Habitat Conservation and Stewardship Program Resource Contributions from Third Parties

In June 1998, the Minister of Fisheries and Oceans Canada (DFO) announced the new Canadian Fisheries Adjustment and Restructuring (CFAR) plan. The CFAR plan was aimed at restoring the health of Canada's Pacific salmon fisheries through 12 broad policies as well as fisheries adjustments and restructuring measures of \$400 million for the West Coast. These policy principles fell into three main categories: conservation, sustainable use and improved decision-making. The new policies of this initiative were to be carried out through two main components: Coho Response and Pacific Fisheries Adjustment and Restructuring (PFAR) program.

The PFAR program consists of initiatives falling into the broad categories of Restructuring the Fishery, Community Economic Development, and Resource Rebuilding. The main goals established for Resource Rebuilding were to help restore degraded habitat, improve habitat protection, build on the success of the Salmon Enhancement Program (SEP) and better involve stakeholders and the public in habitat-related activities. One component of the Strategy was the Habitat Conservation and Stewardship Program (HCSP). HCSP is delivered in DFO Pacific Region.

HCSP was designed to fund a network of Stewardship Coordinator (SC),¹ Habitat Auxiliary (HA), Habitat Steward (HS),² and Habitat Fishery Officer (HFO) positions to increase community's capacity to participate in watershed management planning and proactive habitat protection activities. The original intent of HCSP was to represent a new style of resource management for DFO. This new style of management focused on providing people to work with local communities to protect fish habitat rather than on funding capital projects. A Community Partner (CP) signs a contribution agreement with DFO to hire SC or HS positions and is solely responsible for the administration of that position. Community Partners employ SC's or HS's either as staff or by contract. Roundtables, First Nations, local government, NGO's or other organizations have served as Community Partners. In consultation with the Area Coordinator, the Community Partner develops work plans, hires or contracts SC's or HS's, monitors and evaluates progress, and arranges support services for SC and/or HS positions.

Staffing of positions for HCSP took place in phases starting with pilot positions in January 1999 and ending with Phase 3 in the spring of 2000. As of September 2002, there are a total of 107 steward positions. Of the 107 people, 84 people or 79 percent of positions are external to DFO (HS and SC positions), whereas 23 steward positions or 21 percent of positions are DFO staff (HA and HFO positions). These positions vary from a full PY to one-quarter PY.

¹ SC position serves as a community liaison, generally assigned to specific geographic areas associated with watersheds or communities. They work extensively on habitat protection with existing fish habitat advocacy groups, community watershed initiatives, First Nations, local governments, agencies and other stakeholders. Where fish advocacy groups are not established, the SC helps in their genesis and development. They also provide support to existing watershed councils, forums, roundtables and watershed management processes. As well, SC's should help to create new structures and processes that foster community stewardship in areas where these do not yet exist.

² HS is a technical position hired or otherwise retained by non-DFO agencies, organizations or entities. They may be assigned by watershed, geographic area, local government, or industry sector. HS's work proactively with other agencies and stakeholder groups and individuals to encourage more effective habitat protection, and may also support restoration and enhancement activities as a secondary priority. The HS position focus is to anticipate and prevent disruption to fish habitat. Some local government HS's may respond to habitat impact events. HS' may provide technical information or other services for improved planning and decision-making.

It is important to understand the financial value of these positions to the Department. As such, a Financial Evaluation Template (see Appendix 1) for March 2001 to March 2002, was developed and distributed to all external stewards. The Template was an attempt to provide a summary of the value of volunteer time donated due to the existence of the steward position as well as the amount of dollars leveraged. Figures from the template help to demonstrate the hard dollar value of stewardship and nonmoney resources contributed to fish habitat protection by the local community.

There were a total of 56 or 67 percent of HCSP Financial Evaluation Templates completed, including 16 Habitat Stewards and 40 Stewardship Coordinators (refer to Table 1 for a break-down of completed templates by Area and position type). Stewards had one month to complete the template.

The stewards that completed surveys, reported the following:

- ➤ Stewards worked with 4,447 different volunteers across B.C. and Yukon for a total of 128,176 hours. (Refer to Appendix 2 for a break down of projects completed and volunteer effort by Area.)
- > Stewards have coordinated volunteers so that they could contribute \$2,924,976.32³ worth of their time to protecting fish habitat. Stewards themselves volunteered their time for a contribution of at least \$131,032.00.⁴
- > Stewards engaged approximately 787 different groups, of which 64 were created during the time the steward was being funded by HCSP. (Refer to Appendix 3 for a list of groups by Area.) New groups increase community capacity to steward fish and fish habitat.
- > Stewards helped to coordinate over 824 projects that directly contributed to fulfilling the vision and/or objectives of HCSP.
- ➤ Stewards were able to leverage \$11,640,385.47; this includes \$9,204,996.47 in direct dollars and \$2,435,389.00 in-kind (Refer to <u>Appendix 4</u> for a break down of leveraged dollars by Area). Government sources provided \$7,427,074.02 of leveraged

³ Volunteer time was estimated at \$22.82/hour. dollars (\$6,474,777.02 dollars and \$952,297.00 in-kind), whereas \$4,213,311.45 was leveraged from non-government sources (\$2,730,219.45 dollars and \$1,483,092.00 in-kind⁵). Of the government sources for leveraged dollars, 65 percent came from Fisheries Renewal B.C.; this Provincial government-funding program has been cancelled. (Refer to Table Two for a break down of whom dollars were leveraged from.)

Fisheries and Oceans Canada, through funding these stewards expended about \$3,005,566.00. For this investment, stewards were able to lever \$14,696,393.797 from third parties. For approximately every \$1 HCSP invested in communities, about \$5 was contributed back to protecting fish habitat. If government sources of funding are eliminated from the equation, for every \$1 HCSP invested in communities, about \$2 was contributed back.

Many stewards work in rural and economically depressed communities; they provide employment training to community members. Furthermore, the value of employment in these communities is much higher. This type of in-direct financial benefit has not been calculated.
