MINOR USE

A necessary use of a pest control product for which the anticipated volume of sales is not sufficient to persuade a manufacturer to register and sell the product in Canada

TWO STREAMS FOR MINOR USE APPLICATIONS

- , User Requested Minor Use Registration (URMUR)
 - Regulatory Directive 1999-05
- User Requested Minor Use Label Expansion (URMULE)
 - Regulatory Directive 2001-01

URMUR

- To facilitate the registration of products, including biopesticides, that are registered in the US or other OECD countries, that due to potential low volume of sales might never be registered
- Use of acceptable foreign reviews to help ensure that the evaluation of URMUR applications is as efficient as possible.

URMUR - Some Eligibility Criteria

- Active ingredient registered in the US or in another OECD country but not registered in Canada
- Registration in other OECD country must be less than 5 years old to ensure adequacy of the database and availability of foreign reviews
- No previously identified health and environmental safety concerns
- Provision of foreign reviews from OECD countries along with supporting data

URMUR - Initial Steps

- , Need identified by sponsor / user group and supported by P/T minor use coordinator
- , Collaboration Manufacturer / Sponsor
- , Presubmission consultation encouraged
- , Manufacturer submits application and serves as liaison between sponsor and PMRA
 - submission for the TGAI and at least one EP

URMULE

- Considers expansion of a label for a new minor use of a pesticide provided:
 - The active ingredient and the end-use product are registered in Canada;
 - The registrant is willing to add the new use to the EP Label;
 - Sufficient information to assess safety, merit and value of the proposed new use.

URMULE - Initial Steps

- , Need identified by users
- Application by Sponsor / User group and supported by Registrant and P/T MU coordinator
- , PMRA Presubmission consultation to verify that criteria are met and to identify data requirements
- Sponsor submits data in response to presubmission consultation

MINOR USE - SOME OBSERVATIONS (1)

- , A cooperative effort
 - Users
 - Registrants
 - Researchers
 - Provinces / Territory
 - Sectoral Departments
 - PMRA

MINOR USE - SOME OBSERVATIONS (2)

- Presubmission consultation
- Quality and completeness of submission
- Focus on newer products
- Joint review
 - Joint review and minor uses
 - Minor use joint review

JOINT REVIEW AND MINOR USES

- , Increased number of joint review submissions
- , Include a number of minor uses
- , Great benefits level playing field including for minor uses

MINOR USE JOINT REVIEW

- Pilot identified
- Criteria same as for other JRs e.g.: active assessed under FQPA; same label, same use, same formulation, same crop, same pests, same gap: sufficient data
- , level playing field for minor uses
