Special thanks to the 12 interest groups that attended the meeting with the National Capital Commission's (NCC) Board of Directors on May 3, 2005.

The following are examples of actions that the NCC will undertake as a result of this meeting:

- The Somerset West Community Health Centre will be invited to be part of the LeBreton Flats
  Working Group to represent affordable housing during the next phase of planning of this
  mixed-use community.
- A historical study will be undertaken to better understand the past of the Moore Farm Estate and measures will be undertaken to restore the buildings.
- We will increase the funding for conservation as well as patrols in remote areas of Gatineau Park, particularly in the western area of the Park.
- We have **extended our financial contribution to the Pathway Patrol** to cover a period of five years, instead of the initial two years.
- A number of initiatives will be implemented to renaturalize areas of Leamy Lake Park, such as
  planting trees, removing invasive species and reducing the areas where the lawns are mowed.
- We have confirmed our support for seeking a heritage designation for the Ottawa River.
- We are currently working with Transport 2000 on the proposal to **commemorate the 40th** anniversary of the Ottawa Train Station in 2006.
