Pest Control Products Sales Information Reporting Regulations

New Pest Control Products Act

- Registrants must record, retain and report information on sales (subsection 8(5))
 - in form and manner directed by Minister
 - in accordance with regulations
 - condition of registration
 - applies to former registrants

Update

- Comments on Discussion Document reviewed
- Changes made to proposed regulation:
 - estimates permitted for 5 years
 - "emergency situation" clarified and time limit for providing available information increased to 15 days
- Proposed regulation published in *Canada Gazette* Part I for a 75 day comment period (ends June 10)



Proposed Regulations

- Registrants must report quantity of each product available for sale to users in each province
 - by June, for previous calendar year
- Estimates permitted for first five years
- Minister has authority to require audit of data
- Registrants must provide available information within 15 days in an emergency



What to Report

End-use products

• Report, for each province, the sum of the quantity:

- sold by registrant to vendors and users
- sold by registrant to distributors dealing in only one province
- sold by regional and national distributors to vendors and users (estimate permitted)
- made available for sale to users as treated feed, treated seed or fertilizer-pesticides (estimate permitted)



What to Report

Active ingredients & manufacturing concentrates

• Report each of the quantity:

- sold by registrant to purchasers outside Canada
- sold by registrant to manufacturers of pesticides, treated feed or fertilizers-pesticides in each province
- made available for sale to users as treated feed or fertilizer-pesticides in each province (estimate permitted)



Reporting Requirements

Report must include:

- name, address, telephone number of registrant and person making report, if different
- date
- calendar year covered
- name and registration number of pest control product
- signed statement certifying that report is true and complete



Estimates

- Sales by regional and national distributors
- Quantities made available in form of treated feed, treated seed and fertilizer-pesticides
- Report must indicate:
 - quantity reported is an estimate
 - methodology used
 - why methodology is appropriate



When to Report

- By June 1, for previous calendar year
- Within 15 days, if requested by Minister to respond to a situation that endangers human health or safety or the environment or to make a decision under the Act
 - available information



Other Requirements

- Registrants must retain original records and supporting data for 6 years and submit on request
 for verification and auditing
- Minister may require an audited report
 - must be reasonable grounds to believe original report was not accurate or complete
 - must be submitted within 60 days
 - does not apply to initial or emergency reports



Sales Information Reports

- Sales information for each pest control product would be kept confidential within the PMRA
 - could be shared, *in confidence*, with other federal and provincial departments
- Sales information for each active ingredient would be made available to public
 - consolidation of more than one active ingredient when necessary to prevent calculation of monetary value of sales
