Canadian Merit Scholarship National Award

This scholarship is open to Canadian students who demonstrate academic excellence, strong leadership potential, entrepreneurial skills and a commitment to service in the community. Schools can nominate a predetermined number of students, or a student can apply independently.

Canadian applicants must show promise of exceptional value to the community. This award is **only tenable at the University of North Carolina Chapel Hill**. It includes full tuition and out-of-state-fees for up to four years of undergraduate study, plus a laptop computer. There is also an opportunity for four summer internships (approximate value \$3,800 annually) in the areas of outdoor leadership, service, travel/study and career-track interest. Financial need is not considered in making nominations or selections. The Morehead is awarded solely on merit.
