The EPA will protect information received from the PMRA in accordance with sections 10(b) and 10(d)(1) of the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA). The EPA recognizes the PMRA as a "person" under the FIFRA and will provide protection equivalent to that of a U.S. "person" to the PMRA.

We look forward to future harmonization efforts with the PMRA.

The EPA agrees to protect this information from public disclosure to the extent required by the Federal Insecticide Fungicide and Rodenticide Act and the Freedom of Information Act. Should a request for public disclosure be received, the EPA will withhold from disclosure confidential information protected by U.S. law from public release.
