Current PMRA reporting

• As part of Health Canada:

- Estimates process, including Report on Plans and Priorities
- Departmental Progress Report at same time as Public Accounts
- Prepared for each Fiscal Year (April 1-March 31)
- EMAC reporting
 - Report on submissions
 - Financial updates
- PMRA Strategic Plan



Health Canada Reporting

Estimates Process

- Health Canada's Report on Plans and Priorities tabled with Estimates (February before the Fiscal Year begins)
- Business plan for Health Canada
- Pest Management is one section of the plan.
- Planned results are stated along with activities to reach the results.
- Example:
 - Planned result: "Open, transparent and participatory regulatory process."
 - Activity: "Propose to replace the PCPA with a new Act to modernize the legal foundation for managing risks and strengthen public involvement."



Health Canada Reporting

Public accounts process

- Departmental Performance Report prepared to outline accomplishments and expenditures (late summer – fall after Fiscal Year ends)
- Annual report for Health Canada
- Pest Management is one section of the report
- Actual results are reported, based on the plan
- Example:
 - Reported the "Bill C-53, the proposed new *Pest Control Products Act*, ... was introduced in the House of Commons on March 21, 2002..."

- New plan in preparation.



EMAC reporting

Regular reporting of:

- Submission statistics
- OECD/NAFTA activity and joint reviews
- Financial information for PMRA (planned and actual expenditures according to PMRA business lines)
 - new product evaluation
 - registered product evaluation
 - compliance, including enforcement
 - sustainable pest management
 - business line improvement.
- Reports available on website.
