# PMRA Re-Evaluation Program

- Regulatory Directive DIR2001-03
- 4 Programs (1) EPA REDs, (2) PMRA Review, (3)
  FQPA, (4) Special Review
- Builds on international assessments
- Decisions at or near same time frame as EPA, harmonized where possible





## **Re-Evaluation Includes:**

- The Aggregate non-occupational exposure from a (single) pesticide
- The cumulative effects from (a number of) pesticides with a common mechanism of toxicity.
- Consideration of increased susceptibility to infants and children, or other sensitive subpopulations, from exposure to the pesticide.





#### **Re-Evaluation Priorities**

- Pesticides used on foods
- Opportunities for joint work with EPA /availability of international reviews
- Canadian specific priorities





#### **Re-Evaluation Timelines**

- 401 Actives registered prior to 1995
- EPA target is 2006 for food use chemicals and 2008 for non food uses
- PMRA timelines linked to those of EPA

- Workplan for March 2003 to June 2004 published (REV 2003-08)
- Identifies Actives by Programs 1-4 for which will publish as RevNote, PACR, RRD, Risk Assessment
- Workplan for March 2004 June 2005 in publication process
- Summary of 2003-2004 in publication process





## Harmonization

- 2 NAFTA Projects to ensure coordination
- Cooperative Re-evaluation of HDWP
- Coordination of Re-evaluation/ Reregistration activities
  - monthly conference calls
  - ongoing science discussions
  - "FQPA" documents
- MRLs





# **PMRA Additional Activities**

- PMRA participates in USEPA Registration Review meetings
- PMRA May 19, 2004 Meeting on Management of Reevaluation Outcomes
- Quarterly Meeting conference call of stakeholders
- Ad hoc working group to work on transition issues e.g., Azinphos methyl





# **Decision Making Framework**

 Integrated science based decisions based on principles of risk assessment and risk management and consistent with Agency's Decision Framework





## **Re-evaluation Outcomes**

#### Mitigations

- Application rate: limit number of applications
- Establish re-entry intervals
- Invoke product stewardship
- Re-classification commercial to restricted
- Monitoring data
- Label Improvement
- Buffer Zones
- Identification of data requirements





## **Re-evaluation Outcomes (cont'd)**

- Engineering Mitigation
  - Personal Protective equipment
  - Closed systems
  - Ventilation requirements
  - Packaging modifications
  - Reformulation
- Discontinuation/Cancellation
  - Discontinue certain (or all) uses

## **New PCPA**

- Provisions of new PCPA strengthen legislative foundation for Re-evaluation program
- Must initiate re-evaluation for products for which last major decision made 15 years + 1 year ago prior to April 1, 2005
- 15 year cyclical review
- Provisions for Special Reviews







- PMRA re-evaluation program builds on International assessments where possible
- Decisions at or near the same time as EPA, harmonized where possible.
