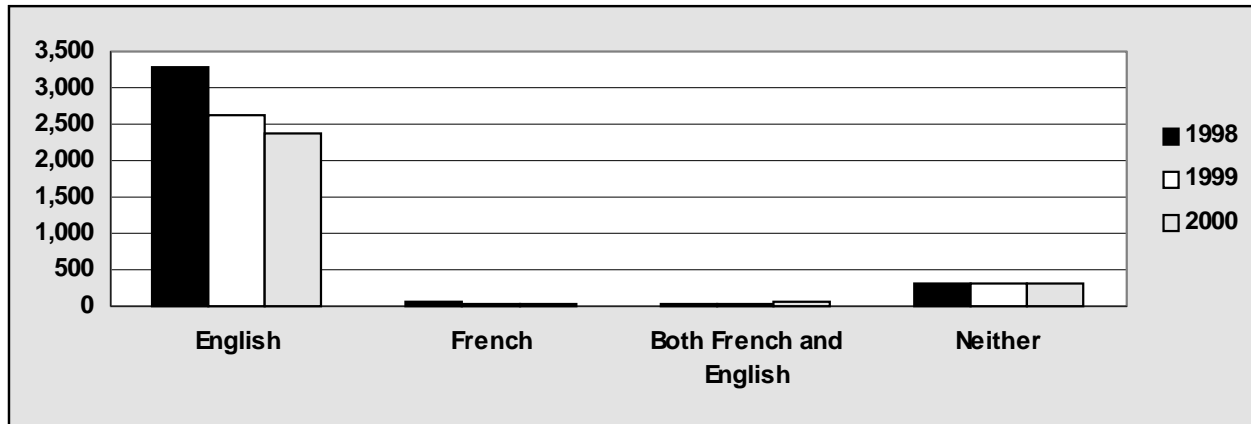
