- Supervisory titles and levels within the ICS organization
- Terms and functions of major incident facilities
- Use of an Incident Action Plan at an incident
- Span of control
- Common responsibilities associated with incident assignments
- ICS application
- Comprehensive resource managements
- Personnel accountability

- Modular organization with unity and chain of command
