Tell a grown-up if you find a lighter or matches!




Recognize the sound of the smoke alarm and get out!

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Safety MISSION



Objective:

Spot the dangers in *Chief's* album and place the picture showing what is safe over the danger.

To play:

This game of observation can be played by two players or as a team.

Mark an X on a sheet of paper each time you or your team places a picture showing what is safe over the danger.

- 1 Roll a dice. The player or team that rolls the highest number starts the mission.
- 2 Choose an illustration and spot the danger.
- 3 Place the picture showing what is safe on top of the danger.
- 4 Each player takes turns rolling the dice and repeating steps 2 and 3.
- 5 The game ends when all of the safety pictures have been placed on top of the dangers.

The player or team that places the most pictures correctly wins and each player receives an apprentice firefighter diploma. Mission accomplished! **CONGRATULATIONS!**
