We have adopted a new e-business framework to ensure that your information is protected and that e-business transactions are with authorized filers only. Government standards assure that the information passed through the web form will be more secure than faxing.

## How to become an Authorized Filer

- 1. Have a manager from your organization complete the Authorized Filer Form (see **Annex C**) when applying for an export order.
- 2. Once the NEB has enter your information in the NEB's system, you will receive the following emails:



## How to register for an Epass - 5 min

- 1. Open your web browser. To access the NEB's My Account service, go to <u>http://www.neb-one.gc.ca/CommodityStatistics</u>
- 2. Click on the "My Account via epass" link under Filing Commodity Forms.
- 3. The first time you may see one or more similar notices, click Always each time.



**Note**: As you are transferred to the epass site, a browser check is run to ensure your system is compatible. Should you encounter a problem, call your IT staff and give them the **Annex A** - Browser Configuration.





4. Since this is your first time, you must register for an epass. Click "Register"



# **Annex A – Browser Configuration**

The NEB has adopted epass, a Government of Canada service, to provide secure access to online services and enhanced security to protect your information. When conducting online transactions with the Government of Canada, your epass will act as your secure electronic signature. Your epass is a unique electronic credential and is used to electronically sign your transactions. You can use the same epass with different computers, provided they are connected to the Internet and use a browser that meets the technical requirements.

You will need an Internet connected computer running a browser that must:

- support 128-bit encryption;
- have SSL 3.0 enabled;
- have Cookies enabled;
- have JavaScript enabled; and
- have a running Java Virtual Machine (JVM);
  - Micosoft JVM; or
  - Sun JVM 1.4.2\_03 or later.

Since over 95% of our filers use Microsoft Internet Explorer 6.x, we have provided configuration information on the next page. The epass Canada service can be used by other browsers provided that minimal JVM versions and configuration requirements are met and the browser used is not specifically restricted as a result of security concerns. If your browser or browser configuration is not compatible you can:

- Upgrade or change the configuration of your browser (note: you may require the assistance of a network administrator);
- Set-up a stand alone computer that is compatible;
- Or contact the NEB to discuss other options.

## Configuring Microsoft Internet Explorer 6.x

- Windows NT 4 with Service Pack 4 and higher;
- Windows 2000 Professional Service Pack 3 and higher;
- Windows Millennium Edition;
- Windows XP Home edition; and
- Windows XP Professional.

### Enabling SSL 3.0

- From the Tools menu, choose Internet Options;
- Select Advanced tab;
- Scroll down to Security;
- Select Use SSL 3.0;
- Click the Apply button; and
- Restart your computer for the new settings to take effect.

### **Enabling Cookies**

- From the Tools menu, choose Internet Options;
- Select **Privacy** tab
- Click the "Advanced" button;
- Check the box "Override automatic cookie handling" under the Cookies panel;
- Check the box "Always allow session cookies"; and
- Click the OK button twice to exit.

### **Enabling Java**

### Enabling JavaScript (Active Scripting)

- From the Tools menu, choose Internet Options;
- Select **Security** tab;
- Select Custom Level;
- Scroll down to Scripting:
  - under Active Scripting select Enable; and
  - under Scripting for Java Applets select Enable.
  - Click the OK button twice to exit; and
- Close your browser for the new settings to take effect.

## About Cookies

A Cookie is a small piece of information that is downloaded to your computer and is used by your browser. epass Canada cookies will only exist as long as your browser is open and you are logged into epass Canada. The Cookies are required to navigate you through forms in the language of your choice and to confirm that you are a user who has logged in with a valid epass.


## About Java Virtual Machine (JVM)

To help you use our services, epass Canada uses "JVM" technology that is active only while you are online. A Java Virtual Machine must be enabled to allow your epass to function properly and perform key security operations such as signing and encrypting transactions.

**What is a JVM?** The Java Virtual Machine (JVM) is a specific type of software program written to process Java instructions. Many software applications use the Java programming language to take advantage of its advanced features. A JVM is not a stand-alone program; it is part of the Sun Java 2 Runtime Environment (JRE).

Where can I download the proper JRE? Please visit SUN's Java.com download page, select the appropriate Java Runtime Environment for your operating system and follow the instructions provided. If you are attempting this download on a public or corporate computer, there may be restrictions in place that may prevent you from doing so. If you require technical assistance, your network administrator can assist you.







# Annex B – Frequently Asked Questions

### What is epass Canada?

epass Canada provides a fast and easy way to securely access Government services via the Internet. For more information, see <u>https://blrscr3.egs-seg.gc.ca/faq/aboutepass\_e.html</u>

### What is an epass enabled Service?

An epass enabled Service is an online Government of Canada service that uses epass Canada to provide enhanced security to protect your information.

### I already have a Government of Canada epass.

If you already have a Government of Canada epass and would like to use it to access the NEB's My Account service, go to <u>http://www.neb-one.gc.ca/CommodityStatistics</u>, click on the "**My Account via epass**" link under Filing Commodity Forms and log in using your epass User ID and Password.

### How do I change my User ID, Change my Password or Revoke my epass?

To change your Password or User ID, or Revoke your epass follow these steps:

- 1. At the epass Canada "Log In or Register" page, enter your epass User ID and Password.
- 2. At the "epass Canada Welcome" page, click on the "Manage My epass" button.
- 3. At the "Manage My epass" page, select the appropriate link to modify your epass.

### Can I register for a Government of Canada epass for someone else?

No, you must register for your own epass. You must not share your codes, epass User ID or password with other to ensure the security of the system.

### I am having problems accessing the epass Canada site.

This could mean that your browser's software doesn't meet the security standards. See Annex A to verify the settings of your browser. You can also visit the Frequently Asked Questions at the **epass Canada** site for additional information concerning browsers.

If you have made the necessary changes to meet the browser requirements but still cannot access the registration process, please contact the Government of Canada **epass Client Service Centre at 1-866-EPASS-GC (1-866-372-7742).** The teletypewriter (TTY) number is 1-866-330-1890.

### I cannot access the site. Can I send my Commodity Forms by email, fax or mail?

No. As of October 2005 the NEB will only accept forms filed on-line. The NEB does not correspond by email. This is not a secure method to transmit sensitive information to us. If you cannot use the service online, you will have to call us at 1-866-393-8533.

### Why do I need a Government of Canada epass to access My Account?

With epass and My Account, you can access systems that require more security, like Commodity Forms for Propane and Butanes. The security and protection of your confidential information is the NEB's highest priority when offering services over the Internet. In order to achieve this, we have created My Account and included registering for a Government of Canada epass. Once the NEB identifies that you need to use My Account, you will receive an email with an Activation Code, which is valid for seven (7) days. You may also receive an Authorization Code to access specific programs, like Commodity Forms for Propane and Butanes.

### How do I register for a Government of Canada epass to access My Account?

To access the services under My Account for the **first time** you will be asked to register for a Government of Canada epass. This registration process is done in three steps and you will be required to provide some information as "shared secrets". Once you have completed the registration process, you will be able to access My Account and other NEB online services by simply logging in, using your **epass** User ID and Password.

### Do I have to accept the security message?

epass Canada uses a signed applet from Entrust Limited. This applet has been designed to enhance security. When you encounter the security message shown below, please click on "Always". Selecting "Always" means you will never encounter this message again. If you select "Yes" instead, you will be prompted to reply to this security message every time you enter this site. If you click "No", you will not be able to register for an epass or use the My Account online service.



### I do not have an Activation Code because I either lost or did not receive it.

If you do not have an Activation Code for the reasons stated above, call the NEB at 1-866-393-8533.

#### I have tried to enter my information and it did not work.

You may have tried to enter your information when the system was not available. If you continue to experience difficulties during our available hours of service, call the NEB at 1-866-393-8533. Please note that the Activation Code **expires after 7 days**. Be sure to follow the instructions before the code expires; otherwise you will have to obtain a new Activation Code and re-register.

# My Account - First Time User Guide

### What is a cookie?

A "cookie" is a small piece of information sent to your computer by a Web site and used by your browser. It contains settings (such as language preference) to help you use our services. There are two types of cookies: "session cookies" and "persistent cookies".

- A "session cookie" is used only during the browser session. It expires when the user closes the browser and it is not stored on your hard-drive.
- A "persistent cookie" is placed on your computer and will remain on your hard-drive for a specific period of time, unless you remove it. Some Web sites use persistent cookies to store information that can be used when you visit the site again. NEB My Account and epass Canada does not use persistent cookies.

### I don't want to set my cookies to "on". Can I still use this service?

One of the ways we ensure that you continue to be identified and that we send the correct information during your online session is by using cookies. Right now, we have no other session management method for users who prefer not to accept browser cookies. If you don't accept cookies, you won't be able to use this service.

### What can I do to ensure my security after an online session?

It is important to clear your browser's cache, or close and reopen your browser after an online session to stop someone from being able to view your information later. Most browsers conceal or cache images or files that you have viewed and store them locally to improve performance. Some browsers have an option to not cache encrypted sessions.

### What if I don't have 128-bit encryption on my browser?

For security purposes you will need 128-bit Secure Sockets Layer (SSL 3.0) encryption on your browser to use this service. See **Annex A** for more information.

#### Why can I bookmark some pages and not others?

You cannot bookmark pages that are epass-enabled. To access the NEB's My Account service, go to <u>http://www.neb-one.gc.ca/CommodityStatistics</u>, click on the "My Account via epass" link under Filing Commodity Forms and log in using your epass User ID and Password.
