#### **FOREWORD**

The annual graduate follow-up survey collects information from graduates of regular and non-regular training programs approximately one year following graduation. The information gathered provides valuable feedback on the success of graduates in the labour market and is an important tool for decision-makers. This tool, along with other sources, is incorporated into the Department's planning process.

This report presents the findings of the Survey of 2003 New Brunswick Community College Graduates. The survey was conducted over a four-week period immediately following the reference week of June 6-12, 2004, with 1,922 graduates. This represents a response rate of 80%. Survey results indicate that graduates of the Class of 2003 were again very successful in locating employment, with an employment rate of 87%.

The Department would like to thank the New Brunswick Community College graduates who participated in this survey; their input has been invaluable.

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#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The follow-up survey with the Class of 2003 from the New Brunswick Community College generated information from 1,922 graduates, representing 80% of the 2,416 graduates to be contacted for this survey.

The points which follow present key information obtained through the 2004 survey.

- The employment rate for graduates one year following their graduation was 87%, two percentage points lower than that reported in 2003.
- The employment rate for female graduates was 90%, one percentage point lower than that reported in 2003.
- The employment rate for male graduates was 85%, a decrease of two percentage points from the 87% reported in 2003.
- The unemployment rate for graduates increased from 11.4% in 2003 to 12.9% in 2004.
- Overall, the percentage of related employment since graduation as a percentage of total employment decreased from 76% in 2003 to 75% in 2004.
- The level of related employment *in the 2004 reference week* decreased by one percentage point to 78% over that reported in 2003.
- The percentage of employed graduates working in New Brunswick (91%) was the same as reported in 2003.
- The percentage of graduates in self-employment was 3% in 2004, one percentage point higher than reported in 2003.
- The majority of employed graduates (89%) continued to be in work situations in which they were working for one employer in the reference week.
- The economic differences between the wages of men and women continues to be evident in 2004: female graduates in full-time positions earned approximately 83% of the wages of male graduates in full-time positions, a loss of three percentage points over that reported in 2003. Female graduates working full-time in positions related to their training also earned 83% of the average wages of male graduates in similar positions. In 2003, female graduates working in full-time positions related to the programs completed earned 87% of the average wage of male graduates working full-time in positions related to the program completed.


Follow-up surveys with graduates of New Brunswick Community Colleges have been conducted since 1983. For the past sixteen years the survey has been conducted by telephone. The survey is conducted annually with graduates of regular and non-regular programs of the Colleges. In the 2004 survey, interviews were completed with 1,922 graduates from a total listing of 2,416 graduates of the 2003 school year for whom contact information was available.

The data supplied by these surveys provides valuable feedback on the success of New Brunswick Community College graduates in the labour market which, in turn, serves as an important indicator of how well the training provided by the NBCC system corresponds to the demands of the labour market.

This report provides detailed information gathered from the Survey of 2003 New Brunswick Community College Graduates through five sections which are summarized in the material which follows.

- **Section II** presents information related to the way in which the 2004 survey was conducted and provides a profile of the graduates contacted with a comparison with the overall population of graduates.
- **Section III** presents the information highlights from the 2004 survey.
- Section IV presents fact sheets which report the survey information on a programby-program basis.
- Section V presents labour market information on a program-by-program basis.
- Section VI presents the evaluations provided by graduates.

A list of terminology used in this report is provided in Appendix A.



The Survey of 2003 Graduates of the New Brunswick Community College (NBCC) was guided by researchers from the Labour Market Analysis Branch of the Department of Training and Employment Development (the Department). Any comments or questions about the information contained in this document should be forwarded to the Department.

In June 2004, the Department generated a data base with background and current contact information for 2,538 graduates from the Class of 2003 for the NBCC. The background data and required contact information was retrieved from the Department's student information system.

Prior to the start of the survey (in June 2004), the data base was reduced by five (5) graduates for whom no current telephone numbers were available. During the data collection period, some respondents indicated that they had not completed their program of study in 2003. Following removal of these names from the data base, and removal of the potential contacts for introductory programs which were not included in previous surveys, there were 2,416 potential contacts for the Class of 2003. The 1,922 interviews completed represent 80% of the total number of graduates who were eligible to participate in this survey.

As in previous surveys, graduates were asked about their activities during a specific week of the year (the reference week). Reference week information is an indicator of graduates' current activities. *The reference week for the 2004 survey was June 6 – June 12, 2004.* 

In addition to the reference week information and the information collected on activities since completing their training, graduates were also asked to evaluate their NBCC training program and various facilities and services available at their college.

The overall approach to the Graduate Follow-Up Survey was changed in 1996. Previously, surveys were conducted in March, capturing information from graduates of the previous academic year. The change in the time of the reference week should be kept in mind when comparing the results from the surveys in 1996 - 2004 to those conducted in previous years. For example, the question asking respondents if they were studying during the reference week gave very different results in 1996 - 2004 compared to previous years. These differences are understandable considering that most people enrolled in post-secondary institutions would be attending classes in March but not in June.

The telephone interviews with graduates were conducted by Baseline Market Research in Fredericton, NB immediately following the reference week.

The 2004 survey response rate of 80% is the same as that achieved in the 2003 survey. Over the past three years, it has required additional time for data collection to achieve the minimum response rate of 80%. While a lack of current telephone numbers has been a consistent problem, the difficulty appears more related to people's ability to identify callers prior to answering the telephone.

### **II METHODOLOGY**

The table which follows presents a summary of response rates for the surveys over the 2000 – 2004 periods.



Measuring labour market participation is a primary objective of the graduate follow-up surveys. Because of the importance of this information, an attempt was made to determine the extent to which a change in the time of the reference week (initiated in 1996) affected the results of reported labour force activity. The potential effects were initially monitored in the 1996 survey and the monitoring has continued through the current survey. The information from the current survey is presented in the table which follows. The data presented indicate that the participation rate was higher in June and the employment rate for March was slightly lower than that reported for June.

The chart which follows presents an overview of the gender distribution for graduates contacted.






The table which follows presents a comparative summary of graduates contacted in follow-up surveys over the past 5 years. Prior to 2000, there had been significant increases in the percentage of graduates 25 years of age or older and significant increases in the percentage of female graduates. In 2004, the percentage of female graduates is four percentage points lower than reported in 2003, while the percentage of graduates 25 years of age or older decreased by one percentage point.

### LABOUR FORCE INFORMATION

The labour force participation rate for all graduates increased by one percentage point compared to that reported in 2003.

<sup>\*</sup>Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey June, 2004, seasonally adjusted. It is noted that the unadjusted unemployment rate for youth, 15-24 was 15.2% in June 2004.

The 87% employment rate reported for the 2004 survey is two percentage points lower than that reported in 2003. The unemployment rate calculated for the 2004 Survey indicates that the graduates had a higher (2.9 percentage points) unemployment rate than that calculated for the province; however, the unemployment rate for graduates was significantly lower (2.3 percentage points) than the youth unemployment rate of 15.2% (unadjusted) for June 2004.

The table which follows summarizes employment rates over 2000 - 2004 by gender. The information indicates that female graduates continue to evidence a higher employment rate, overall, than male graduates.

#### ADDITIONAL EDUCATION/TRAINING FOR GRADUATES

In surveys prior to 2001, graduates were asked if they were attending an education or training program at the time of survey contact. Since 2001, respondents have been asked if they were "enrolled" in a program and then asked if they were currently attending the program or waiting to start the program in the near future. Among the 14% who reported enrolment in 2004, 40% were currently enrolled in a program and 60% were awaiting the start of the program.

As evidenced in the table which follows, when the 2004 Survey is compared to the 2003 Survey, the level of involvement in education or training in the reference week increased by 2 percentage points overall.

### **OVERALL EMPLOYMENT FOR GRADUATES**

The table which follows demonstrates the percentage of graduates with at least one month of employment in a position related to their training. Overall, graduates averaged 75% of their months employed since graduation in positions related to their training. In 2003 an average of 76% of total months employed were related to training.

### **GEOGRAPHIC LOCATION OF GRADUATES**

In June 2004, 91% of 2003 graduates were residing in New Brunswick. The same percentage was reported for the Class of 2002.

Approximately 14% of 2003 graduates had lived outside New Brunswick since graduation. Among those who had lived outside the province (n=269), the majority (65%) had left the province for employment. In 2004, 66% of those who left the province for employment had obtained employment prior to relocation. In 2003, 58% of those who left the province for employment had obtained employment prior to relocation.

Graduates working full-time averaged 42.1 hours in the reference week for an average wage of \$530.17. Graduates working part-time averaged 18.9 hours for an average wage of \$239.59.

Graduates were asked for their perceptions about the wages they earned in the reference week. Overall,

- 6% of employed graduates reported that their wages were "much better" than those of others in similar jobs;
- 22% reported that their wages were better;
- 55% reported that their wages were the same as those for others in similar positions; and
- 19% reported that their wages were worse (16%) or much worse (3%) than those in similar positions.

The table which follows links the perceptions about wages with the average gross wages earned in the reference week. The data suggest a clear link between the full-time wages earned in the reference week and perceptions about those wages.

## **GENDER DIFFERENCES IN WAGES**

Each graduate survey has identified gaps between the overall wages of male and female graduates. In 2004, male graduates averaged \$571 per week in full-time positions, while female graduates in full-time positions averaged approximately 17% less at \$472 per week.

Since it has been demonstrated that males and females tend to be employed in different occupations, gaps may have been expected; however, as the table which follows demonstrates, similar wage gaps do not always exist when male and female graduates are employed in the same NOC (National Occupational Classification) classifications.

## **Return to School for Additional Training/Education**

The 274 respondents enrolled in or attending school in the reference week provided the following reasons for their return to an education or training program:

- to upgrade existing skills (51%);
- to get a university degree (19%);
- to get a better job (15%);
- to learn a new trade (10%);
- to find employment (4%); or
- other reasons or multiple reasons (1%).

## **Employment Since Graduation**

Ninety-eight percent (98%) of graduates from the Class of 2003 had been employed since graduation. Those employed averaged 1.8 different jobs. These results were the same as those reported for the Class of 2002 in 2003.

## **Motivations for Community College Enrollment**

Beginning with the 1999 survey, all graduates were asked why they had decided to pursue their training at the NBCC rather than through a university or private training program. Overall:

- 27% chose the NBCC because it was the only place which offered the type of training desired;
- 22% indicated that the NBCC offered a less expensive alternative than either a university or a private program;
- 14% chose the NBCC because of the shorter time requirements for completion of a program of study;
- 9% based their decision on the location of a particular College;
- 7% indicated that they had lacked the marks or other requirements for entry to a university program;
- 6% based their selection on the reputation of the College;
- 6% cited the "hands-on" or the practical approach of the NBCC as motivations for their choice:
- 4% based their selection on the job prospects which would exist upon completion of an NBCC program;
- 1% indicated that the course was sponsored by an employer; and
- 4% cited other or a combination of reasons.

When asked why they had selected a particular College for their program of study, the following reasons were cited:

- convenience of the location (46%);
- particular program was available only at the location selected (33%);
- reputation associated with the College (8%);
- language of instruction at the College (7%);
- recommendations of friends/relatives (2%);
- lower tuition costs (1%); and
- various other reasons (3%).

Ninety-six percent (96%) of graduates were accepted to the NBCC in the year in which they made their initial application.

Overall, 80% of graduates would select the same field of study, were they making the decision about enrolment today.

## **Prior Learning Assessment and Recognition and Credit Transfer Services**

Graduates were asked questions to determine their awareness, use and evaluation of PLAR and Credit Transfer Services. The material which follows provides a summary of the information collected.

#### Overall:

- 49% of graduates reported that they were aware of these services; and
- 51% were not aware of these services.

When contacted in 2003, 58% of graduates reported awareness of PLAR.

Among those who were aware of these services (n=993):

- 82% heard about PLAR through staff at the NBCC;
- 14% heard about these services through friends; and
- 4% heard about these services through other means.

Among those who were aware of these services (n=993):

- 17% had applied for Credit Transfer; and
- 12% had applied for a Prior Learning Assessment.

Among the 202, (11% of the graduates contacted) who had applied for one or both of these services, 142 received an exemption from courses based on prior experience or prior academic work at another institution. The exemptions granted resulted in a reduction of tuition for 13 graduates, a reduced course load for 137 and some other effect for 16 graduates.

The graduates who received exemptions (n=142) provided the following evaluations of the services they received:

- 40% were very satisfied with the services provided;
- 55% were satisfied:
- 4% were dissatisfied; and
- 1% was very dissatisfied.

#### **Peer Tutoring**

Sixty percent (60%) of graduates were aware of peer tutoring at the NBCC and 6% of graduates (n=105) contacted used the peer tutoring system at the college. When asked for their evaluation of the effectiveness of the assistance provided through peer tutoring:


- 49% provided a rating of excellent;
- 41% of those who used this service provided a good rating; and
- 10% indicated that peer tutoring was fair (8%) or poor (2%).

#### **Post Program Artistic Involvement of NBCCD Graduates**

Graduates of the College of Craft and Design (n=28) were asked about their post-training involvement with the arts community in New Brunswick. The material which follows provides a summary of the information collected.

- Since graduation, 2 (7%) of the graduates contacted have applied to the NB Arts Board or the Canada Council for funding to promote or prepare their craft. One of those who applied received an award.
- Since graduation, 54% of those contacted reported that they have contributed to the arts through exhibits, donations or in other ways.
- During the reference week, 54% of those who had completed a program through the College of Craft and Design were practising their craft or preparing for an exhibit for which they were not paid.

The sections which follow present information about graduates on a program-by-program basis.



#### IV SURVEY RESULTS BY COLLEGE AND PROGRAM

The following section contains a fact sheet for the Class of 2003, a fact sheet for each college and fact sheets for all programs for which more than 3 graduates were interviewed. Information is presented first in summary form if the program is offered in more than one location, followed by information on the program for each college.

The programs which follow, for which graduates were contacted, have been excluded from the presentation because of the small number of graduates reached (3 or less). Although excluded from this section, labour market information for these programs may be found in Section V.

### **Terminology**

#### **NBCC**

The New Brunswick Community College is a network of eleven colleges situated throughout the province of New Brunswick.

#### **Average Weekly Earnings**

Refers to the average of the gross earnings that graduates reported for the reference week. The average weekly earnings are reported for each program and for each college where the program is offered. The figures presented are based on earnings reported by graduates who indicated that their employment was either directly or indirectly related to their training.

#### **Employed**

The number of respondents who had a job during the reference week.

#### **Employment**

Defined in terms of full-time/part-time and permanent/temporary as follows:

Full-time Employment of 30 hours or more per week.
Part-time Employment of less than 30 hours per week.

Permanent Employment which has no prearranged termination date.

Temporary Employment which ends at a prearranged date.

#### **Employment Rate**

The number of employed graduates as a percentage of those in the labour force.

#### **Employment Related to Training**

Employed graduates were asked about the extent to which their employment during the reference week was related to their training program. Options presented to the respondent included directly related, indirectly related and not at all related.

#### Related Employment

Includes employment that graduates reported as either directly related or indirectly related to their training program. *Directly related* means that graduates were in jobs for which their training programs had been designed. *Indirectly related* means that graduates were in jobs that required at least some of the skills that were acquired during their training program.

#### Not at all related

Means that graduates were in jobs that did not require any of the skills that were acquired during their training program.

#### **Graduate Population**

Graduates of regular training programs of twelve weeks or more in duration and graduates of non regular training programs of twenty weeks or more in duration that terminated between January 1, and December 31, 2003.

#### **Labour Force**

In the context of this survey, Labour Force is composed of respondents who were either employed or

unemployed but looking for work during the reference week.

#### Not in the Labour Force

Respondents who were not working and not looking for work, during the reference week.

#### **Labour Force Participation Rate**

The percentage of respondents who were actively participating in the labour force during the reference week (based on the total number of respondents).

#### **Labour Force Survey**

A monthly survey by Statistics Canada which collects labour force information from a representative sample of the working age population.

#### **NAICS (North American Industrial Classification System)**

NAICS was used to categorize the industrial sectors/industries in which graduates were employed in the reference week. Fact sheets list the top three industries for employment. If the percentage of respondents is equal across occupations, the three most closely related to the training completed are listed.

#### **NOC (National Occupational Classification)**

The National Occupational Classification was used to categorize the kind of work done by graduates. The top three responses are given. If the percentage of respondents in each occupation is equal the three that appear most relevant to the program content are listed.

#### **Programs**

#### Regular

Programs that operated throughout the year on a year-to-year basis. Regular training programs are funded through the departmental budgetary process. Regular training programs are listed in the annual New Brunswick Community College Calendar. (R=Regular)

#### Non-Regular

Programs that are offered through the New Brunswick Community College that are not part of the regular program listing in the NBCC Calendar. These programs may or may not have the same content as regular training programs of the same name. (NR=Non-Regular)

#### Co-Op

Cooperative Education Programs integrate periods of classroom study with periods of training in related work. Each work situation is developed and approved by the College as a suitable learning situation. Co-Op trainees are placed in productive work, receive wages and have their progress monitored by the employers and representatives of the College. (Co-Op)

#### Articulated

A program offered in two stages. One stage is completed at a community college, and leads to a diploma and a second is completed at a university and lead to a degree.

#### **Reference Week**

The week of June 6 - 12, 2004 served as the reference week for this survey. During the survey all graduates were asked about their activities during this week.

#### **Response Rate**

The number of respondents as a percentage of the number of graduates.

#### Self Employed

Someone who is working but has no employer other than her/himself.

#### **Total Employment Since Graduation**

The total number of graduates who reported that they had been employed, at some time, since completing their training at the NBCC.

#### **Relation of Employment Since Graduation to Training**

The percentage of graduates who reported that they held at least one employment positions since graduation which was either directly or indirectly related to their training program at the NBCC.
