



PART B

INTERPRETATION/EXPLANATION

This Part provides a narrative explanation of some of the figures appearing on the Statistical Report (Part A). The item numbers which follow correspond to the numbers on the Statistical Report.

I Received During Reporting Period

During the reporting period, the Board received six requests under the *Access to Information Act* and there were no requests outstanding from the previous reporting period.

II Disposition of Requests Completed

For one of the requests received during the reporting period, the Board disclosed only parts of the documents because the remainder were exempt under Section 20(1)(c) of the *Access to Information Act*. For three of the requests, the Board was unable to process, as there were no documents to disclose. One of the requests was completed in part by the Board and then transferred to a department that had a greater interest in the records. With respect to the remaining request, all documents requested were disclosed.

V Completion Time

All six requests were completed within the 30 days specified in the *Access to Information Act*.

IX Fees

A total of \$30.00 was received for the requests submitted during the reporting period.

X Costs

The costs incurred for handling the requests and administrative matters dealing with Access to Information totalled approximately \$2 000 for 60 hours.

The Board estimates that 60 hours equates to 0.03 person year.

PART C

SUPPORTING DOCUMENTATION

I General

The Board is a regulatory tribunal and a court of record. All applications and other documents filed with the Board are public and are readily available for inspection. Since its inception, the Board has maintained its policy of providing information, a) wherever possible, b) on request, and c) promptly.

In addition to providing information on request, the Board has its own program of disseminating information on various aspects of its regulatory functions. This program includes the publication of Information Bulletins, 13 to date, news releases, 43 during the reporting period, an Annual Report, the latest covering calendar year 1999 and an Internet site. The Regulatory Agenda publication has been increased from a quarterly basis to a monthly distribution. The Electronic Board Document System has been discontinued as it was not Y2K compliant, however the information has been made available through the Board's Internet site, www.neb-one.gc.ca.

The provision of information to the public is not new to the Board, and the Board encourages the public to request information informally rather than formally under auspices of the *Access to Information Act*. Although the proclamation of the *Access to Information Act* has had no impact on the standards that the Board has set for itself in its public relations, we have in place measures to administer the Act. These measures are described in the following sections.

II Organization of Access to Information Activities

Activities relating to the *Access to Information Act* are the responsibility of the Secretary of the Board, who has been designated as the Coordinator. He is assisted in his work by the Regulatory Administrator. In addition, one of the Board's Legal Counsel provides advice, as required.

III Implementation of the Access to Information Act

As previously mentioned, the proclamation of the *Access to Information Act* has had little impact on the Board's public relations program or the Board's policy on information dissemination. The only impact has been of an administrative nature: procedures are in place to deal with requests received, staff and management are aware of the requirements of the Act and of the Board's procedures, and one reading room has been designated.

IV Formal/Informal Interface

The Board receives an average of 450 requests for information each month. Approximately 25 percent of these requests are of a complex nature, requiring research and co-ordination with other business units. Such requests are responded to in an average of five working days.

Neither the proclamation of the *Access to Information Act* nor the requests received under the Act have affected the number of informal requests received and disposed of by the Board.

V Institutional Policies

In view of the small number of Access to Information requests received to date, the Board has not had a need to formulate policies specifically dealing with the requirements of the *Access to Information Act* or its Regulations.

VI Delegation Instrument

The Secretary has been designated to exercise the powers and perform the duties and functions of the Chairman as head of a government institution under the Act, except for the power to refuse access to a record requested under the *Access to Information Act*.

A copy of the Designation Order and an Amendment to the Designation Order are attached as Appendix I and Appendix II, respectively.

ACCESS TO INFORMATION ACT DESIGNATION ORDER

The Chairman of the National Energy Board, pursuant to Section 73 of the Access to Information Act* hereby designates the person holding the office of Secretary of the National Energy Board to exercise the powers and perform the duties and functions of the Chairman as head of a government institution under the Act save and except the power to refuse access to a record requested under the Act. Where the Secretary does not intend to give access to a record requested under the Act, he shall refer the request to the Standing Committee on Regulatory Process which Committee shall have the power to grant or refuse access to the record.


ACCESS TO INFORMATION ACT DESIGNATION AMENDMENT ORDER



PART B

INTERPRETATION/EXPLANATION

I Received During Reporting Period

During the reporting period, the Board received three requests under the *Privacy Act* and there were no requests outstanding from the previous reporting period.

II Disposition of Requests Completed

For two of the requests received during the reporting period, the Board disclosed only parts of the documents because the remainder were exempt under Sections 26 and 27 of the *Privacy Act*. With respect to the remaining request, all documents requested were disclosed.

V Completion Time

All three requests were completed within the 30 days specified in the *Privacy Act*.

X Costs

The costs incurred for handling the requests and administrative matters dealing with Privacy requests totalled approximately \$1 000 for 40 hours.

The Board estimates that 40 hours equates to 0.02 person year.

PART C

SUPPORTING DOCUMENTATION

Activities relating to the *Privacy Act* are the responsibility of the Secretary of the Board, who has been designated as the Coordinator. He is assisted in his work by the Regulatory Administrator. In addition, one of the Board's Legal Counsel and a staff member of Personnel are available to provide advice, as required. All the individuals have other responsibilities in addition to those described above.

The Chairman of the Board also delegated to the Secretary the authority to exercise his powers and perform his duties and functions in relation to the *Privacy Act*. This procedure is cited in the Designation Order, a copy of which is attached as Appendix I.

The proclamation of the *Privacy Act* has required the Board to make the appropriate administrative arrangements to deal with requests received. The Board's staff are aware of the requirements of the *Privacy Act* and the procedures to follow in order to handle all requests appropriately.
