Conditional Registrations

Registrant Training Session
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Former System

- Section 17 of PCPA: Temp registration granted to December 31 of year in which registration is issued
- Application to extend temp registration must be made each year
- > Application to convert to full registration





Conditional Registrations

- Section 12 of new PCPA:
 - "The Minister may, by delivering a notice in writing, require a registrant:
 - (a) to compile information, conduct tests and monitor experience with the pest control product for the purpose of obtaining information with respect to its effects on human health and safety or the environment or with respect to its value; and
 - (b) to report the additional information to the Minister within the time and in the form specified in the notice."





Section 12 Notice

- Section 12 notice is issued for a registration requiring submission of confirmatory data
- A Section 12 notice may be delivered pursuant to an application to register or amend, or as a result of a re-evaluation/special review decision
- Section 12 notice triggers the conditional registration regulations only for applications to register or amend
- Issuance of a Section 12 notice for a re-evaluation or special review decision creates a registration with conditions, **not** a conditional registration
- Section 12 notice is linked to registration decision
- Section 12 notice will accompany the registration letter and certificate of registration
- Section 12 notice invokes conditions of registration which, if not complied with, may result in cancellation of registration





Conditional Registration Regulations

Section 14 of the Pest Control Product Regs:

- Validity period of up to 3 years [Section14(1)(a)]
- Delays [Section 14(1)(b)]:
 - Consultation, where applicable
 - Reconsideration
 - Placing of test data in the register
- Does not delay placing of evaluation reports in the register
- Delays consultation until completion of an application to convert to full registration, or an application to renew (if conversion not received in specified time frame)





Conditional Registration Regulations

- Expanded scope of Section 14
 - Associated products [Section15(1)]
 - Applies to any product that contains an active ingredient for which a Section 12 notice has been delivered
 - Associated active ingredients [Section 15(2)]
 - Applies to any active ingredient contained only in an end use product for which a Section 12 notice has been delivered





Transition Provisions Conditional Registrations

- Approximately 270 temp registrations
- Sections 73(3) and 73(4) of Regulations address transition of temporary to conditional
- Open B.4.1 sub...administratively transition to conditional registration
- No open B.4.1 sub...registrant must make an application to register
- No requirement to consult under Section 28(1), but will continue to consult by policy (approximately 40 consultations)






Validity Period

- Should reflect the time required to generate the required data, and may be up to 3 years following the year in which the registration is granted
- Automatic extension for up to 2 years to allow for review of application to convert to full registration
- May be extended for consultation
- Validity period is linked to the product registration, ie. Expiry date for subsequent amendments may not extend beyond the validity period initially established
- Applications to convert to full, or renew conditional registration must be received prior to the end of the product validity period, ie. 3 months before expiry date
 - otherwise re-instatement required with consultation
