Course Title: Emergency Public Information

Course Sponsor: Emergency Management Alberta

Target Audience:

- Individuals who have been or may be assigned an emergency public information role in their community
- Directors of Disaster Services
- Municipal elected officials
- Senior members of emergency response organizations (e.g. fire, police, etc.) who would be interacting with the media in an emergency situation

Participant Restrictions:

Access is through municipalities.

Course Description: The intent of this course is to prepare participants to carry out

their agency spokesperson role and/or their Emergency Public

Information role in a major emergency or disaster.

Course Objectives: At the end of the course, participants will:

• Understand the role of the media in a major emergency or disaster

- Understand the various types of media
- Understand the principles of crisis communications in a major emergency or disaster
- Understand the roles and responsibilities of an Emergency Public Information Manager or designate
- Know how to develop, maintain and activate an Emergency Public Information plan, which is a specialized component of the Municipal Emergency Plan
- Understand Alberta's emergency management legislation and framework
- Know how to implement best practices for disseminating information to the public and the media in a major emergency or disaster

Prerequisite: Prior completion of the Basic Emergency Preparedness (BEP) Course is strongly recommended.

Type of Instruction: A variety of instructional methods will be incorporated (e.g.

content presentations, class discussions) to achieve the desired learning outcomes. As well, at least one discussion exercise is included to provide learners with an opportunity to practice and

apply their knowledge and skills.

for a training grant to cover course costs. Courses are delivered

on a regional basis.
