## Sustainable Development

#### Definition

"Sustainable development is meeting the needs of the present without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their own needs (World Commission on Environment and Development, 1987. Our Common Future, Oxford: Oxford University Press)"

## Sustainable Development

### Interpretation

Integrating environmental, social/cultural and economic factors in decision-making to ensure quality of life

Commitment to equity

#### Auditor General Act

#### Amendments (1995)

Establish the position of Commissioner of the Environment and Sustainable Development (CESD) within Office of the Auditor General

Require each federal Department to prepare Sustainable Development Strategy (SDS)

Require SDS to be tabled in Parliament by December 1997 and updated every 3

## Economic

Cabinet-mandated program for reform of the pest management regulatory system includes:

Support integration of pest management with broader goals of environmental sustainability

Increase access to pest management strategies that reduce risk of harm to human health, safety and the environment Support development of sustainable systems that reduce need for traditional pest control products

PMRA Strategic Plan for 1998-2003

The first of three key objectives:

"to protect health, safety and the environment from the risks of pesticides through the use of sound, progressive science, including innovative approaches to sustainable pest management"

### Sustainable Pest Management

Economically viable

Meets society's needs for human health protection, food and fibre production and resource utilization

Conserves or enhances natural resources and the quality of the environment for future generations

The Department plans to:
