The Province of New Brunswick has invested more than \$8 million in various projects throughout the region under the Restigouche-Chaleur Initiative.

"We are extremely pleased with the results of the initiative for the Restigouche-Chaleur region during the two years of operation," said Premier Bernard Lord.

The \$8 million investment under the Restigouche-Chaleur Initiative has resulted in total investments of \$39,000,000 in private and public sector funds and the creation of more than 300 anticipated full-time jobs. The investments are aimed to promote economic diversification of the region while capitalizing on the use of local resources to encourage long-term job creation.

In late 2002, Premier Lord announced the creation of the Restigouche-Chaleur Initiative and a \$25-million economic development fund over a five-year period. The fund is managed by the province's Regional Development Corporation and projects are being funded under the following themes: training and education, research and development, economic diversification and strategic infrastructure.

The Government of New Brunswick isn't alone in implementing the Restigouche-Chaleur Initiative. Both Community Economic Development Agencies (CEDA) - Enterprise Restigouche and Enterprise Chaleur – as well as other public-sector agencies are igining forces with the province's Regional Development

Tourism team developing market products

The Regional Tourism Product Development team has been actively involved with operators of the Restigouche-Chaleur region for the past 21 months. The team's primary role is to increase tourism by providing assistance to the tourism industry to develop a market-oriented product that will fulfill the needs of visitors in the region and encourage a longer stay.

The team focuses its efforts on product development in the following sectors:

- · wildlife viewing,
- rivers and inland waterways,
- seafood,
- swimming and beaches,
- dune and discovery beaches,
- culture/heritage,
- festival/events, and
- the Appalachian range.

Over this period, the team:

- has met with more than 100 operators,
- has funded a program for tourism promotion,
- did a regional inventory,
- has built a customized presentation on adventure package development delivered to students of the Tourism Entrepreneurship Course in Campbellton, and
- has ensured the revamping of the Restigouche Chaleur image bank, video footage, and it's travel feature texts.

The product development team is also actively involved in developing the Bay of Chaleur Initiative. This original and innovative tourism concept will promote the area surrounding the Bay of Chaleur including New Brunswick and Quebec, in a marketing tool scheduled for distribution in April of 2005.

This initiative will also create opportunities for new partnerships within the industry that will be beneficial for operators on both sides of the Bay of Chaleur.

During the next 14 months, the team aims to create positive results with new products to market and an increase in the region's visibility. The Restigouche-Chaleur Initiative program will be extended to new and existing operators with an anticipated increased participation of 30 percent.

The spring calendar includes training seminars for the Restigouche-Chaleur tourism industry to assist regional attractions to meet criteria for provincial listing and offer solutions to seasonal issues affecting tourism operators.

The regional team will also organize and coordinate Best Practices Missions to permit tourism operators to observe successful operations and gather important information for their enterprise
