- Sponsored by EC, DFO, CEAA, provinces of NB and NS
- 85 participants various federal departments,
   NB and NS provincial governments,
   municipal representatives
- Need for session driven by two concurrent EAs of proposed LNG projects in NB and NS

- Representatives from several US Agencies and institutes shared their experience and expertise in managing safety, security and environmental issues associated with LNG:
  - US Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC)
  - US Coast Guard
  - State of Massachusetts Energy Facility Siting Board
  - State of Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries
  - Institute for Energy, Law and Enterprise (IELE), University of Houston

- FERC arranged visit to Cove Point, Maryland LNG facility (EC, NBDELG, NB Dept. of Public Safety, NRCan, City of Saint John Fire Dept.)
- Follow-up meetings with FERC officials in Washington, DC

#### **Outcomes/Observations**

- Important contacts and information exchange networks established
- Desire for more information sessions/workshops as projects advance
- Higher comfort level dealing with issues and addressing public/proponent concerns

#### **Outcomes/Observation**

- Recognition of knowledge gaps especially in relation to LNG behaviour
- Some concern expressed with regulatory capacity and gaps in Canada

- LNG projects in NB (Irving Oil-Repsol) and NS (Anadarko) have completed federal and provincial EA processes

  - British Columbia (2)
