## *Dear Stewardship Community,*

This edition of the Stewardship and Community Involvement directory marks our 15th year of publication. The Stream to Sea education program is strongly supported throughout Pacific Region, with involvement of over 25 part and full-time Education Coordinators, 18 Community Advisors and many educational professionals and volunteers supporting the program. The Stream to Sea program combines oceans and aquatic species education and lessons on marine and freshwater habitat to create a stewardship ethic. The ultimate goal is to have students become aquatic stewards, caring for the environment around them.

The Community Advisors dedicate their mission statement to the volunteers and community projects: “Fostering cooperative fisheries and watershed stewardship through education and involvement”. Our Community Advisors work alongside the stewardship community, building partnerships within community. From assisting with mini hatchery programs, policy implementation, to taking an active role in oceans and watershed planning, these staff members are the public face of DFO.

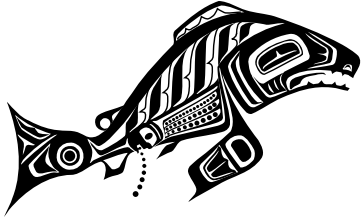

# 2006-2007 Stewardship and Community Involvement Directory

This Directory lists the Fisheries and Oceans Canada community involvement staff and the projects they support. It covers the Pacific Region, which includes British Columbia and the Yukon. The Pacific Region is divided into six areas, each led by an Area Chief. Each area supports community projects through a team of Community Advisors, Education Coordinators, and Community Liaison Officers.

- Community Advisors (CAs) are the key liaisons between DFO and community-based projects. Following each CA listing is a list of projects supported by that CA. Generally, there are four types of projects.
- Community Economic Development Program (CEDP) projects are operated under contract by First Nations or community groups.
- Public Involvement Program projects are operated by volunteers or by community organizations. Approximately 10,000 volunteers participate in 300 community projects.
- Streamkeepers projects focus on protection, preservation, monitoring and rehabilitation of streams, rivers, wetlands and watersheds.
- Education projects involve students in the Stream to Sea lessons, the classroom incubation program and field trips.

In some areas, Education Coordinators and Community Liaison Officers complement the DFO Community Advisors in supporting community projects.

- Education Coordinators (ECs) support DFO's numerous K-12 Stream to Sea initiatives. ECs are available for inservice teacher training, technical program support, or classroom and field instruction.
- Community Liaison Officers (CLOs) organize and participate in a variety of events, workshops and consultations. CLOs work with all areas of DFO to assist with outreach initiatives and plans.

In the coastal areas of the Pacific Region, an Oceans Outreach program raises awareness about the *Oceans Act* and its three primary programs (Integrated Management, Marine Protected Areas and Marine Environmental Quality). In addition, outreach initiatives have been designed to inform stakeholders on how the oceans work and what steps people can take in their daily lives to protect the oceans for future generations. Oceans Outreach staff are also listed in this directory.

Pacific Region (B.C. and the Yukon) is divided into six areas. The focus of each area differs depending upon local community needs and the resources available. To find resources for your area, please refer to the Table of Contents. For each area, you will find a list of contacts for Area Chiefs, CAs, ECs, CLOs, and Oceans Outreach staff (for coastal areas only) as well as DFO-supported community projects for that area.

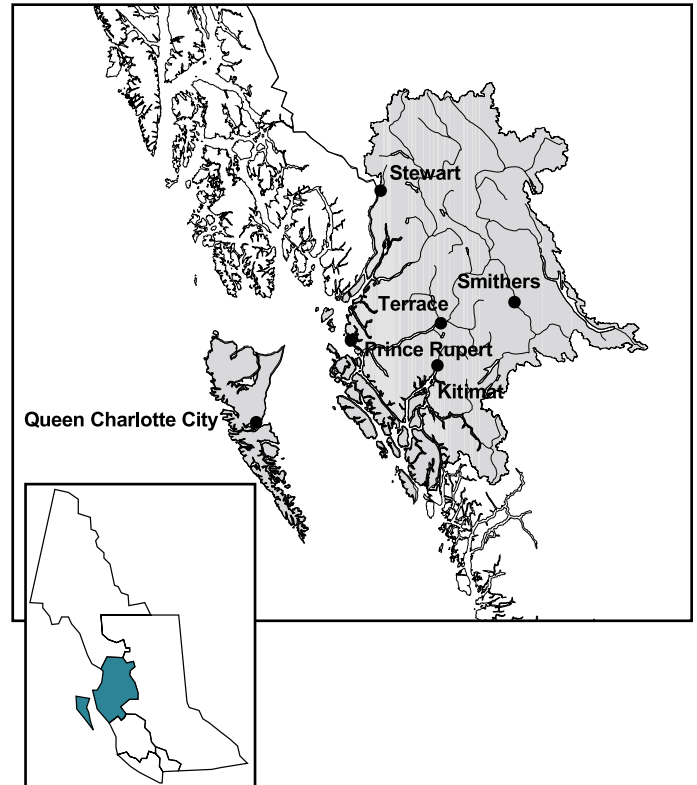

## Western Forest Products (Sewell) 1977 - 2005

This year marks the end of an era. It is with a sad heart that we've packed up and shipped out the hatchery equipment at the Western Forest Products (WFP) Sewell Inlet Camp. This year, due to provincial claw-backs, WFP will no longer be operating in Sewell, so the hatchery has been dismantled because there is no longer a camp and no one left to care for the salmon eggs and fry. Fortunately, WFP is still

supporting salmon enhancement in other areas and will continue to assist and participate with other hatcheries and Community Advisors throughout B.C.

## Education:

George Farrell works closely with all of the schools on Queen Charlotte Islands/Haida Gwaii and provides technical support for the Salmonids in the Classroom program and other aquatic education activities. Each elementary school has up to four incubation tanks, with each classroom project involving between 15 to 45 persons. Both high schools are involved with Streamkeepers activities and outdoor education. Activities for primary and secondary schools include macro invertebrate studies, hatchery tours, habitat inventory and restoration

projects, fish dissections, beach seining, fry releases, Matter In Motion and watershed education. Josina Davis, a local Education Coordinator, provides oceans education and intertidal surveys to all elementary school students and participates with us in Salmonids in the Classroom activities.

*“As our communities continue to grow, the impacts to our local salmon bearing streams increase. Education about human impacts with examples of local impacts to fish and fish habitat continue to be an important component of the Salmonids in the Classroom sessions. Streamkeepers have been very busy monitoring the progress of*

*a proposed landfill site expansion and railway line herbicide spraying in the New Hazelton area. The CEDP hatcheries continue to release coho and chinook juveniles and collect stock assessment data. Marking programs at the Ft. Babine hatchery have been completely dropped however, coho at the Toboggan Creek hatchery are still being coded wire tagged.*

*Adult assessment data is still being collected from the Strategic Stock Enhancement Program coho releases and this will continue until the 2005 return year.”*

### **Education**

The education program in this area is very popular. Teachers continue to utilise the Salmonids in the Classroom program manuals and are continuing with Streamkeepers sessions for salmon-themed field trips. In the 2004 school year, we have 18 schools participating and 27 classes (700 students). Students are learning about Ecological Footprint and how to reduce their impact on the environment. Many of the classes have been participating in half day field trips which involve conducting aquatic insect surveys, water quality monitoring, fry trapping, and identification and habitat surveys, and plant and bird walks in the riparian area.

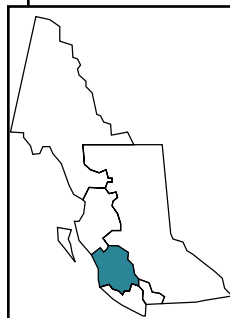
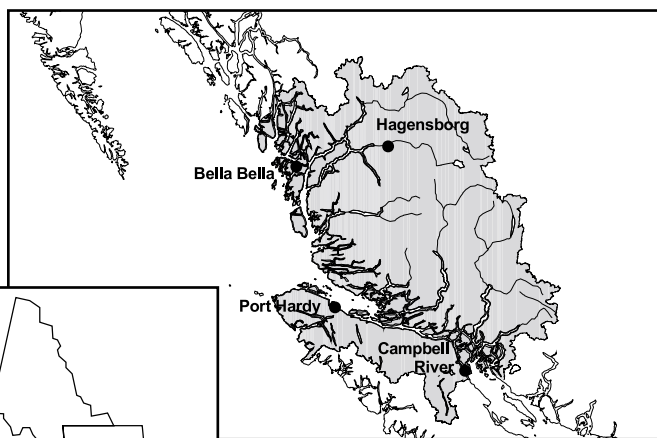

*“This update has to start with a congratulations to McLoughlin and Kitasoo CEDP hatchery managers and staff for overcoming challenges with chum salmon incubation and achieving some of the highest incubation successes in each project’s history! We have new hatchery managers at both facilities so want*

*to also welcome Andrea Larsen and Mark Mason on board. Sockeye projects at Victor Creek (Kitasoo First Nations) and Emily Creek (Heiltsuk First Nations) had setbacks over the past couple of years with water line failures but both have moved forward with installation of alarm systems and improvements at the facilities so are on track to achieve better results. Both these outer coast sockeye projects have assessment components and a DFO team hopes to work with them this year to review data and plan for the future. The Rivers and Smith Inlet sockeye conservation enhancement program from Snootli Hatchery moves into the fifth year in 2005 with another successful release of juveniles. Adult assessment is being done in 2004 and 2005 to estimate contribution and survival of enhanced sockeye from the first brood released (2000). The Oweekeno (Wuikinuxv) Fisheries Program is now adding work with Wannock chum to their suite of projects that include sockeye and Wannock River Chinook.*

*The Rivers & Smith Inlet Salmon Ecosystem Planning Society (Rivers Partner Group) completed a Recovery Plan early in 2004 for the Pacific Salmon Endowment Fund. The group continues to support collaborative projects (such as the Enhancement Evaluation Program) that will contribute to increased understanding, re-building and improved management of salmon stocks as well as general ecosystem health. The Central Coast Fisherman’s Protective Association (education and public awareness), Bella Coola Watershed Conservation Society (watershed planning) and Rivers Inlet, North Coast Conservation Society (Wannock chinook enhancement & assessment) continue to make significant and positive contributions here in the Central Coast, while the education program maintains a high profile with new Oceans activities taking students ‘down to the sea’.*

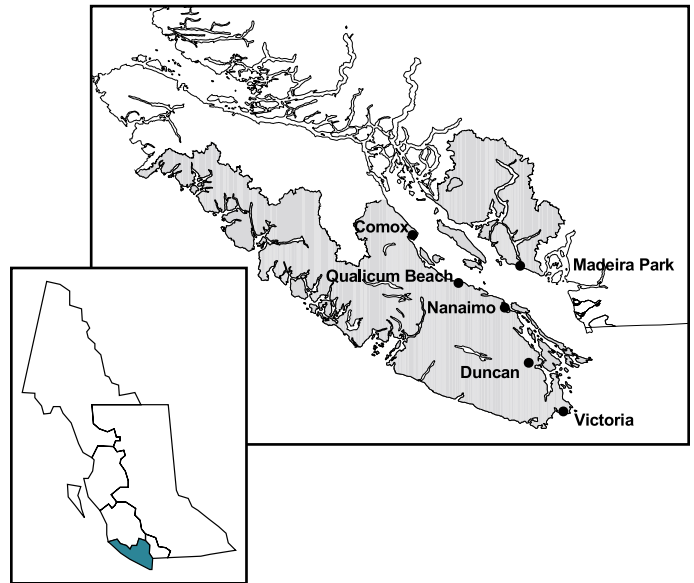

The Nanaimo school program continues to be popular and beneficial in the Nanaimo and Ladysmith areas.

In School District 68, 30 schools participate in the Stream to Sea program, which involves approximately 2,000 students. Activities include classroom incubation, the field trip program Gently Down the Stream at the Nanaimo community hatchery and Ladysmith hatchery, and storm drain marking. Coho and chum eggs are supplied to schools by Nanaimo River CEDP, Chase River and Ladysmith Sportsman's Club PIP hatcheries. The Nanaimo CEDP have expanded their educational program to include a spring component which focuses on habitat issues.

The Alberni school program continues to be popular and successful. It includes 20 classroom incubation projects, and the very popular Gently Down the Creek field program, which consists of forestry, invertebrate and stream survey components. The program has added a marine/oceans section. Local volunteer enhancement groups and Robertson Creek hatchery staff support the school program.

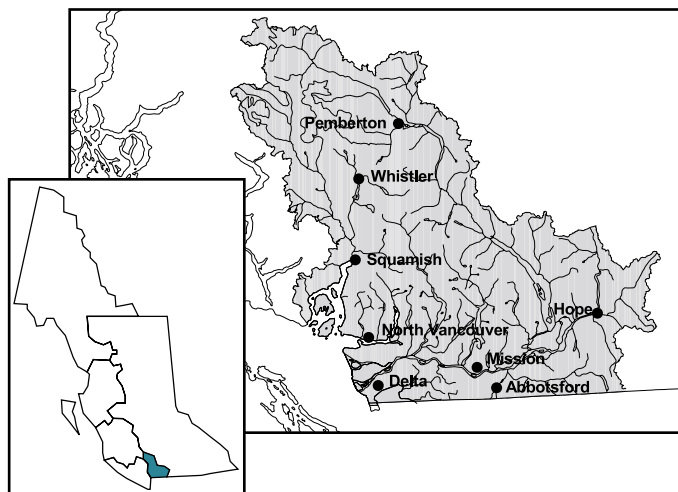

## Education

There are 20 schools in my area (D’Arcy to West Vancouver). All use Salmonids in the Classroom, classroom aquariums and other activities. I also have three high schools participating in salmonid assessments, egg-takes, and juvenile salmonid fry outplanting programs. This spring, schools in Squamish, Pemberton, and Mt. Currie will be engaging in Storm Drain Marking. Schools in Squamish, Mt. Currie, and N’Quatqua often develop their own, very innovative and creative education programs. The Whistler Stewardship Group has adapted the traditional Salmonids in the Classroom to better reflect their alpine ecosystem environment. The elementary schools in Squamish are increasingly engaging in Oceans Stewardship field study programs, employing a variety of marine biologists to conduct field trip studies through their Community Advisor.

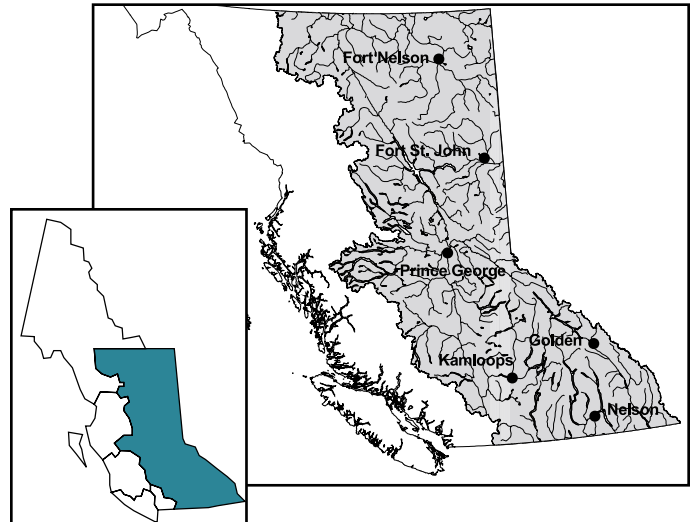

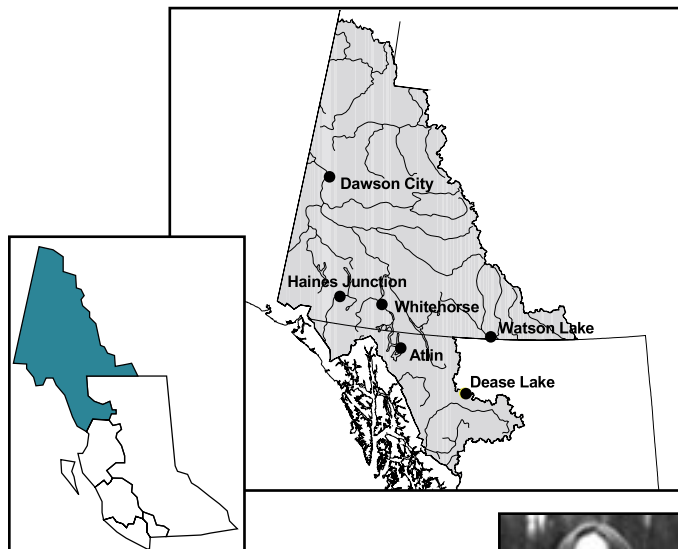

## Education

DFO offers the Stream to Sea Program, with related support material, including incubation equipment and salmon eggs, to all 29 Yukon schools. Curriculum material is also available through the Yukon Department of Education Learning Resource Centre. Seventeen Yukon classroom salmon incubators operated over the 2004-2005

year, involving students from six communities. Classes ran the incubators from October until May or June, growing fry from eyed chinook eggs (from three stocks) from the McIntyre Creek salmon incubation facility, or chum eggs from the Kluane River. The Northern Research Institute of Yukon College operates the McIntyre facility with funding from the Yukon River Restoration and Enhancement fund. Students returned the resultant salmon fry to their natal river systems (Takhini, Tatchun, Morley and Kluane River) in spring 2005.

In Atlin, B.C. a classroom incubator was used in the school for the first time ever. Their Tatsamenie Lake sockeye fry were released back to the lake in spring 2005.

The Aboriginal Fisheries Strategy program partially supports three classroom incubation projects in the Tahltan and Iskut First Nations area. They incubate sockeye from Tahltan Lake.
