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NEW Stella the Safety Skunk

This program is designed to help shape and strengthen children's awareness of health and safety as an integral responsibility of our decision-making. The program package includes: a skunk hand puppet, teacher activity guide, literacy books, posters, student temporary tattoos and pencils. (K to 2 – linked to the You & Your World curriculum)

NEW Passport to Safety

This national on-line testing service helps reinforce student learning of workplace safety. Teachers can use this WHSCC-sponsored evaluation tool **FREE** of charge with students. Choices for Life Teacher's Guide

This program provides fun activities for the classroom and explores an array of health and safety issues at home, school, work and play. Activities are intended to help youth acquire the skills to make safe choices and gain an understanding that accidents can be prevented. (Grades K to 12 – linked to various curriculum outcomes)

NEW Health & Safety Videos

A number of videos are available and appropriate for classroom viewing. Videos review principal workplace health and safety facts, safe decision-making, rights and responsibilities, job safety skills, and WHMIS content. They provide real stories of young workers who have experienced a workplace accident first-hand. (Grades 8 to 12)

NEW Health & Safety Posters

A number of colorful safety posters are available for classroom walls. The images include safety tips and techniques, "spot the hazards" scenes and true tales of young injured workers. (Grades K to 12)

NEW Lock-out Sticker

This sticker is appropriate to display in industrial classrooms to help remind students of safety procedures when operating equipment and machinery. (Grades 6 to 12)

Health & Safety in the Workplace: Know the Facts Booklet

The fundamentals of workplace health and safety are presented in a reader-friendly format in this booklet. It is suitable for creating handouts and overhead transparencies or for using as a unit textbook. (Grades 8 to 12, teachers, workers & safety committees)

Work Smart Work Safe CD Rom

This interactive CD allows students to independently guide themselves through important job safety facts. Mini video clips, colorful images, testimonials from young injured workers and comprehensive information that all youth should know before entering the workplace are part of this package. A student guidebook and reflective questions are included. (Grades 8 to 12)
