

Exploring Forest Plantation Investment Opportunities













Background and Drivers

- Historically afforestation and forest plantations were driven by a mix of objectives
 - Fibre production, regional development, watershed protection, site rehabilitation
- New economic dimension to afforestation and plantations
 - Kyoto Protocol and climate change mitigation, natural forest protection, biodiversity
- Renewed interest by governments / industry to review and examine the full range of benefits from forest plantations



Economic and Policy Analysis

Key Questions

- Are forest plantations a viable investment to achieve multiple benefits (fibre, carbon, etc.) and what are the investment risks?
- Will market benefits for fibre and carbon be enough to drive private investment into plantations?
- How can non-market values be incorporated into plantation investments?
- What are the roles for government, industry, landowners, others?

Forest 2020 PDA - Overview

- Climate Change Plan for Canada
 - Forest 2020 Plantation Demonstration and Assessment (PDA)
 Initiative (2003/04 to 2005/06)
- Policy Objective
 - Explore the potential for fast growing plantations to help achieve climate change objectives and other economic benefits
- Approach and Expected Results
 - Demonstration Establish 6,000 ha of fast growing plantation demonstration sites
 - 2. Economic Analysis Assess economics (i.e., costs and benefits, ROI) of fast growing plantations on private rural lands
 - 3. Investment Models Explore policy options to encourage private investment in plantations for fibre, carbon and other co-benefits

- Various approaches have been utilized by other countries and organizations
 - Direct Financing Agreements (Australia, Chile, U.S.A.)
 - Forestry Extension Partnerships (Ireland, Denmark)
 - Forestry Trust Funds (Norway)
 - Privatization of Forest Resource (Australia, New Zealand, Chile)
 - Policy Support for Institutional Investors (Australia, U.S.A.)
 - Carbon Funds (World Bank)
