Government is working with stakeholders to reduce red tape in the building industry. Stakeholders want a standard approach to codes, applications, and inspections in the province.

By developing a standard approach to codes, applications and inspections, the safety and quality of building construction in the province will be enhanced. This approach will better protect the public, provide improved service and create a more transparent and consistent regulatory environment for the design and construction industry.

In addition, a Building Safety Advisory Committee was established. It will work with all stakeholders to create a provincial oversight function to regulate building codes and standards, including the design, construction and inspection of buildings. The committee will also work on the development and presentation of a *New Brunswick Building Code Act*.
