

# **Regulatory Decision Document**

## **Tebufenozide Insecticide (Confirm<sup>®</sup> 240F)**

The active ingredient tebufenozide and the formulated product Confirm<sup>®</sup> 240F (registration number 24503) that contains tebufenozide, for the control of larval Lepidoptera in apple orchards in Canada, have been granted full registration pursuant to Section 13 of the Pest Control Products (PCP) Regulations.

This decision document outlines this stage in the regulatory decision-making process of the Pest Management Regulatory Agency (PMRA) for the use of tebufenozide and Confirm<sup>®</sup> 240F agricultural insecticide on apples.

### 1.0 Introduction

This decision document outlines this stage in the PMRA's regulatory decision-making process for the use of tebufenozide and Confirm<sup>®</sup> 240F agricultural insecticide on apples.

### 2.0 Background

The PMRA has carried out an assessment of available information in accordance with Section 9 of the PCP Regulations and has found it sufficient, pursuant to Section 18.b, to allow a determination of the safety, merit, and value of tebufenozide and Confirm<sup>®</sup> 240F, manufactured by Rohm and Haas Canada Inc. The PMRA has concluded that the use of Confirm<sup>®</sup> 240F in accordance with the label directions has merit and value consistent with Section 18.c of the PCP Regulations and does not entail an unacceptable risk of harm pursuant to Section 18.d.

This product was proposed for registration in the proposed regulatory decision document PRDD96-01 *Tebufenozide* to control significant economic pests such as codling moth and various species of leafrollers in apple orchards. No comments were received on PRDD96-01.

### 3.0 Regulatory decision

Based on the considerations outlined above, the PMRA has granted full registration, pursuant to Section 13 of the PCP Regulations, for the use of Confirm<sup>®</sup> 240F on apples.
