- Co-ordinate the development and maintenance of an ESS team
- Co-ordinate the development and maintenance of an ESS plan
- Co-ordinate the delivery of ESS in a disaster response
- Describe the roles of all partner agencies
- Discuss emergency management
- Discuss the relationship of ESS to emergency management
