GHS Overview

- Harmonized criteria for classifying substances and mixtures according to their health, environmental and physical hazards

- Harmonized hazard communication elements, including requirements for labelling and safety data sheets



GHS Overview – cont'd

- All chemicals affected
- Symbols will change
- Criteria for triggering symbols & signal words will change



GHS Update

CANADA:

- **Situational Analysis document**
- **GHS workshop October 15 with all sectors**
- **Pesticides Sectoral Working Group being formed – representation from wide range of stakeholders**

UNITED STATES:

- **Government lead for GHS being determined; EPA assessing implications for pesticides**

MEXICO:

- **Government lead for GHS being determined; COFEPRIS assessing implications for pesticides**



Some GHS Implementation Issues - Pesticides

- Harmonization/Coordination
- Resources (Industry & Gov't)
- Implementation mechanism & timing
- Need for Education
- Consultation process
- Classification criteria



NAFTA Involvement

- Three governments prepared to collaborate; beginning to explore full implications of GHS for pesticides, from a regulatory perspective
