
Bathurst Inlet & Umingmaktok 2006

With a population of only 19 people, Bathurst Inlet is best known for the Bathurst Inlet Lodge, a naturalist lodge situated in an old trading post/mission. Visitors to the area usually come to see the spectacular views of the Wilberforce Falls, the highest circumpolar waterfall, as well as the rolling hills, tremendous gorges, beautiful wildflowers and variant wildlife.

Most of the people of Umingmaktok have moved to neighboring communities, leaving a population of only ten people. However, the area is visited regularly by hunting groups, naturalists and former residents nostalgic for earlier days.

Umingmaktok, "like a muskox", is on the migration route of the Bathurst caribou herd.
