Mandate of the Council

- Advise the Minister on matters relating to seniors that the Minister refers to the Council for its consideration or that the Council considers appropriate, and bring before the government and the public matters of interest and concern to seniors.

The Council, in carrying out its duties, may

- undertake research on matters relevant to seniors;
- receive and hear petition and suggestions from individuals and groups from both official language communities concerning matters relevant to seniors;
- establish committees consisting of members of the Council and other persons who are not members to assist and advise the Council;
- make referrals and proposals to, and consult and collaborate with, government agencies, voluntary associations, private businesses, universities and individuals with respect to matters relevant to seniors.
