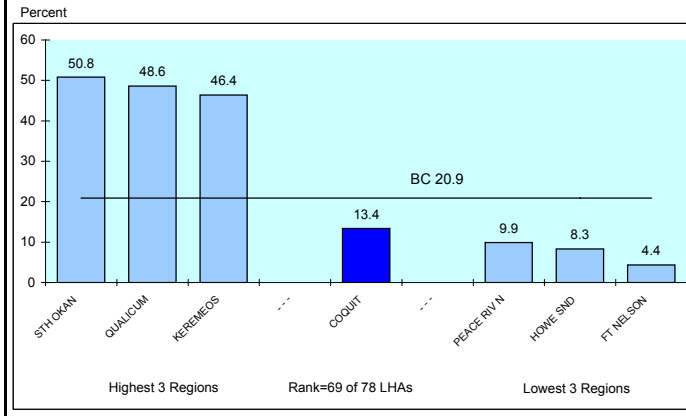

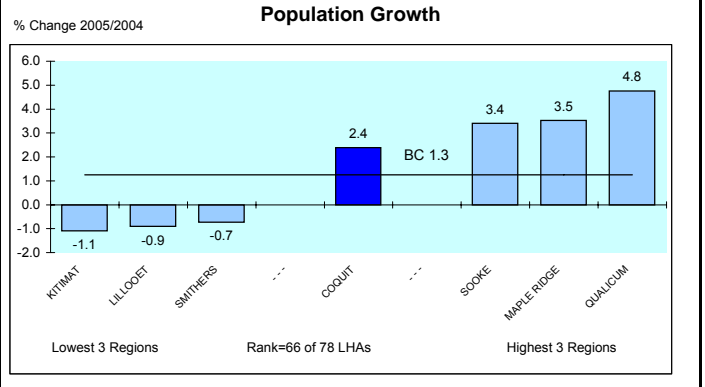

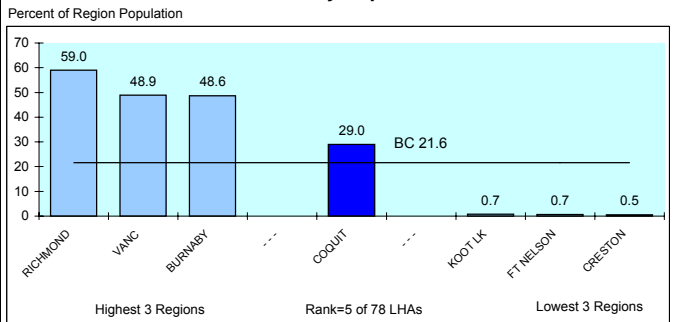

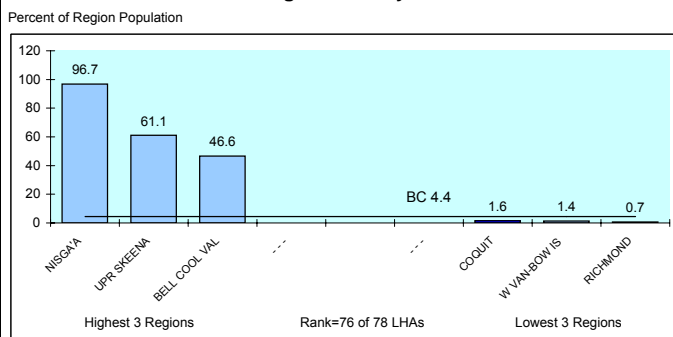

### Visible Minority Population - 2001



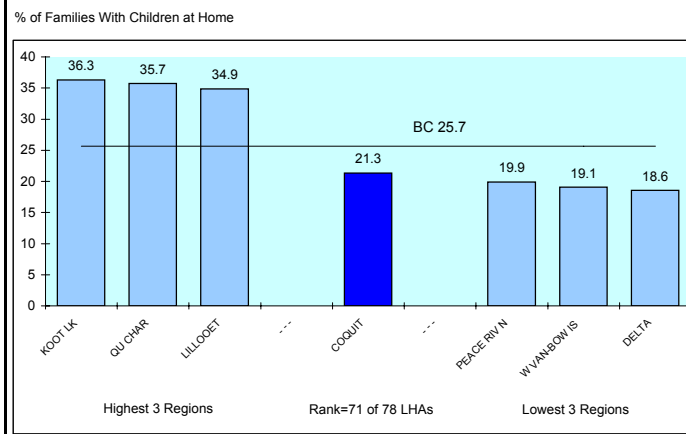

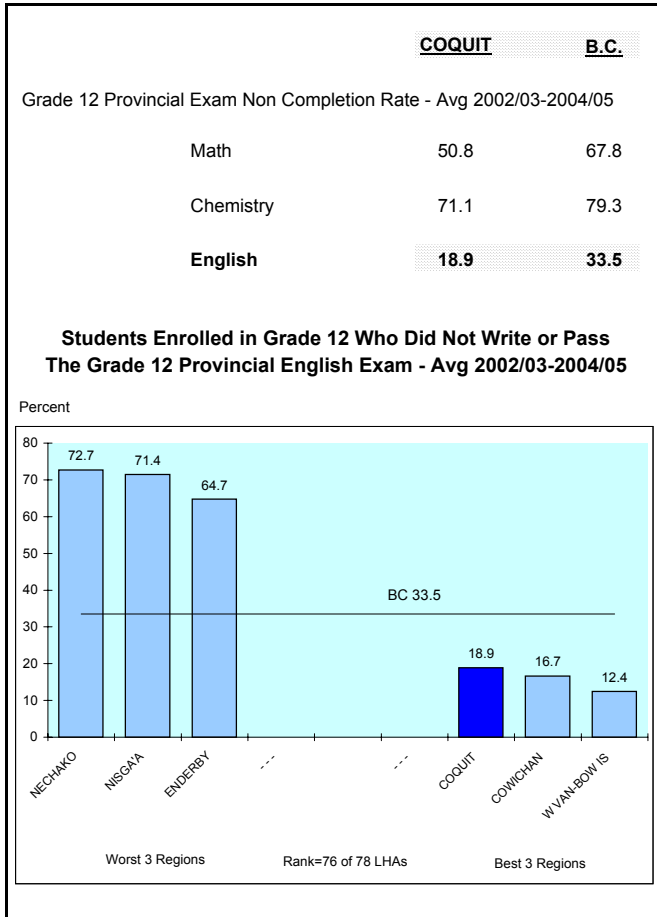

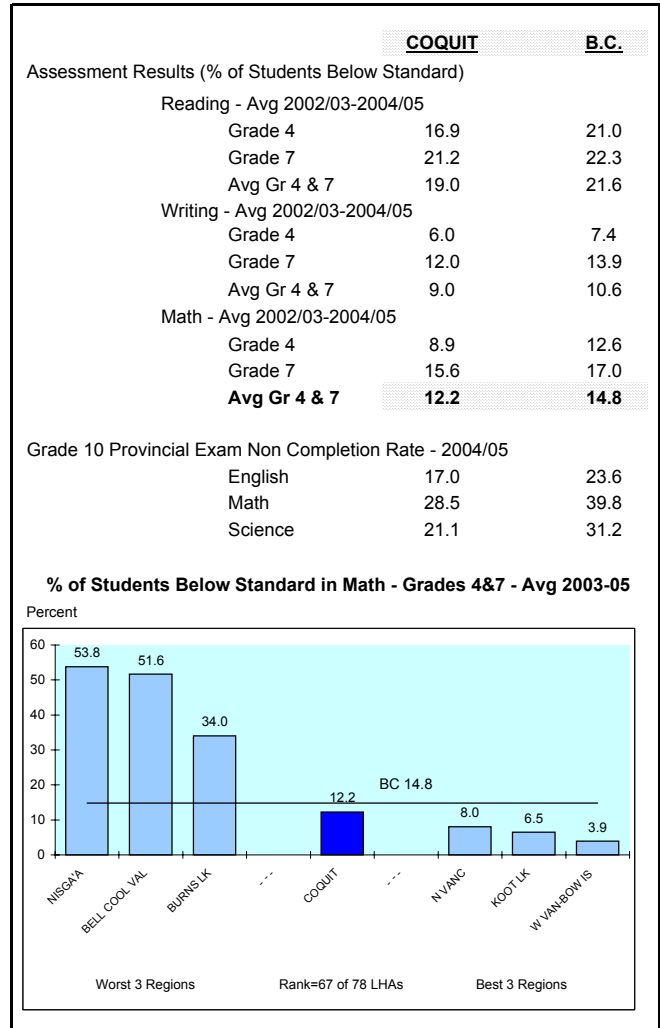

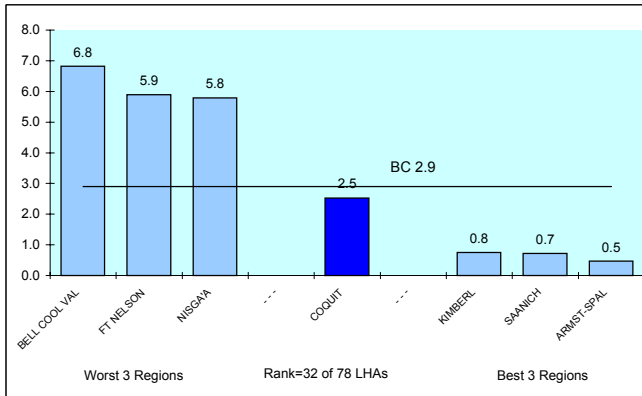

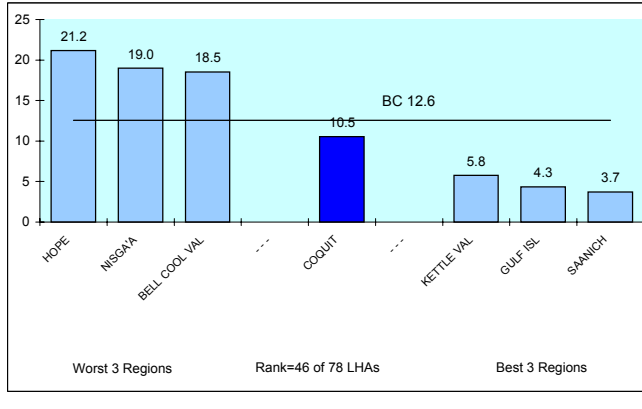
#### Serious Violent Crime Rate - 2002-2004

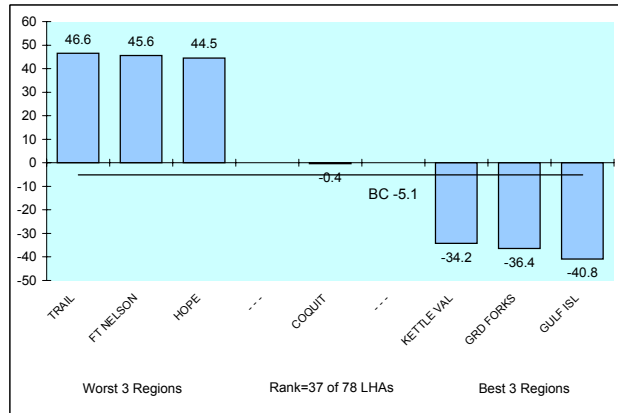

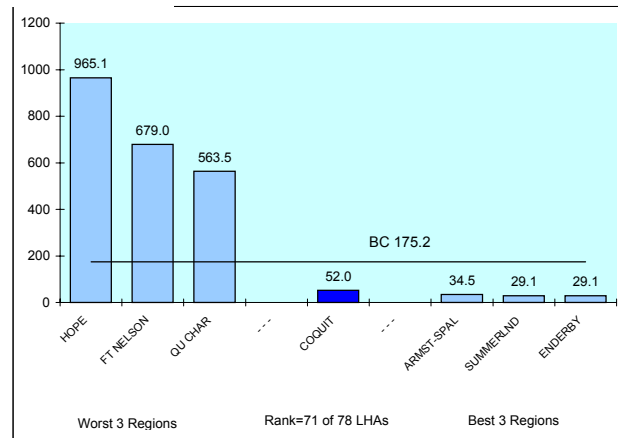

#### Non-Cannabis Drug Offences - Avg 2002-2004

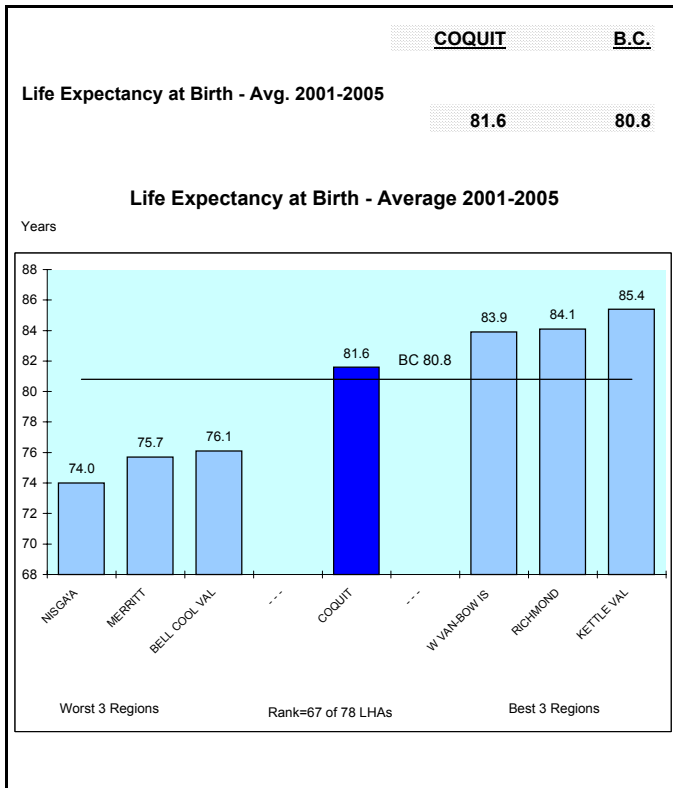

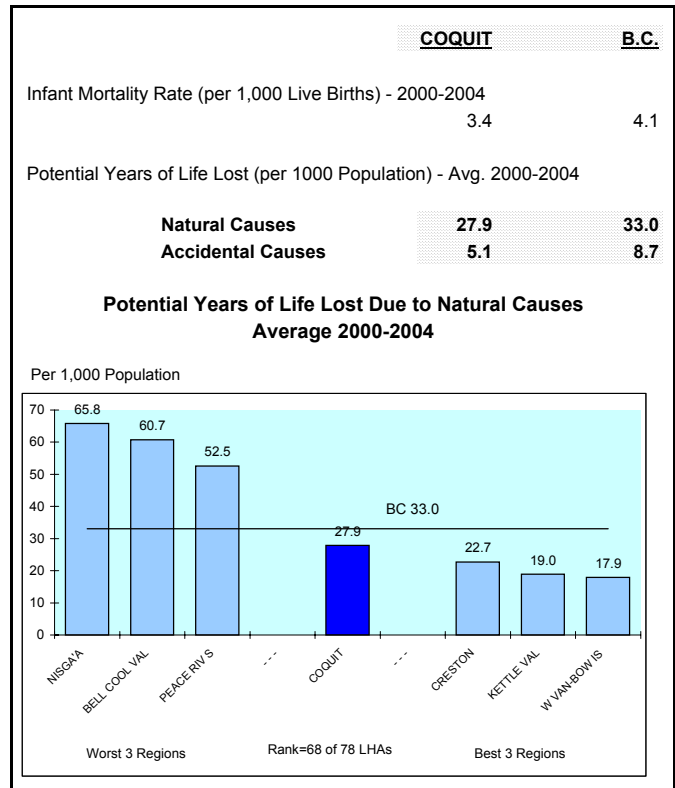

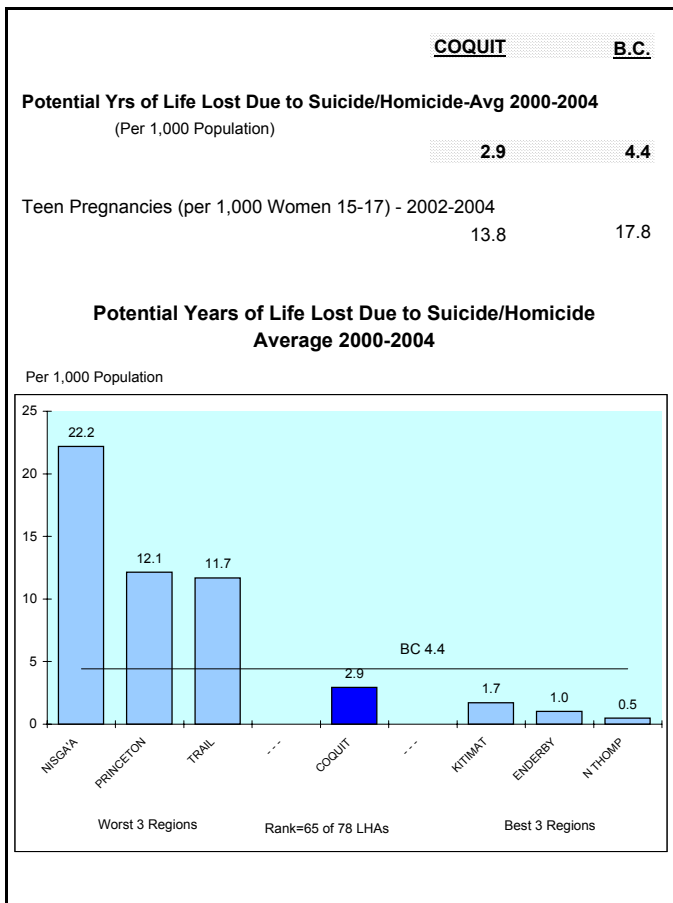

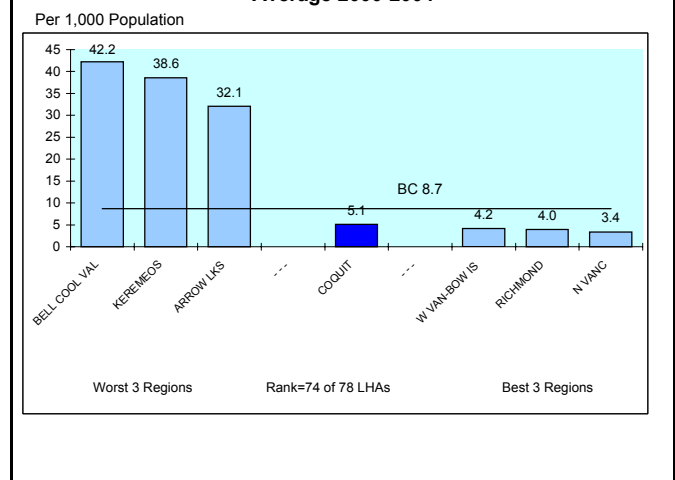

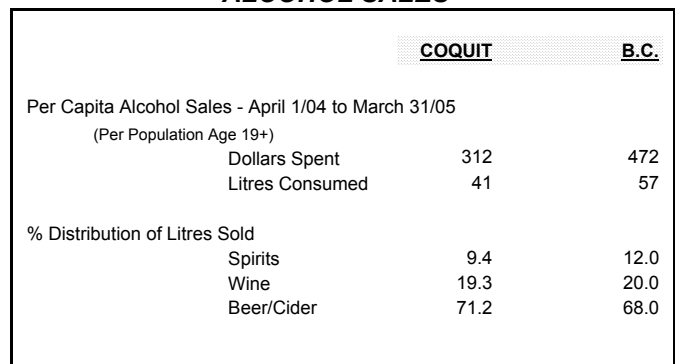

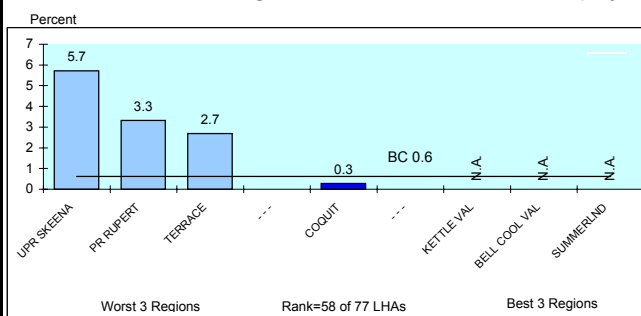

#### % of Youth 19-24 Receiving Income Assistance Who Are Employable

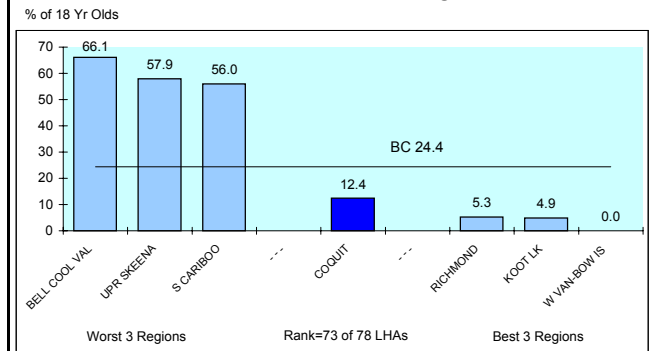

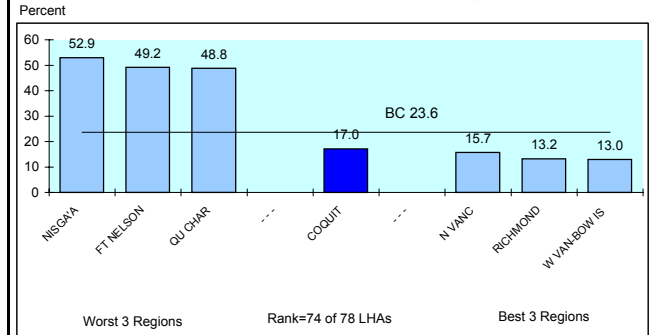

#### 18 Year Olds Who Did Not Graduate Avg 2002/03-2004/05



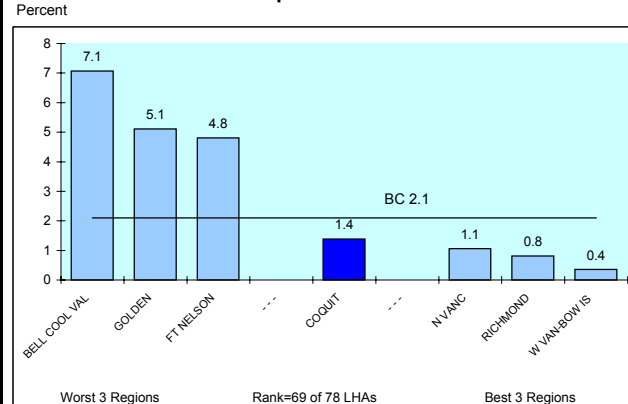
#### Gr. 10 Prov. Exam Non-Completion Rate - English - 2004/05
