# Programs for Groups of Students with Special Needs

Thanks to the generous support of the J.W. McConnell Family Foundation, the National Gallery of Canada and the Canadian Museum of Contemporary Photography can offer a wide selection of programs for groups of students with special needs.

This flexible two-part program allows teachers to design an arts experience that complements school curriculum or student interests by choosing any two Discovery Visits and any three Studio Activities. However, we recommend that all groups book an initial Discovery Visits prior to their first Studio Activity. Discovery Visits and Studio Activities can be booked as a single visit or as part of a series. Specially trained guides lead all programs.

### **Discovery Visits**

Discovery Visits are interactive programs that take place in gallery spaces and last up to 1.5 hours, depending on your students' needs. Students make connections between artworks and their own experiences, creating a memorable gallery visit. The following themes can be adapted to any grade level.
