

Incident Command System Basic Level I-200

Target Audience:

Those who will be initial incident commanders or those who will have a supervisory role at small to moderate size incidents.

Course Description:

Duration: 2 Days

The Incident Command System provides responders and supporting agencies with a standardized method of managing any kind of emergency incident. This course provides the knowledge and skills to manage a small to moderate size emergency site.

Course Objectives:

On completion of this course, participants will be able to manage small to medium size emergency incidents using ICS. Specifically:

- Develop and describe command and command staff roles and activities including transfer
- Identify the 8 BCERMS Response Goals in priority
- Organize an incident site
- Develop a short written action plan, including priorities, objectives, strategies and tactics
- Demonstrate the ability to complete Form 201 “Incident Briefing Form”
- Organize resources and elements within an operations section from the bottom up
- Track resources
- Explain the use of unified command
- Describe the process of accountability
- Use proper ICS terminology

Topics include:

- Principles and Features of ICS
- Organizational Overview
- Incident Facilities
- Incident Resources
- Common Responsibilities

Prerequisite:

- Incident Command System Orientation I-100

Lecture, group activities and scenarios and exercises

12 Minimum, 24 Maximum
