PCSP will work with you in all such cases to ensure proper steps are taken to cover EA requirements where needed.

Does the project entail the construction, installation, expansion or modification of a physical work with a footprint greater than 25 square metres?		
Does the project entail the construction or installation of a building with a footprint of more than 100 square metres and a height of more than 5 metres?		
Does project entail the expansion or modification of an existing building including its fixed structures that would increase the footprint or height of the building by more than 10 percent?		
Does the project entail the construction, installation, expansion or modification of an environmental scientific data collection instrument and its housing and enclosure?		
Is the project carried out in or on or within 30 metres of a water body?		
Is the project likely to involve the release of a polluting substance into a water body?		
Will a field camp be occupied for 200 or more person days?		
Will the project take place in a Bird Sanctuary or a Migratory Bird Sanctuary?		
Will the project entail the killing, capture or possession of any migratory bird or the collection or possession of carcasses , eggs or nests of any migratory bird?		
Will the project take place within a national park, a national park reserve, a national historic site, or a historical canal?		
Will a temporary road be constructed?		
Does the project involve land-based or marine or freshwater seismic surveying?		
Does the project take place on First Nations traditional land or on a First Nations reserve?		
Does the project require an authorization under the Fisheries Act?		
Are their any known species at risk in the project area?
